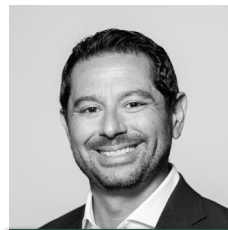

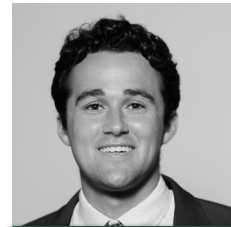

## JETS PLAY FOOTBALL

The New York Jets are committed to growing the game of football, removing barriers of access, and improving safety through a comprehensive outreach program designed to provide opportunities for underserved communities to play football.

### GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL FLAG FOOTBALL

PRESENTED BY NIKE AND SUPPORTED BY GATORADE, VISA & AUDI

The New York Jets, in partnership with Nike, Gatorade, Visa, and Audi continue to support the global growth of High School Girls Flag Football. We have helped launch over 200 girls flag teams in New York, New Jersey, and London. As leaders in girls flag football since 2011, we began the first NFL Club led High School Flag Football League with the Public Schools Athletic League in New York City. In 2021, the Jets introduced a league in New Jersey which rapidly expanded leading to the sport achieving official 2-year pilot status throughout the state. New York State, in two short years, officially recognized girls flag football as a varsity sport in 2024 because of Jets created leagues on Long Island and in the Hudson Valley. Finally with our London based league, the Jets have given the opportunity for girls to experience flag football internationally.

We believe that girls deserve the opportunity to play football and experience everything the greatest game in the world has to offer. Throughout the High School Girls Flag Football season, the Jets host a Media Day, Pre-Season Invitational, produce the award winning #EmpowHER presented by Audi docuseries and award both a Visa Coach of the Week and Gatorade Player of the Week to elevate the sport to same level as high school boys tackle. Opportunities created by the Jets, provide character building, perseverance, teamwork, and dedication skills that will empower these girls throughout every



## JETS NFL FLAG REGIONAL CHAMPIONS

Each year, the New York Jets host an NFL FLAG Regional Tournament with Reigning Champs Experiences for 11 age groups from 8U Coed to 17U Girls. The 11 winning teams earn a spot in the NFL FLAG National Championships. All teams receive tickets to a Jets home game, where they were recognized in-game, \$5k travel grants, invitations to practice at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, Jets swag bags, and a private party in at NFL Championship where they are surprised with alternate playoff Jets flag jersey.

## FLAG FOOTBALL X COMMUNITY AGENCIES

The Jets fund and create flag football opportunities for children ages 5-18 to enjoy America’s favorite sport. Players benefit by being physically active through non-contact, continuous action while learning the fundamentals of football, lessons in teamwork and sportsmanship. The New York Jets annually support the NYC Police Athletic League (PAL), NYC Parks and Rec, NYC Department of education CHAMPS After School Sports Program, and several Boys and Girls Clubs to operate NFL FLAG Football programs. Over 5,000 New York Metro Area youth can play flag football at no cost and participants are given a free Jets NFL FLAG Football jersey.



## JETS UNIFIED FLAG FOOTBALL

The New York Jets, in collaboration with Special Olympics New Jersey, launched the Unified High School Flag Football League. Four participating high schools, Morris Knolls, Morristown, Roxbury, and West Orange competed in a five-week inaugural regular season that culminated in in semifinal and championship games at Atlantic Health Jets Training Center. Unified Sports® joins individuals with and without disabilities (known as Unified partners) on the same team. Dedicated to promoting social inclusion through shared sports training and competition experiences, it was inspired by a simple principle: training together and playing together is a quick path to friendship and understanding. Each team received uniforms, footballs, flag belts, and practice jerseys along with grants to help off-set any costs associated with participating. The Jets and Special Olympics New Jersey hope this league serves as a pilot for the state to offer Unified Flag Football as an official sport for high schools in the future. The Jets will look to expand and add teams to the league in 2025.

## PLAY 60 IN-SCHOOL FLAG FOOTBALL PROGRAM

The Jets PLAY 60 Flag Football Program compasses 6th Grade students from 12 local middle schools where the Jets provide flag belts, jerseys and footballs to operate a flag football unit. All participating schools: Chatham Middle School, Dover Middle School, Frelinghuysen Middle School, Harding Middle School, LC Johnson Middle School, Madison Jr. School, Paterson Public School 13, Renaissance Middle School, Ridgedale Middle School, and St. Vincent The Martyr School encouraged students to participate in at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day while learning the game of football. As a culmination, each school will compete in a tournament at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center. Two students, 1 boy and 1 girl, from each participating school, will receive tickets to a Jets home game on to lead the team out of the



## PUBLIC SCHOOLS ATHLETIC LEAGUE

In 2001, the New York Jets formed a community partnership with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. Through an annual matching grant from the NFL’s Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets now donate \$100,000 to the PSAL’s football programs. The funding offsets the cost of reconditioning every student-athletes’ helmet and has helped to create 15 new and developmental football teams. Beyond these grants, the Jets support the PSAL in a variety of other ways including honoring the PSAL football champions at a home game during the NFL season.

## GAME CHANGER HIGH SCHOOL COACH OF THE WEEK

PRESENTED BY VISA

During the boys tackle and girls flag football seasons, the Jets announce a High School Coach of the Week Game Changer presented by Visa for a coach in the tri-state area. This coach serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to their community, their school and their student-athletes. Each week the winner is awarded with a \$2,000 grant for their high school’s football program. In addition to the weekly award, a Coach of the Year is selected at the end of the high school season and awarded 45,000. All winners are honored on-field during a Jets home game.



## NEW YORK JETS HIGH SCHOOL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

FUELED BY GATORADE

Throughout the boys tackle and girls flag football seasons, the Jets and Gatorade honor a high school player of the week. The player will receive a \$1,000 donation from the Jets and Gatorade in their name to support their high school tackle or girls flag football program. The player is recognized throughout the Jets social media platforms and in-stadium during Jets home games. All winners are honored on-field during a Jets home game.

## NEW YORK JETS 11-ON TOURNAMENT

PRESENTED BY NIKE AND FUELED BY GATORADE

Annually, the Jets and Nike host a high school 11-ON football tournament for 40 schools over the course of three days in the summer and is comprised of both a traditional 7v7 tournament, as well as a linemen challenge. The tournament is free of charge to all schools and participants received a complimentary pair of Jets branded shorts and Gatorade product, courtesy of the Jets, Nike, and Gatorade. The 7v7 and linemen challenge champions are invited to a Jets home game and honored on-field.



## JETS HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL MEDIA DAY

PRESENTED BY NIKE

Each August, the New York Jets, Nike, and Super Football Conference (SFC) kickoff the High School Football season with our annual Media Day MetLife Stadium. The event has more than 450 players and coaches from over 100 teams in the conference. Each head coach and three players from participating schools field questions from the media throughout the program. Additionally, coaches and players are made available for one-on-one interviews. Finally, all players attend a media training and sportsmanship session with Jets Legends and Media personalities. The SFC is composed of 114 high schools and is the largest football conference in the country.



## INSPIRE CHANGE

As part of the New York Jets social justice, inclusion and diversity efforts, the Jets annually support five partner organizations with the goal of reducing barriers and creating opportunities for individuals in need. These organizations - All Stars Project, Innocence Project, New York Urban League, STOMP Out Bullying, and Year Up - each receive critical funding and resources from the Jets to further their missions.

In August of 2020, the Jets Social Justice, Diversity and Inclusion Team (SJDIT) was formed to represent and help steer the entire organization as it relates to the process and execution of the club's social justice efforts as well as internal diversity and inclusion practices. The group is comprised of employees from across business and football staff that meet regularly to evaluate and provide feedback on issues surrounding the organization as well as the team's social justice outreach. The SJDIT, along with club ownership, senior executives

and player leadership, identified focus areas in which to make an impact: economic advancement, racial equality, diversity and inclusion, criminal justice reform, police-community relations, and access to education and healthcare.

Additionally, New York Jets players, coaches and staff have volunteered their time to work with each partner organization in different capacities. Volunteer opportunities include mentorship with students from Year Up and Urban League, a listen and learn with Innocence Project and Operation Conversation with All Stars Project. These opportunities have allowed staff members to be involved and enact change within the community.

## CHARITABLE PARTNERSHIPS

The New York Jets are committed to giving back to our community. That is why we partner with numerous charitable organizations throughout the tri-state area. We are proud to help further the mission of these critical programs which truly make a difference in the lives of many people.

### LUPUS RESEARCH ALLIANCE

The New York Jets organization is deeply committed to supporting the Lupus Research Alliance, a voluntary health organization co-founded by Robert Wood Johnson IV - a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, and chairman of the New York Jets. The Lupus Research Alliance mission is to improve treatments while advancing research toward a cure for systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE, or lupus), a debilitating autoimmune disease. As the world's leading private funder of lupus research, the Lupus Research Alliance has supported the most promising lupus biomedical research leading to key discoveries that are improving diagnosis and treatment, while helping scientists find mechanisms that will ultimately, prevent and cure the disease. The organization has committed \$259+ million to more than 560+ lupus research projects at the most prestigious universities, medical schools, and hospitals throughout the world. The Lupus Research Alliance believes that scientific research is the most powerful way we can improve the lives of people living with lupus today and over the long term. By pushing the limits of scientific exploration and shepherding new discoveries into potential treatments, we seize every opportunity that will help ease the burden of people living with this difficult

disease. To accomplish this goal, the Board of Directors covers all administrative and fundraising costs of the organization, ensuring that 100% of all donations go directly to funding research programs that can realize our vision of a world free of lupus.

