Interdenominational Theological Center voluntarily withdrew its membership from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), effective September 18, 2024.

The institution's status as a SACSCOC accredited institution expired on the effective date above. Prior to the withdrawal of membership, the institution's status with the SACSCOC was Probation for Good Cause following action taken by the SACSCOC Board of Trustees in December 2023. At that time, the Board of Trustees denied reaffirmation, continued ITC in accreditation, and placed the institution on Probation due to failure to demonstrate compliance with Core Requirement 4.1 (Governing board characteristics), 13.1 (Financial resources), Standard 13.3 (Financial responsibility), Standard 13.4 (Control of finances), and Standard 13.6 (Federal and state responsibilities) of the *Principles of Accreditation*.

The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges is the entity responsible for accrediting degree-granting institutions in the United States and international sites approved by the SACSCOC Board of Trustees that award associate, baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degrees. The SACSCOC Board of Trustees is the representative body of the 781- member College Delegate Assembly and is charged with conducting the accreditation process. To gain or maintain accreditation, an institution must comply with SACSCOC policies and with all standards contained in the Principles of Accreditation.