Since 2001, the New York Jets continue to increase awareness of lupus and help raise much needed funding for research through the Walk with Us to Cure Lupus program, proceeds from the annual New York Jets Kickoff Luncheon, and other events in the tri-state area. ## GORYEB CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Located on the campus of Morristown Medical Center and part of Atlantic Health System Children’s Health, Goryeb Children’s Hospital is a nonprofit, state-designated “Children’s Hospital” – an earned recognition from New Jersey and the national Children’s Hospital Association. With more than 250 community pediatricians on staff and more than 100 board-certified pediatric specialists, they’re northern New Jersey’s leading specialized pediatric hospital and number one in the state for the treatment of pediatric cancer. To meet high demand, Goryeb Children’s Hospital is currently expanding its pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) and adding inpatient beds. These spacious private patient suites will feature the latest equipment and rooming-in accommodations for parents, as well as a dedicated pharmacy for improved safety and quality of care. Throughout the year, Jets players visit patients at Goryeb Children’s Hospital on the off-days.

## SALUTE TO SERVICE

Salute to Service is the Jets and League’s year-round effort to Honor, Empower, and Connect with our nation’s service members, veterans and their families. Salute to Service is highlighted in NFL games during Weeks 10 - 12, where the Jets traditionally give complimentary tickets to service members, host an enlistment ceremony, display a military themed National Anthem and donate proceeds from the 50/50 raffle to the Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation smart home program for disabled veterans. Additionally, the Jets recognize and celebrate First Responders at a selected regular season home game. Workers from local hospitals, fire departments and police stations are honored throughout the game and integrated into the game presentation.

The New York Jets and Verizon have pledged their ongoing support to Soldiers To Sidelines to develop service members and veterans to become excellent coaches and connect them to teams in their communities. During the week leading up to the Jets Salute to Service Game, the team will host a New York Jets Virtual Football Coaching Certification Seminar for over 100 participants. Then prior to the game, the Jets will host over 30 of these participants in-person for a full day of strategic coaching seminars and classes. Over the course of the program, they will learn the process of becoming a football coach. All participants will earn coaching certificates following the seminar. The Soldier Coaches will be armed with coaching knowledge and techniques along with connections to the athletic community. Soldiers to Sidelines is a non-profit organization who believes that our service members can have a meaningful and lasting impact on others through athletics.



**UNITED WAY**

Since 1973, United Way, the NFL and the New York Jets have had the most visible and longest-running charitable collaboration of its kind. Every year, thanks to community service projects and public service announcements, millions of Americans learn about United Way’s vital work and the volunteer spirit of the NFL.

Combining their rich histories of active community involvement, United Way of New York City, United Way of Northern New Jersey, United Way of Essex, and West Hudson and the New York Jets have teamed up to drive home the importance of community involvement. Their community outreach efforts include the Hometown Huddle, an annual hands-on volunteer project with players, the Gridiron Gala, New York City’s premier charity event, Character Playbook, an innovative digital learning experience that uses evidence-based strategies to educate students on how to cultivate and maintain healthy relationships during their critical middle school years and Tix for Kids, a charitable ticket turn-back program for season ticket holders.

The New York Jets implement Tix For Kids with the United Way of New York City. The charitable ticket distribution program was created in 2003 to give season ticket holders an opportunity to donate their tickets to underprivileged children. This program allows numerous children to experience the excitement of the NFL first-hand as many of them have never attended a professional football game.

United Way of New York City makes these donated tickets available to children and youth participating in their programs via community-based organizations throughout New York City, including Children’s Aid Society, East Side House, Good Shepherd Services, Partnership with Children, Sports & Arts in Schools Foundation and many others.

**HOMETOWN HUDDLE**

The Jets and United Way’s Hometown Huddle is an annual service project that provides the Jets Women’s Organization and Jets rookie class the opportunity to participate in a community service project together. Each year, the Jets Hometown Huddle consists of building a Jets PLAY 60 fitness zone in New Jersey. Last year’s recipient was Head Start of Morris County. Since 2008, the New York Jets have donated over \$1,195,000 to complete sixteen PLAY 60 Fitness Zones.



## UNITED WAY GRIDIRON GALA HOMETOWN HERO

Each May, the United Way recognizes and honors a Hometown Hero at the Gala from the New York Jets who has made outstanding contributions to community service. Established in 1994, the Gala has raised more than \$2 million annually to help fund United Way of New York City’s impactful initiatives in strengthening the quality of early childhood education, reducing high school dropout rates, and supporting at-risk youth in achieving academic success throughout our five boroughs of New York City.



## MARTY LYONS COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

Named after 2013 Ring of Honor inductee, Marty Lyons, the Marty Lyons Award is presented each year to a New York Jets player that gives from the heart through charity and community involvement (as voted by Jets staff). Lyons played the entirety of his 12-year NFL career with the New York Jets as a member of the feared “Sack Exchange.” In 1984, Lyons was named the National Football League’s Man of the Year and in 1990 the New York Jets renamed their Outstanding Community Service Award because of Lyons’ commitment to the community.



## JETS WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

Since 1970, the NFL has awarded the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award to recognize a player’s off-the-field community service, as well as his playing excellence. The Jets award winner will receive \$50,000 to donate to the 501(c)(3) organization of his choice. The team’s recipient is eligible to win the national Walter Payton Man of the Year Award and be recognized at a press conference during Super Bowl Week. The national winner will receive \$500,000 to donate to the 501(c)(3) organization of his choice. The Jets have had two national winners, Marty Lyons in 1984 and Boomer Esiason in 1995.

Located at **ONE JETS DRIVE** in Florham Park, NJ, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center has been the headquarters of the Jets since its official ribbon cutting on September 2, 2008. Designed by Skidmore Owings + Merrill, the 224,000 square-foot complex sits on nearly 100 acres of open space and provides players, coaches, and staff with a best-in-class facility to learn, practice, and work within 30 minutes of both MetLife Stadium and Newark Liberty International Airport.



## UNDER THE SAME ROOF

Prior to the opening of the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the team's operations were split between two locations. Located on the campus of Hofstra University, Weeb Ewbank Hall housed the players, coaches, and football support staff, while the business operations staff were located in New York City.

In the creation of the new facility, Chairman Woody Johnson looked to unite all elements of the franchise under one roof. In the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the organization now has a building that seamlessly combines the operations of both the football and business departments. Equipped with open-concept workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment, the training center was a major contributing factor in the team being named one of Inc. Magazine's Top Small Company Workplaces in 2010. An outdoor terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, provides a business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners.

## FOOTBALL FACILITIES

Featuring state-of-the-art training and medical facilities that combine the latest advances in rehabilitation pools, high-performance equipment, and nutrition, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center also has five full-size football fields: three natural grass and two Sportex synthetic turf fields, one outdoors and another indoors in the Field House, each with a permanent scoreboard. Additionally, the goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be repositioned 90 degrees to help minimize some of the wear throughout the season. With a first floor that is all football, the facility houses a 5,500-square-foot locker room, an 11,000-square-foot weight room, and a 10,000-square-foot cafeteria.

As a "graduate school for football" - an element that was important in the design of the building - the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center has more than 25,000 square feet of space dedicated to classrooms and instruction space, including 10 classrooms. The classrooms also provide direct access to both the indoor and outdoor practice field, allowing for seamless transition between classroom and practice.





## Atlantic Health System

With a relationship that began in 2006, the New York Jets and Atlantic Health Systems agreed on a 12-year naming deal for the new facility in 2007. The agreement was renewed by both parties in 2018, lasting until 2029.

## TRAINING CAMP

For the eighth consecutive year, the New York Jets will host training camp at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, in addition to all team mini-camps and organized team activities.

From 2017-24, with the exception of closed practices in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the facility has welcomed over 35,000 Jets fans to camp. Fans are able to take advantage of bleachers for enhanced viewing, a shuttle service to and from the parking lot, water and sunscreen stations close to the field, cooling zones, and a fan zone fully equipped with family-friendly activities. Additionally, Jets Fest, a training camp tradition since 1997, features kids activities and experiences, the Jets Shop merchandise tent, interactive games, photo opportunities, music, and a concession with food and beverage for purchase. Admission and parking are free.



**METLIFE STADIUM** is the home of the New York Jets and one of the largest stadiums in the NFL (82,500). The stadium hosts the world's biggest events on the world's biggest stage and will host the FIFA World Cup 26™ Final and seven other matches throughout the tournament. The venue annually ranks as one of the busiest stadiums in the world and has received multiple honors including "Highest Grossing Stadium of the Year" nine times by Billboard, and "2017 Venue of the Year" by StadiumBusiness. Event highlights include Super Bowl XLVIII, NHL Stadium Series, WrestleMania, Copa America Centenario Final, 2021 Army-Navy Game, and many concerts, college football games, and international soccer matches.

MetLife Stadium bleeds green on Jets game days and offers fans a wide array of options for entertainment and tailgating before the game. Fans can catch the ESPN New York - 98.7FM pregame radio show broadcast live from the west plaza, head to the Kids Zone for family-fun activities and enjoy a vast array of food and beverages on the Stadium's multiple concourses. Fans can also find the latest gear at the team's 10,000 square-foot Flagship Store. The intimate seating bowl, uncompromised sight lines, video boards, LED signage, and sound system all enhance the game-watching experience.

In 2021, MetLife Stadium became the first and is still the only NFL stadium to join the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change's Sports for Climate Action Framework, which aims to achieve global greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reductions goals.

MetLife Stadium was the first NFL stadium to receive SAFETY Act certification by the US Department of Homeland Security in 2013 and has ranked No. 1 for Safety by Security magazine's "Security 500" in the Spectator Sports Facility division for 10 straight years.

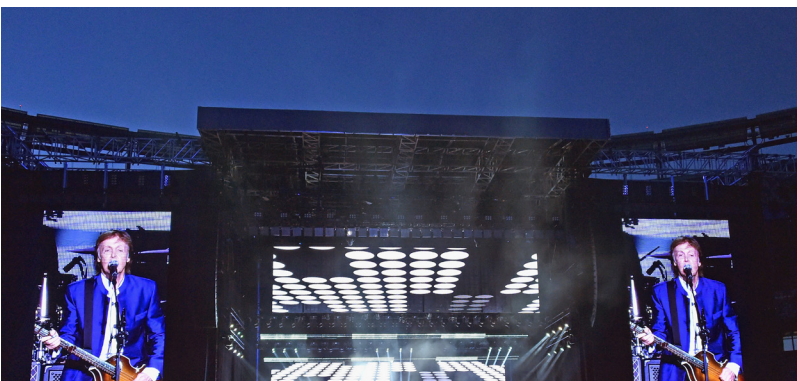

# ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN

**ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON**, a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family's proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, compassionate philanthropist, civic leader, and diplomat.

Upon purchasing the team in 2000, Johnson established his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets entered their new home field, MetLife Stadium, an award-winning venue that has been ranked as the #1 highest grossing venue in the world and recognized by Billboard as stadium of the decade. He also moved the Jets into the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, a world-class 224,000 square-foot complex that united the entire organization, and provided the perfect facility for everyone—players, coaches, and staff—to continually improve and excel.

In 2017, Johnson was appointed the U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom. As ambassador, he strengthened the 'Special Relationship' between the US and the UK, by promoting security and economic prosperity over a range of issues from trade to cyber security policies. While in London, the Ambassador resided in the historic Winfield House, receiving world leaders including Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and on multiple occasions, President Donald Trump. Ambassador Johnson led the relocation of over 1,000 employees from the Embassy's historic location at Grosvenor Square to a new state of the art headquarters at Nine Elms. When the pandemic struck London, he then directed those employees in the remote, effective, and efficient operation of the Embassy to continue to serve and promote the United States' interests in the United Kingdom. Throughout his tenure at the Embassy, Ambassador Johnson engaged with government leaders and the British people, traveling extensively throughout the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland to hear local concerns and emphasize the 'Special Relationship.'

Beyond the field, Ambassador Johnson's philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in the community. In this spirit, the team, through the New York Jets Foundation, positively influences the lives of young people in the area by

expanding youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the Foundation's programs is the launch of the first Girls High School Flag Football League in New Jersey and first NFL Girls Flag Football League in the United Kingdom.

In 2022, the Jets announced a \$1 million donation to help aid the people of Ukraine, with the money distributed among various organizations, each receiving \$100,000, over the course of a year. For Johnson, the events in Ukraine are personal; his wife, Suzanne, grew up in a Ukrainian neighborhood in New York. Her mother, Marie, was born to Ukrainian immigrant parents while Suzanne's father, Stefan Ircha, was originally from Ternopil, a town outside of Kyiv, and immigrated to the United States after WWII. In 2022, the Johnson family traveled to Poland to meet with Ukrainian refugees and understand firsthand how the unprovoked invasion has impacted their lives.

Chief among Ambassador Johnson's healthcare initiatives is the support for lupus research. In 1999, he founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (now the Lupus Research Alliance). This was the first organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. Thanks to his leadership, the organization has dedicated more than \$245 million for research grants and achieved the major milestone of funding research which set the stage for the recent FDA approval of three new treatments for this autoimmune disease.

Over many years, Ambassador Johnson has been active in philanthropy and civic affairs, including past roles as an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society and a past board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center and the Peregrine Fund. The Ambassador also served as a Trustee and a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation's largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and healthcare for Americans.

Currently, the Ambassador is an active member of the NFL's Finance Committee, Investment Committee, and Stadium Committee.

# CHRISTOPHER JOHNSON

Under Elhai, who has garnered League and industry respect by his peers during his tenure, the Jets have solidified their business staff's senior leadership, as he oversees all team business operations. Elhai's leadership has helped the Jets reach unprecedented growth through all aspects of the business, including sponsorship, sales and content leading to several organizational accolades and industry recognition, including a 2023 NJBIZ Best Places to Work honor.

Elhai has remained committed to redefining the culture of the organization through his steady hand of leadership, strategic planning and various organizational initiatives, including the formation of the Social Justice, Diversity, and Inclusion Team (SJDIT) and the expansion of the Jets Women's Organization (JWO).

Most recently, Elhai oversaw the launch of the organization's rebrand ahead of the 2024 season, featuring three versions of the new "Legacy Collection" uniforms, in addition to updated primary and secondary logos. Playing a key role in the hiring of the football leadership, Elhai worked with Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson to hire General Manager Joe Douglas in 2019, and with both Johnson and Douglas to hire Head Coach Robert Saleh in 2021.

Entrusted by Chairman Woody Johnson, the collaboration among Elhai, Douglas and Saleh, forms the foundation that has moved the Jets toward their goal of being a sustained, winning, and innovative franchise on and off the field. Throughout his time as president, Elhai has worked closely with the football staff, providing counsel

**ERIC GELFAND**, now in his ninth season with the New York Jets, is the team's senior vice president, communications and content. He has over 30 years of experience as a brand strategist for some of the most notable sports, media and entertainment properties. Gelfand is responsible for the strategic development and execution of all team communication strategies, oversees the marketing brand and advertising strategies, its digital, social and broadcast platforms and relationships, as well as the organization's multi-faceted community relations programs.

Gelfand serves as the club's primary contact and spokesperson for the team's communications efforts for both football and business operations. He is responsible for the local, national, and international media strategy for the organization, working closely with Team Ownership, President Hymie Elhai, General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Robert Saleh, as well as the club's key executives and players to unify messaging and problem solving.

He has overseen the growth of the Marketing department over the last two seasons as it has sharpened its brand, advertising and creative acumen to synergistically support the expanding needs of the organization. This past season, the department led a complete overhaul of the team's brand, introducing a modernized fan-favorite logo and a family of supporting marks while working collaboratively with stakeholders across the organization to design and launch its new uniforms through a multi-faceted campaign.

In 2023, he oversaw the launch of 1JD Entertainment – a trailblazing content, production and brand division designed to use authentic storytelling, world-class production, and innovative promotion to connect the team, fans and partners. The department has been recognized by multiple organizations for their excellent in production, including 18 Emmys and eight Cynopsis Media awards since 2017.

He has also spearheaded the content department's expansion and focus of episodic franchises across its social and digital platforms through the creation of new, signature series, such as "One Jets Drive" and its off-season spinoff, "Flight," which combined for over 11 million views in 2023. In 2023, the organization's continued social-first mindset, led to 1.3 billion impressions (+23%), 420 million video views (+95%) and revenue across all platforms. In addition, the team saw digital increases of traffic and unique visitors (+50%), live programming (40 million views, +181%) and gameday traffic (+76%). As well, the Jets' Influencer Program earned increases in impressions (+705%), engagements (+445%) and video views (+1185%), including a potential reach of 290 million.

Over the last three years, Gelfand helped guide the Jets and Nike Girl's Flag Football League which has led to it becoming a varsity sport in New York State and a pilot sport in New Jersey, paving the way to varsity status. This program gained numerous nominations and awards, including Cynopsis Sports' Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Award in '23 and Best Expansion Outside of North America in '24 for its UK Girls Flag initiative. Through the organization's community relations department, Gelfand oversees the Jets Foundation which looks to positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area by supporting youth football and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities, while also directing the team's Social Justice, Diversity and Inclusion team. Prior to joining the Jets, Gelfand was the senior vice president of communications and brand strategy for Legends, the venue-solution company co-owned by the New York Yankees and Dallas Cowboys. While there, he was responsible for the development and execution of Legends' communications, public relations, brand strategy and creative services across all the company's divisions. Prior to joining Legends, he served as the senior vice president, communications for SCP Worldwide, where he was responsible for the strategic media positioning and branding for its holdings, including the St. Louis Blues and Real Salt Lake, while also serving as the primary spokesperson for the company. Gelfand's career includes 12 years at Madison Square Garden in a variety of departments as vice president, public relations, including MSG Networks, Corporate Communications and Sports Properties, where he played a key role in the development and growth of the company's media assets, as well as its college basketball and boxing franchises. Gelfand holds a BA in political science from the University of Delaware.

**JOE DOUGLAS** begins his sixth season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 25th season in the National Football League, Douglas, a three-time Super Bowl winning executive, has put his stamp on the organization.



**You better know what you're looking for and know what you're looking at.**



That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor, former Ravens General Manager Ozzie Newsome, and he has stayed true to his core principle that successful teams are built by people with the right level of commitment, character, and competence, as Douglas looks to develop and sustain to what he characterizes as, “the best culture in sports.”

Since taking the position, Douglas has shown that the search for players never stops. He has added starters and contributors in the NFL Draft and undrafted free agency, signed key free agents, both from the onset and throughout the year, and made steadying in-season moves via waiver claims and trades. Heading into the 2024 season, the entire Jets roster was acquired or extended by Douglas.

For Douglas, roster construction isn't a quick fix. “Ultimately, I think when you look at successful organizations, no matter what the sport, you don't see a lot of teams that build long-term success by buying their way out of it,” he said in 2020. “You see the teams, the organizations that have long-term success, they draft well, and they develop their players.”

Not long after his hiring, Douglas began implementing a variety of programs and initiatives throughout the organization all with the intent of having the “best culture in sports” at One Jets Drive. Five years later, Douglas

and his staff have seen that plan come to fruition. After the success on defense the past two seasons, ranking third (2023) and fourth (2022) overall in the NFL, the early contributions of several young offensive players, and a top ranked special teams unit, the culture that Douglas and Saleh have built has become an attractive destination for players around the League, including four-time NFL MVP, Super Bowl XLV MVP, and 10X Pro Bowler Aaron Rodgers.

Since his hire, Douglas has improved the team's financial flexibility and added a number of draft assets, both by trading players with expiring contracts and draft-day deals. Through those deals, most notably the acquisition of two first-round picks and a third-round pick for safety Jamal Adams, as well as a second-round pick, fourth-round pick, and sixth-round pick for quarterback Sam Darnold, the Jets have picked in the first two rounds of the 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024 drafts 10 times, including seven first-round selections.

Entering any draft, the mission for Douglas is always the same – add difference makers that fit within the culture and scheme. Over his five drafts as the general manager (2020-24), he has done just that, using top 45 picks on both sides of the ball, selecting tackle Olu Fashanu (No. 11, 2024), edge Will McDonald IV (No. 15, 2023), center Joe Tippmann (No. 43, 2023), cornerback Sauce Gardner (No. 4, 2022), wide receiver Garrett Wilson (No. 10, 2022), edge Jermaine Johnson (No. 26, 2022), running back Breece Hall (No. 36, 2022), and offensive lineman Alijah Vera-Tucker (No. 14, 2021), while showing mobility in each draft to target key players via moving up, first with Vera-Tucker and again in 2022 with Hall and Pro Bowler Johnson (2023).

Douglas has added starters and depth throughout the draft, highlighted by the selection of the NFL's 2022 Defensive and Offensive Rookies of the Year in first-team All-Pro cornerback Sauce Gardner and wide receiver Garrett

Wilson. With both Gardner and Wilson’s recognitions, the Jets became just the third team in NFL history to win both awards in the same season. Additionally, Douglas’ selections in Hall and Wilson helped the Jets become just the sixth team since 1970 with a 1,500-scrimmage yard running back and a 1,000-receiving yard wide receiver in the same season (2023), among players in their rookie or second season.

A key component of Douglas’ draft and free agency philosophy is to match character with talent when adding to the roster. Prior to the start of training camp last season (2023), Douglas further exemplified his commitment to players who fit his vision by extending All-Pro and Pro Bowl defensive lineman Quinnen Williams and All-Pro linebacker Quincy Williams who originally joined the Jets as a waiver claim by Douglas (2021).

To help solidify the special teams unit, Douglas re-signed punter Thomas Morstead and kicker Greg Zuerlein this offseason. Morstead, a 15-year veteran, set franchise marks last season for punting average (48.8) and net punting average (41.8), while leading the League in punts inside the five-yard line (seven). Zuerlein, a 13-year veteran, finished last season with a 92.1% field goal percentage, the best mark in franchise history, while his 35 field goals made also set a franchise record.

Since becoming General Manager in 2019, Douglas has overseen a roster that fielded five players who earned First Team All-Pro recognition, an Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year, and eight Pro Bowlers.

Whether through free agency, the draft, or League trades, Douglas has remained committed to exploring every avenue for ways to improve the roster. Most recently via trades, Douglas has brought in Rodgers (2023) and defensive lineman Haason Reddick (2024) who have shown to be one of the best at their positions.

Among the priorities for Douglas has been transforming both the lines – offensive and defensive – into deep and talented units. Offensively, in addition to adding first and second round picks through the draft – Fashanu, Vera-Tucker, and Tippmann – has signed free agents, including All-Pro and Pro Bowler Tyron Smith and veterans John Simpson and Morgan Moses. On the defensive side, draft picks Johnson and McDonald, along with acquiring Reddick, and free agent signings Leki Fotu, Javon Kinlaw and Solomon Thomas have teamed with All-Pro Quinnen Williams to form a strength upfront on the Jets defense.

Throughout his time in the League, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago, and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl winning rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super

Bowl LII, including the game’s MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team’s postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl. A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery – as well as a pair of street free agents – Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith – all contributed scores on the team’s title run. The Eagles’ leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team’s leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason-trade acquisition.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015). Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the club’s scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45-consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999. As an offensive and defensive lineman at Mechanicsville (VA) HS, formerly Lee-Davis, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

# PHIL SAVAGE

## SENIOR FOOTBALL ADVISOR



**PHIL SAVAGE** is in his sixth season with the Jets as the team's senior football advisor. In his role, Savage evaluates college prospects and pro players, while providing valuable insight on the player personnel department's overall philosophy, grading system, and annual approach to building the club's roster and practice squad.

Savage was part of a scouting staff who drafted both the Offensive and Defensive Rookies of the Year in 2022, marking just the third time in NFL history a team has had both in the same year. Joining the team in June 2019, Savage brings over 25 years of NFL front office experience, including four seasons as senior vice president and general manager with the Cleveland Browns (2005-08). Prior to joining the Jets, he worked as the Reese's Senior Bowl executive director (2012-18) and served as the general manager of the Arizona Hotshots in the Alliance of American Football (2018-19).

Savage entered the League as a defensive assistant coach with the Browns (1991), before transitioning to scouting in 1994. He has held several positions with Cleveland (1991-95, 2005-08), Baltimore (1996-04) and Philadelphia (2010-12). During his nine seasons in Baltimore, the Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV and drafted 10 Pro Bowl players, including Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees, Jonathan Ogden, Ray Lewis, and Ed Reed. His tenure with the Browns was highlighted by a 10-win season in 2007 and the selection of perennial Pro Bowl and 2023 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Joe Thomas.

Prior to the NFL, Savage worked at the University of Alabama as a graduate assistant (1987) and tight ends coach (1988-89) before transitioning to a similar role at UCLA (1990). From 2009-17, he was the radio color commentator for the Crimson Tide Sports Network, when the Alabama Football program won five National Championships (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017). At the same time, he was also a front office insider for ESPN (2013-17) and provided analysis for SiriusXM on their NFL and college conference channels (2013-19). In 2017, St. Martin's Press published Savage's first book, 4th and Goal Every Day, Alabama's Relentless Pursuit of Perfection.

During his tenure with the Reese's Senior Bowl, he spearheaded the organization's efforts in securing the current title sponsor through The Hershey Company, while having a number of future All-Pro selections come through Mobile on their way to the NFL, including Josh Allen, Aaron Donald, Lane Johnson, Kyle Juszczyk, Cooper Kupp, Zach Martin, and Fred Warner among others.

Savage received a degree in English from the University of the South in Sewanee, TN. He played quarterback and was also a three-time all-conference shortstop in baseball. He went on to receive a master's degree in physical education from the University of Alabama in 1989.



# DAVID SOCIE

## SENIOR DIRECTOR, FOOTBALL STRATEGY



**DAVID SOCIE** is in his eighth year with the Jets after returning to the organization in 2018 as the senior director, football administration. Socie is entering his first year as senior director, football strategy. His primary responsibilities include advising General Manager Joe Douglas and Jets staff on matters involving player contracts, the team's salary cap, trades, the NFL Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) and NFL Rules. He previously worked for the Jets during the 2006 season as the senior director, football administration.

Before rejoining the Jets, Socie worked at the National Football League office for over seven years as the director and then senior director of labor operations in the NFL Management Council. His responsibilities included advising club executives on matters involving player contracts, the salary cap, the CBA and NFL Rules. He also oversaw the approval process of all player contracts, monitored Clubs' compliance with the salary cap, and participated in the CBA negotiation process.

Prior to the NFL Management Council, Socie was an associate at Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer, and Feld, LLP, in Washington, D.C., from 1997-2006. # ROBERT SALEH

Now, in his fourth season with the New York Jets, Head Coach Robert Saleh has established a program that develops young players, producing four First-Team All Pros and four Pro Bowls by players in their first four seasons in the League – including three players in their first three seasons (Quinnen Williams, Sauce Gardner & Jermaine Johnson) tied for the most in the NFL over the last two seasons, while on offense, Breece Hall and Garrett Wilson have been Pro Bowl alternates. Additionally, since becoming head coach (2021), his group has seen 12,554 snaps by rookies, the fifth-most in the NFL, including 144 starts, the third highest over that span.

In his first season (2021), Saleh's opening day roster was the youngest in the League, and became only the second team since the merger led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards. In his second season (2022), Garrett Wilson and Sauce Gardner earned Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year honors respectively. Last season (2023), while the average age of the opening day roster increased, 64.1% of the team's offensive yardage was gained by rookie and second-year players, second-highest in the NFL, and two of the team's Pro Bowlers were both second-year players: Gardner and Jermaine Johnson.

Over the past two seasons, the Jets defense has ranked fourth and third respectively, allowing just over 300 yards per game. After finishing 32nd in his first season behind a defense that used 40 different players (second most in the League), the defense increased to fourth, becoming one of just five teams since 2000 to finish in the top five a season after ranking last the year before (2021).

Saleh's late-game management was crucial in 2023 as the Jets registered four wins after trailing in the fourth quarter, tied for the second most in the NFL. In the second half and overtime, the Jets allowed 7.65 points per game, tied for the third-lowest total in the League and held opponents to seven points or less in 10 of 17 games,

tied for the most in the NFL.

Additionally, after recording 16 takeaways in 2022, which ranked 29th in the League, Saleh made forcing turnovers a priority for the 2023 season, resulting in 27 takeaways, tied for the eighth best in the League.

Saleh oversaw the sixth-largest win improvement in the League in 2022, as the Jets increased their total three wins. Despite using three different starting quarterbacks, they improved in nearly every offensive category, while the defense finished fourth, one of just five teams since 2000 to rank in the top five a season after finishing last the year before.

While the team improved overall in 2022, Saleh also oversaw the development of the Offensive and Defensive Rookies of the Year in wide receiver Garrett Wilson and cornerback Sauce Gardner. Additionally, Saleh led a roster that included four Pro Bowl selections, two First-Team All-Pros, and one Second-Team All-Pro that season.

As the season progressed, seven of the final eight games were within a score in the fourth quarter, compared to four of the first nine games. Playing those close games against six teams that finished with winning records, including three playoff teams, the team also improved their numbers on defense in points per game, yards per play, pass yards per attempt and yards per rush over the final seven weeks. On offense, they averaged 5.19 yards per carry over the final eight weeks, the second best in the League.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Saleh oversaw the league's youngest roster with an opening day age of 25.13. Rookies played 5,675 snaps for the Jets and started a League-high 76 games. They became only the second team since the merger led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards.

As the season progressed, the young roster did just that. Seven of the final eight games were within a score in the fourth quarter, compared to four of the first nine games.

Playing those close games against six teams that finished with winning records, including three playoff teams, the team also improved their numbers on defense in points per game, yards per play, pass yards per attempt and yards per rush over the final seven weeks. On offense, they averaged 5.19 yards per carry over the final eight weeks, the second best in the league.

Before joining the Jets, Saleh spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator with San Francisco. From 2017-20, The 49ers ranked third in the league in passing yards allowed (211.4), holding opposing quarterbacks to the eighth lowest completion percentage (62.9%), while producing Pro Bowl players at linebacker (Fred Warner), cornerback (Richard Sherman), and defensive line (Nick Bosa & DeForest Buckner), with Bosa also earning 2019 Defensive Player of the Year honors.

The last two seasons under Saleh, the 49ers defense led the League in passing defense (188.6), ranking in the top 10 in passer rating allowed (85.8), completion percentage allowed (62.4%), tackles for loss (154) and defensive touchdowns (six), while also helping San Francisco advance to Super Bowl LIV.

In his final season with the 49ers (2020), Saleh's unit still finished fifth in the League in total defense and fourth in passing defense, despite an injury-plagued season, getting career years from cornerback Jason Verrett, who started 13 games after playing in just six total the previous four seasons and defensive lineman Kerry Hyder, who started 14 games after logging more than 450 snaps in a season just once in his five previous years in the League. Hyder finished the season as one of just 11 defensive linemen with at least 8.0 sacks, 15 quarterback hits and 40 total tackles.

A key part of the team's Super Bowl LIV run (2019), Saleh's defense finished second in total defense, first in passing defense and third in third-down defense, while producing 48 sacks (tied for the fifth most in the League), and 28 takeaways (the sixth most). The San Francisco defensive line saw four players – Arik Armstead (10.0), Bosa (9.0), Buckner (7.5), and Dee Ford (6.5) – all produce at least 6.5 sacks, the only team in the NFL to have four-or-more players with 6.5-or-more sacks that season. In the postseason, the defense allowed just over 300 yards per game, holding opponents to just 31.4% on third down and producing seven total takeaways, including two interceptions of League MVP Patrick Mahomes in the Super Bowl, the only game Mahomes had more than one interception that season.

In Saleh's second season with the 49ers (2018), the defense was one of six to allow fewer net yards per game, rushing yards per game, and passing yards per game than they did the previous season. In 2017, his first as a coordinator, San Francisco allowed .62 yards fewer per play, the third best improvement in the League. Over

the final eight weeks, they ranked second in the League in rushing yards allowed and fourth in yards per carry.

Coaching linebackers for three seasons in Jacksonville, Saleh oversaw a linebacker group that included Paul Posluszny and Telvin Smith as the pair each finished in the top five in the League in total tackles between 2015-16 (according to Radar360). The team's linebackers were also a key part of a Jaguars defense that ranked fifth in passing defense and sixth in opponent rushing average in 2016, and fifth in rushing average allowed in 2015.

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons in Seattle as a defensive quality control coach, responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the linebackers, while learning an important lesson from Head Coach Pete Carroll:

“The biggest influence I took from Coach Carroll is from a philosophy standpoint,” Saleh said in 2017. “Understanding who you are as a person. Understanding what's important to you as a person. And, how to apply it to the message that you're trying to deliver. Understanding that everybody has a style and that every style is the right style provided you apply it in the right way. So, just from a philosophy standpoint, speaking to people, handling people is where I have my greatest growth from Coach Carroll.”

In those three seasons, he helped develop linebackers Bobby Wagner (2012 second-round pick) and K.J. Wright (2011 fourth-round pick) as the two became future Pro Bowl selections. A part of the Seahawks Super Bowl XLVIII winning staff, another of the team's linebackers, seventh-round pick Malcolm Smith, earned MVP honors after Smith registered nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a 69-yard interception returned for a touchdown.

Saleh began his NFL coaching career in Houston as a coaching intern (2005), becoming a defensive assistant (2006-08) and ultimately the linebackers coach (2009-10). Linebackers DeMeco Ryans (2006) and Brain Cushing (2009) each earned Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year honors while Saleh was there and were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2009. That season, the tandem finished in the top 10 in the League in total tackles (according to Radar360).

Before his start as an NFL coach, Saleh spent three seasons coaching college football at Central Michigan (2004), beginning his coaching career at Michigan State (2002) as an offensive assistant/tight ends coach before becoming a defensive assistant/defensive line the following season.

A native of Dearborn, MI, Saleh attended Northern Michigan University where he started for four years at tight end. He earned his finance degree, beginning a career as a credit analyst before getting into coaching.

Saleh and his wife, Sanaa, have seven children, sons,

Adam, Zane, Michael, Sam, and Jacob, and daughters, Mila and Ella. Born to Lebanese parents, Sam and Fatin, he is considered one of three Arab-American head coaches in NFL history and believed to be the first Muslim-American head coach.

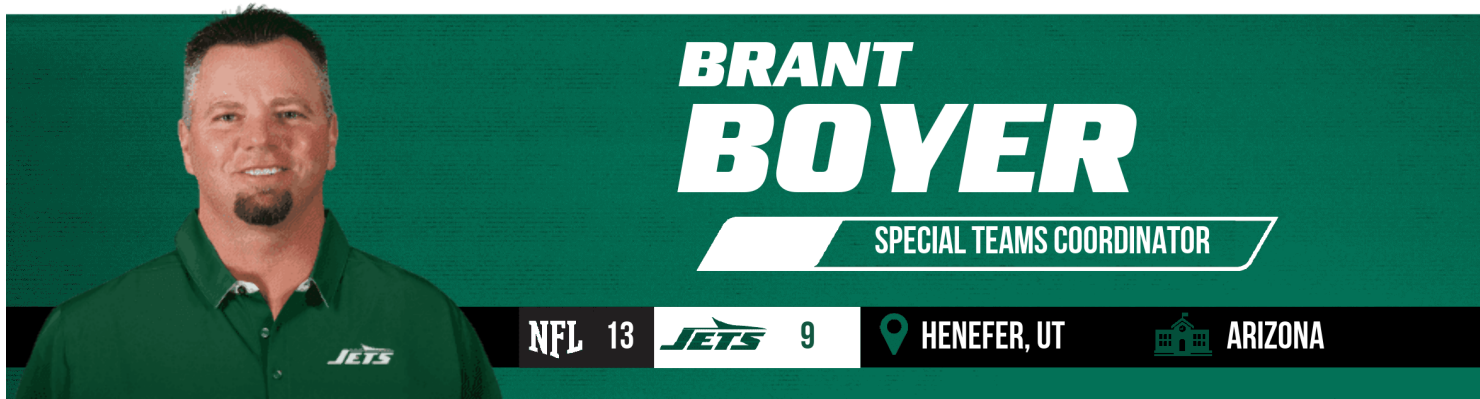

## PLAYING CAREER

Northern Michigan University (Tight End) 1997-2001



**BRANT BOYER** returns for his ninth season as the special teams coordinator of the New York Jets after initially joining the team in 2016. Under three different head coaches in his time with the Jets, Boyer has transformed the special teams unit into one of the best in the League.

Roster change has been a constant for Boyer, but despite the changes, his group has posted top 10 rankings in total touchdowns (5th – eight, scoring via punt return, kickoff return and via fumble recovery), blocked punts (2nd - seven), and opponent kickoff return average (4th - 21.1) since being named special teams coordinator in 2016.

This past season (2023), Boyer's unit finished first in opponent punt return average (44.5), first in opponent kickoff return average (15.4), second in punts inside the 20 (36), tied for third in punts blocked (1), tied for third in special teams touchdowns (1), eighth in field goal percentage (92.3%), and eighth in punt return average (48.8). Additionally, Boyer's group finished third in the NFL in Rick Gosselin's special teams rankings, compiling 278 points on the season, while also finishing fifth in the NFL in DVOA (defense-adjusted value over average) with 3.09%.

Additionally, Boyer helped kicker Greg Zuerlein record five made field goals from 50+ yards in 2023, the sixth season of his career with at least 50+ field goals made, including each of his seasons with the Jets. Boyer also saw punter Thomas Morstead establish franchise marks for punting average (48.8) and net punting average (41.8) in 2023.

During the 2022 season, the Jets were the only team in the NFL to record three blocked kicks and a successful onside kick, becoming one of only 17 teams in the League to accomplish this since 2000. While the unit found success as a whole, Boyer also helped his players reach individual milestones throughout the year.

After recording a single-season best 14 special teams tackles in 2022, team captain Justin Hardee was selected to his first Pro Bowl, becoming just the sixth Jets special teamer to be selected to the Pro Bowl since 1970 and the only core special teamer. Of the six, four have come under Boyer's tenure with all four being their first career selection. Additionally, Boyer has also helped two players earn First-Team All-Pro recognition in both returner Andre Roberts (2018) and returner Braxton Berrios (2022).

Additionally, under Boyer's lead in 2022, Zuerlein recorded three of the four longest field goals in franchise history and became one of four Jets to convert multiple field goals of 55+ yards as a Jet. Zuerlein also became one of just five kickers in the NFL to convert a 60+ yard field goal.

In 2021, Boyer's special teams finished second in the League in DVOA, highlighted by the wide receiver/return specialist Braxton Berrios' first-team All Pro selection. Berrios, who led the NFL in

kickoff return average, also ranked second in punt return average (among players with 15 PRs) and was only the 10<sup>th</sup> player since 1970 with top three finishes in both KOR and PR and the first since another Boyer charge, Andre Roberts in 2018. Boyer is currently the only coach to have multiple players with the accolade. As a result, the Jets were the only team in 2021 to finish in the top five in both kickoff and punt return average.

Hardee registered a single-season best in his first season under Boyer after posting 12 special teams to lead the team. In addition, punter Braden Mann (returning from an injury suffered Week One) and kicker Eddy Piñeiro both finished 2021 strong as Mann posted a 43.0 net punting average, fifth best in the league, over the last four games and Piñeiro, signed in Week 14 connected on all eight FG attempts as a Jet. In Mann's absence, veteran punter Thomas Morstead averaged 43.0 net yards per punt, a top five single-season average in his 12-year NFL career.

In 2020, punter Braden Mann establish a rookie franchise record in punting average (43.9) under Boyer, while setting another team rookie record with a 60-yard punt. Kicker Sam Ficken, the only returning kicker Boyer has had in his five seasons, was connected on all 12 of his attempts under 50 yards one of three kickers with no misses on at least 10 attempts last season.

In 2019, Boyer's group finished fourth in the League in special teams DVOA, their second consecutive season in the top five, despite new primary players at kicker, punt returner and kick returner. Overall, the group ranked in the top five in coverage touchdowns (two), punt return average (11.4), kickoff return average against (19.3) and fumble recoveries (two).

After they averaged a league-low 6.8 yards per punt return from 2013-17, the Jets had first and second place finishes in 2018 and 2019 respectively, as Boyer narrowly missed becoming the first coach since the merger to have two different returners lead the league in punt returns in consecutive seasons.

In 2018, in addition to their number one ranking from both FootballOutsiders.com and Rick Gosselin, Boyer's group finished in the top five league-wide in kickoff return average (third; 26.9), punt return average (first; 13.0) and field goal percentage (fourth; 91.7%). The unit also blocked three kicks — a punt, a field goal and an extra point — one of just three teams with at least three blocked kicks and one of just two with a block of all three.

Among the many superlatives by the Jets special teams unit in 2018 were kicker Jason Myers earning a Pro Bowl selection after tying Nick Folk's field goal percentage franchise record, connecting on 33-of-36 field goals (91.7%) and finishing with the second-most made field goals and tying for the second most points for a single season in franchise history. Additionally, Myers made all five of his attempts of 55+ yards, the most in a single year in NFL history, and

now accounts for five of the 11 makes from 55+ yards in Jets history.

Roberts, a wide receiver/return specialist, was named a first-team All Pro and selected to his first Pro Bowl in nine NFL seasons, led the league in punt return average (14.1) and finished second in kickoff return average (29.4) last season, one of just 12 qualifying players to finish in the top three in both in the same season since 1970.

In 2017, Boyer oversaw second-year punter Lachlan Edwards establish franchise records with 46.6 gross and 40.5 net punt averages, ranked third in the league with 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in Jets history. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro, a 2017 acquisition, improved on his field goal percentage from 75% in 2016 to 83.3%, as well as connecting on 100% of his extra point attempts, the first time he had done so since his rookie season. Catanzaro also connected on a 57-yard field goal, the longest in team history.

Among Boyer’s coverage units, the Jets allowed just 20.0 yards per kickoff return in 2017, the eighth lowest average in the league.

In his first season (2016), kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league that season and the fourth highest mark in team history.

Boyer joined the Jets after a four-year tenure in Indianapolis (2012-15), where he aided a Colts special teams unit that ranked in the top 10 league-wide during that span in net punting average (third), kickoff return average (fourth), kickoff touchbacks (fourth) and field goal percentage (seventh), despite using three different players as primary punt returners and four different kick returners in his four seasons.

During the 2015 season, the Indianapolis special teams unit established an NFL record with just 156 kickoff return yards allowed for the season, besting the previous mark of 254 set by Denver in 1992.

In 2014, both punter Pat McAfee and kicker Adam Vinatieri received Associated Press First-Team NFL All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors under Boyer as McAfee converted a career-high three onside kicks and set single-season franchise records for punts pined inside the 20-yard line (30), net punting average (42.8) and kickoff

touchbacks (70), while Vinatieri made 30 of 31 field goals and also converted 35 consecutive attempts, the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

In 2013, Boyer found and coached Matt Overton to his first career Pro Bowl selection, one year after discovering the long snapper at a specialists combine in Arizona and bringing him to Indianapolis for a workout prior to his signing in April 2012.

Prior to joining the Colts, Boyer was twice a training camp intern, first for the Cleveland Browns (2009) and later for the New York Giants (2010).

Before entering the coaching ranks, Boyer played linebacker and was a standout on special teams for the Miami Dolphins (1994), Jacksonville Jaguars (1995-2000) and Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He served as a special teams captain for both the Jaguars and Browns and led Cleveland in tackles in 2002 and 2003. Boyer was a two-time member of USA Today’s All-Joe Team, once as a linebacker and once as a special teams player. In 2002, his teammates selected him for the Cleveland Browns Unsung Hero Award.

Boyer played in 129 career games and totaled 250 tackles, 13.0 sacks, six interceptions, one forced fumble and 15 passes defended. He originally entered the league as a sixth-round selection of the Miami Dolphins in the 1994 NFL Draft.

Before entering the NFL, Boyer was an inside linebacker and team captain at the University of Arizona as part of the school’s “Desert Swarm” defense. He led the team in tackles during his senior season, helping the Wildcats to their first 10-win season in 90 years and a victory in the 1993 Fiesta Bowl, and earned a place in the school’s Ring of Honor.

**KEITH CARTER** begins his second year with the New York Jets after being hired as the offensive line coach/run game coordinator in January 2023.

Despite using 13 different starters on the offensive line in 2023 due to injury, the most in the League, Carter oversaw an offensive line that helped second-year running back Breece Hall reach 1,585 scrimmage yards, the fourth-best in the NFL. Additionally, Hall became the only running back in 2023 with 75+ receptions and 500+ receiving yards.

Prior to joining the Jets, Carter served as the offensive line coach for the Tennessee Titans for five seasons where he helped the Titans become a top five rushing offense, averaging 139.9 yards per game, the second-best in the League. Additionally, in his five years with Tennessee, their 11,471 rushing yards ranked second, while their 4.67 yards per rush was the fourth-best in the NFL. They ranked in the top 10 in rushing four of five seasons and never averaged fewer than 125 yards per game in any season.

In 2022, Carter's line helped block for running back Derrick Henry, who recorded the second-most rushing yards (1,538) and rushing touchdowns (13) in the NFL. Additionally, the team recorded two rushes of 50+ yards this past season, tied for the second-most in the League. With his lead, the Titans recorded a 90.3 run grade that season, according to Pro Football Focus, the sixth-best in the League.

In 2021, Carter saw an offense that finished fifth in rushing, averaging 141.4 rushing yards per game and helped left guard Rodger Saffold III receive his first career Pro Bowl selection.

During the 2020 season, Carter's line helped blocked for the NFL's second-ranked rushing offense (168.1 yards per game), while their 25 sacks allowed was the sixth-best in the League. The unit helped Henry lead the NFL in rushing (2,027 yards) for the second consecutive year and record the fifth-highest single-season rushing total in NFL history.

The Titans offense finished third in the NFL in rushing (138.9 yards per game) in 2019, with Henry leading the League in rushing yards (1,540). Additionally, his line helped block for quarterback Ryan Tannehill who completed 70.3% of his passes that season, the third-best in the NFL and recorded a League high 117.5 passer rating on the year.

During Carter's first year with the team in 2018, the Titans offense ranked seventh in rushing (126.4 yards per game), with Henry finishing second in the AFC with 1,059 rushing yards and third in the NFL with 12 rushing touchdowns. With Carter's guidance, left tackle Taylor Lewan was named to the Pro Bowl that season.

Prior to his role in Tennessee, Carter spent three seasons with the Atlanta Falcons, serving as their assistant offensive line coach from 2015-16 before being promoted to the team's running backs coach for the 2017 season. Carter was a part of a coaching staff in 2016 who helped the Falcons reach Super Bowl LI. Their offensive line helped quarterback Matt Ryan receive NFL MVP recognition and paved the way for the fifth-best rushing team in the League that season (120.5 yards per game).

Carter spent time at San Jose State in 2014, where the team ran for 1,696 yards and 11 touchdowns, while averaging 141.3 rushing yards per game.


From 2012-13, Carter served on the Seattle Seahawks staff as the offensive quality control coach and was a part of the team's Super Bowl XLVIII Championship in 2013.

Prior to his time in the NFL, Carter coached at the collegiate level at the University of San Diego, University of Redlands, Wagner College, and his alma-mater, UCLA.

Carter played tight end and fullback at UCLA from 2001-04 and is the grandson of Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive end Gino Marchetti, who played for the Baltimore Colts for 13 seasons.




A native of Downingtown, Pennsylvania, Carter and his wife, Kristin have two daughters, Kayla and Kamryn.

**TONY DEWS** joins the Jets as the team’s running backs coach after six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, serving as the running backs coach (2018-22) and tight ends coach (2023).

Prior to the 2023 season, Dews became the tight ends coach for the Titans, helping Chigoziem Okonkwo reach a career high in receptions (54) and receiving yards (528).

From 2018 through 2022, Dews saw running back Derrick Henry lead the League in rushing attempts, yards and touchdowns. Over that span, Henry had 1,464 carries for 7,101 yards with 68 touchdowns with a League-high 32 100-yard rushing games.

In 2022, Henry received a Pro Bowl selection after finishing the season with 1,538 yards and 13 touchdowns and second in rushing yards (1,653). With a career-high 398 receiving yards, Henry’s 1,936 scrimmage yards ranked fifth in franchise history and was the second-best number of his career (2,141 in 2020).

In 2021, the Titans finished fifth in rushing offense, averaging 141.4 rushing yards per game. Henry ranked ninth in the NFL with 937 rushing yards despite missing nine games. With Henry out, D’Onta Foreman (566 rushing yards) and Dontrell Hilliard (350) each set career highs in rushing yards. From Week 12 to Week 18, Foreman ranked sixth in the NFL with 482 rushing yards.

In 2020, the Titans finished second in the NFL in rushing offense (168.1 yards per game), while Henry became the first player since LaDainian Tomlinson (2006-07) to lead the NFL in rushing yards in consecutive years. Henry produced the eighth 2,000-yard rushing season in League history, earning the Associated Press NFL Offensive Player of the Year. His 17 rushing touchdowns set a career high and finished as the second-best total in franchise history behind Earl Campbell’s 19 rushing touchdowns in 1979.

In 2019, the Titans finished third in the NFL in rushing (138.9 yards per game). Henry was named to the Pro Bowl and added second-team Associated Press All-Pro honors after leading the NFL with 1,540 rushing yards, which also was the fourth-highest total in franchise history. Over the final six games of the regular season plus three playoff appearances, Henry register seven 100-yard

games. During a three-game stretch, Henry became the first player in NFL history to rush for at least 180 yards in three consecutive regular season and/or postseason games.

During his first season with the Titans (2018), Henry ranked second in the AFC with 1,059 rushing yards and third in the NFL with 12 rushing touchdowns. Additionally that season, Henry became the second player in NFL history (Tony Dorsett) with a 99-yard touchdown run. Additionally, Dion Lewis set a career high with 59 receptions and 400 receiving yards with a total of 917 scrimmage yards, the second-highest total of his career.

Before the Titans, Dews spent nearly two decades coaching college football, spending time with Millersville (1998), West Virginia (1999-01, 2007, 2017), California (PA) (2002), Holy Cross (2003), Central Michigan (2004-05), UNLV (2006), Michigan (2008-10), Pittsburgh (2011), and Arizona (2012-16). Across his career, Dews has coached every offensive and defensive position besides quarterback.

Dews and his wife, Tamika, have four daughters together.

**TODD DOWNING** enters his second season with the Jets as passing game coordinator, bringing 24 years of coaching experience to the team.

Prior to joining the Jets, Downing recently served as offensive coordinator for the Titans from 2021-22, after initially joining the club in 2019 as a tight ends coach.

Under his lead as offensive coordinator, Downing saw the Titans rank fourth in the NFL in red zone efficiency (64.1%) and helped quarterback Ryan Tannehill record a 66.5% completion percentage during that span, the 10th best in the League (min. 850 attempts). Additionally, Tannehill's 7.32 yards per attempt over the last two seasons has been the eighth best in the NFL (min. 850 attempts). In 2022, Downing helped the Titans record a League-best 93.8% goal-to-go efficiency.

During Downing's first year as offensive coordinator, the Titans offense finished fifth in rushing (141.4 yards per game), despite missing Derrick Henry for nine games, due to injury. Downing helped running backs D'Onta Foreman (566) and Dontrell Hilliard (350) each set career highs that season. Additionally, Tannehill finished third in franchise history in a variety of passing categories, including attempts (531), completions (357), and completion percentage (67.2). As a whole, the 2021 offense ranked eighth on third down (43.6%), fifth in red zone (63.9%) and first in goal-to-go efficiency (87.5%).

As a tight ends coach from 2019-20, Downing saw the Titans tight ends produce the NFL's seventh-best receiving yardage total (1,915) and tied for the eighth-best reception total (170). In 2020, his group ranked second in total touchdowns (14), third in touchdown receptions (12), sixth in receptions (94) and ninth in receiving yards (967).

During the 2020 season, Downing and his family initiated a social justice campaign, raising over \$50,000 for the 100 Black Men of Middle Tennessee, an organization providing opportunities in education to under privileged youth. Downing and his wife pledged \$1,000 for every tight end touchdown.

Prior to his time in Tennessee, Downing served as the tight ends coach with the Minnesota Vikings where he helped Pro Bowl tight end Kyle Rudolph post the second-highest reception (64) and yardage totals (634) of his career.

From 2015-17, Downing spent time with the Oakland Raiders, serving as the quarterbacks coach from 2015-16 before being named offensive coordinator for the 2017 season. During his time in Oakland, Downing helped quarterback Derek Carr earn three consecutive Pro Bowl appearances. During his second year as quarterbacks coach in 2016, Downing helped the Raiders offense finish sixth in the NFL, while Carr recorded career highs in a variety

of categories. Downing was named Pro Football Focus' Quarterbacks Coach of the Year in 2015 after Raiders quarterbacks combined for the second-most passing touchdowns (34) and the third-most passing yards (4,129) in team history.

Prior to his time in Oakland, Downing served as the quarterbacks coach for the Buffalo Bills in 2014 after spending the previous four seasons with the Detroit Lions as their offensive quality control coach (2009), assistant quarterbacks coach (2010) and quarterbacks coach (2011-13). While in Detroit, Downing helped quarterback Matthew Stafford become the franchise leader in attempts, completions and passing yards. In 2011, Matthew Stafford was chosen as Comeback Player of the Year after becoming the fourth QB in NFL history to throw for 5,000 yards in a season.

From 2006-08, Downing spent time with the St. Louis Rams as a defensive assistant and assistant special teams coach (2006-07) prior to being named assistant secondary/defensive quality control coach in 2008.

Before the Rams, Downing worked as an intern and coaching assistant with the Vikings from 2001-02 prior to transitioning to a football systems analyst role from 2003-04. Downing was named offensive quality coach prior to the start of the 2005 season where he helped the team achieve top five offensive finishes in three years.

In his career, Downing has been a part of some prolific offenses. He has worked with offenses that were top five in total offense five times, top five in passing offense six times, top 10 in third down offense eight times, top 10 in red zone offense 12 times.

An Eden Prairie native, Downing attended the University of Minnesota, majoring in business communications. From 2000-03, he played quarterback for the Minnesota Maulers, a semi-pro team.

**NATHANIEL HACKETT** enters his second year with the New York Jets, after being named Offensive Coordinator on January 26, 2023.

Hackett brings 16 years of NFL coaching experience to the team, most recently serving as the Head Coach of the Denver Broncos (2022). Prior to his stint as head coach, Hackett spent eight of the last 10 years as an offensive coordinator, most recently for the Green Bay Packers (2019-21), after leading the Jacksonville Jaguars (2016-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-14) offenses.

“He had the opportunity because of his life’s work as an offensive coordinator and all the different things that he’s done in this League and how much respect he’s garnered throughout the League, and all his different spots, all the people, all the players he’s developed and the people that he’s worked with.” - *HC Robert Saleh, 1.26.23*

This past season (2023), Hackett oversaw an offensive group that consisted of rookie and second-year players accounting for 64.1% of the Jets total touches (second-highest in the League) and 64.6% of the scrimmage yards (highest in the League). The Jets were the only team ranked in the top five in percentage of their total from rookie & second-year players in nearly every rushing and receiving category. Additionally, running back Breece Hall and wide receiver Garrett Wilson helped the Jets become just the sixth team with a 1,500-scrimmage yard running back and a 1,000-receiving yard wide receiver both in their first or second year in the same season since 1970.

Since 2017, Hackett has been a part of four postseason runs, including three conference championship games (JAX – 2018, GB – 2020-21). He helped lead two top five scoring offenses during that time, including Jacksonville in 2017 (fifth - 26.1 points per game) and Green Bay in 2020 (first - 31.8 points per game). During that span, Hackett’s teams have won 54 of their 81 games (.667), the fourth-best winning percentage in the League.

Hackett began his coaching career in 2003 as an assistant linebacker’s coach at his alma mater, the University of California, Davis prior to joining Stanford’s staff as the offensive/defensive assistant to the coordinators. In 2005, he transitioned to a specialists/recruiting coordinator.

Hackett entered the NFL as an offensive quality control coach under Jon Gruden with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2006. He served there for two years prior to moving to the same role for the Buffalo Bills from 2008-09. In 2010, Hackett transitioned back to the collegiate level and was hired by Syracuse as their passing game coordinator/quarterbacks/tight ends coach under Doug Marrone. Hackett was promoted to offensive coordinator/tight ends for Syracuse in 2011, spending two seasons in that role.

In 2013, Hackett was hired by the Bills as their offensive coordinator. During his first season in the role, Hackett oversaw a Bills offense that ranked number two in the NFL in rushing yards per game (144.2). In 2014, Hackett helped the Bills offense register an 86.0 passer rating, the highest by the team since 2002.

After the completion of the 2014 season, Hackett joined the Jaguars staff as their quarterbacks coach from 2015-16. With his guidance, quarterback Blake Bortles set single-season franchise records in passing touchdowns (35), passing yards (4,428), completions (355) and attempts (606). In 2017, as offensive coordinator, Hackett oversaw a Jaguars offense that led the League in rushing (141.4 yards per game) for the first time in team history. With his lead on offense, the Jaguars appeared in the AFC Championship game that season.

Hackett was hired as the Packers offensive coordinator prior to the start of the 2019 season, serving in the role for three seasons, seeing the Packers rank fifth in the NFL in scoring and committing the fewest turnovers in the League over that span. Additionally, Hackett helped quarterback Aaron Rodgers secure League MVP honors in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21. During the 2020 season, Hackett helped Green Bay’s offense rank number one in scoring (31.8), touchdowns (66), red zone touchdown percentage (80.0%), setting an all-time League record, and time of possession (33:29), while ranking number two in third-down percentage (49.4%). Additionally, the team became just the third team in NFL history to record 500+ points with 11 or fewer giveaways in a single season. During the 2021 season, Green Bay ranked in the top 10 in a variety of offensive categories, including ninth in scoring (26.5), 10th in yards per game (365.6), 10th in total points (450) and fifth in time of possession (30:36).

A New Hampshire native, Hackett and his wife, Megan have two sons, Harrison and London and two daughters, Briar and Everly.

**SHAWN JEFFERSON** returns for his second stint with the New York Jets after serving as the assistant head coach/wide receivers coach from 2019-20. 2024 marks Jefferson's 20th season as a coach in the NFL, following a 13-year playing career.

Jefferson returns to the Jets after one season with Carolina (2023) and two seasons with Arizona (2021-22). With the Panthers in 2023, Jefferson coached a group led by veteran Adam Thielen, who recorded his third 1,000+ receiving yard season (first since 2018), and his second 100+ reception season. With the Cardinals in 2021, four players recorded 40+ receptions, 500+ receiving yards, and three+ touchdowns, followed by five players recording 20+ receptions and multiple touchdowns in 2022.

In his first stint with the Jets (2019-20), Jefferson oversaw a group led by Robby Anderson and Jamison Crowder, as the duo was one of just seven League-wide to each post 50+ receptions, 700+ yards and five+ touchdowns during the 2019 season. Anderson averaged 15.0 yards per catch, one of just 20 receivers in the NFL to do so, while Crowder posted a new single season best in reception (78), leading the team with six touchdown receptions. Additionally, Vyncint Smith, added by the Jets from the HST practice squad in-season, became one of just nine wide receivers in the League with at least three receptions of 20+ yards and at least 117 runs of 10+ yards. The following season (2020), Crowder fell one yard short of recording consecutive seasons with 50+ receptions, 700+ yards, and five+ touchdowns, while the offense saw four players record 30+ receptions, 250+ yards, and three+ touchdowns.

Prior to joining the Jets, Jefferson's three seasons in Miami saw Dolphins wide receivers average 4.9 yards after catch, the fifth-best average in the League, and account for 52 touchdowns, tied for sixth most. Additionally, Miami wide receivers accounted for 70.8% of the team's receptions, the second-highest percentage in the League during that span.

In two seasons with Jefferson, wide receiver Jarvis Landry made two Pro Bowl appearances, pulling in 206 total receptions, the third-most of any player in the League, while wide receiver Kenny Stills posted 21 touchdowns in his three seasons under Jefferson, the ninth-most in the League.

Jefferson spent three seasons (2013-15) with the Titans as wide receiver Kendall Wright finished seventh in the League with 94 receptions in posting his first 1,000-yard season in just his second

season (2013). Wide receivers Nate Washington (2013-14) and Justin Hunter (2013-14) each averaged at least 16.0 yards per catch during Jefferson's time in Tennessee.

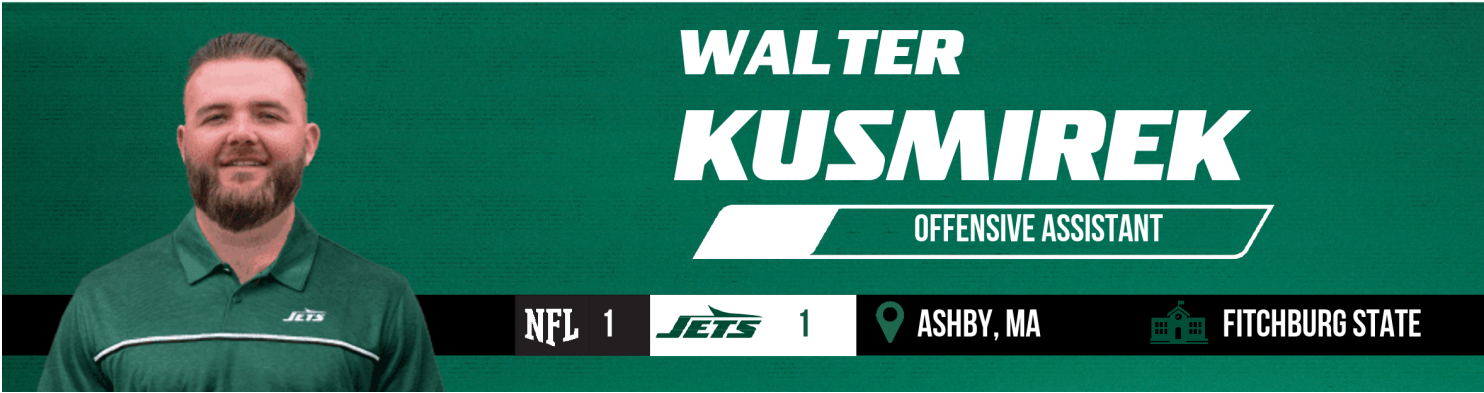
Prior to Tennessee, Jefferson spent eight seasons on the Lions staff, beginning as a coaching assistant in 2005 and moving up to wide receivers coach where he served from 2008-12. During his time in Detroit, he helped wide receiver Calvin Johnson set an NFL single-season record with 1,964 yards receiving (2012). Johnson was selected for the Pro Bowl three times and led the NFL in receiving yardage twice, finishing with season averages of 88 receptions for 1,416 yards (16.1 average) and 10 touchdowns in five years with Jefferson as his position coach.

Jefferson began his coaching career shortly after a 13-season playing career during which the former Charger (1991-95), Patriot (1996-99), Falcon (2000-02), and Lion (2003) wide receiver caught 470 passes for 7,024 yards and 29 touchdowns after entering the League as a ninth-round selection in 1991.

Before entering the League, the Jacksonville, FL native played receiver for three years at Central Florida. He and his wife, Marla, have two daughters, Paige and Faith, and a son, Van, a former standout receiver at the University of Florida who currently plays for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

**WALTER KUSMIREK** joins the Jets as an offensive assistant after nearly a decade at the collegiate level, most recently serving as the offensive line coach at the University of Rhode Island.

Prior to his time at Rhode Island, Kusmirek spent four seasons at New Haven, helping lead the Chargers to two NE-10 Conference Championships (2021, 2023) and three consecutive NCAA playoff appearances (2021-23). Additionally, Kusmirek helped New Haven’s offensive line finish third in tackles for loss allowed and eighth in sacks allowed nationally in 2023. He has also served as the running backs coach at SUNY Morrisville (2014-16) and the co-special teams and co-recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach at Wagner College (2016-20).

Kusmirek graduated from Fitchburg State University in 2013 with a degree in history, where he played on the offensive line. He earned his master’s degree in higher education administration from Wagner College in 2018.

**MARQUAND MANUEL** returns for his fourth season as the defensive backs/safeties coach, after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh’s first staff in 2021. Manuel has been in the NFL for 20 seasons as both a player and coach, earning trips to the Super Bowl as both.

This past season (2023), Manuel led a group of safeties who recorded 10 of 17 team interceptions with Jordan Whitehead recording four, Tony Adams three, and Ashtyn Davis three. Those 10 interceptions by safeties trailed only Baltimore (12) this past season and marked the ninth time since 2000 that the Jets have had three players record at least three interceptions each.

During his time with the Jets, Manuel has helped Whitehead become one of five at his position to record 150+ tackles, five+ tackles for loss, five+ interceptions, and 15+ passes defended over the past two seasons (2022-23). Additionally, Manuel helped Whitehead register a single-season best four interceptions (2023), becoming the first Jets safety with four+ interceptions since 2007.

Under Manuel’s lead, safety Lamarcus Joyner finished the 2022 season with three interceptions, the most by a Jets safety since 2013 and just the fifth Jets safety since 2000 with at least three interceptions in a season. Manuel helped Joyner become the fifth safety in the NFL since 2000 to record a two+ interception game, after doing so at Pittsburgh (10/2).

Manuel also contributed to the success of undrafted rookie (2022) Adams, who ranked top 10 in the NFL among all rookie safeties in time to tackle (fifth - 5.27), tackle percentage (sixth -12.8%) and stops (seventh – 5) during the 2022 season.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Manuel dealt with constantly changing personnel as 10 different safeties appeared on defense for the Jets in 2021, while eight started at least one game. Kickoff Weekend starters, Marcus Maye and Joyner, were limited to 360 total snaps as Joyner was placed on injured reserve in Week Two and Maye in Week 10.

Despite the constant rotation, former 2020 draft choice, Ashtyn Davis was one of just 11 players in 2021 with 50+ tackles, two+ interceptions, and two+ forced fumbles after tying for the team lead in both INTs (two) and FFs (three). Additionally, Jason Pinnock, selected in the sixth round that season after a college career at cornerback, made the transition to safety as a rookie and finished the final three weeks as the number one rookie rated safety by PFF.

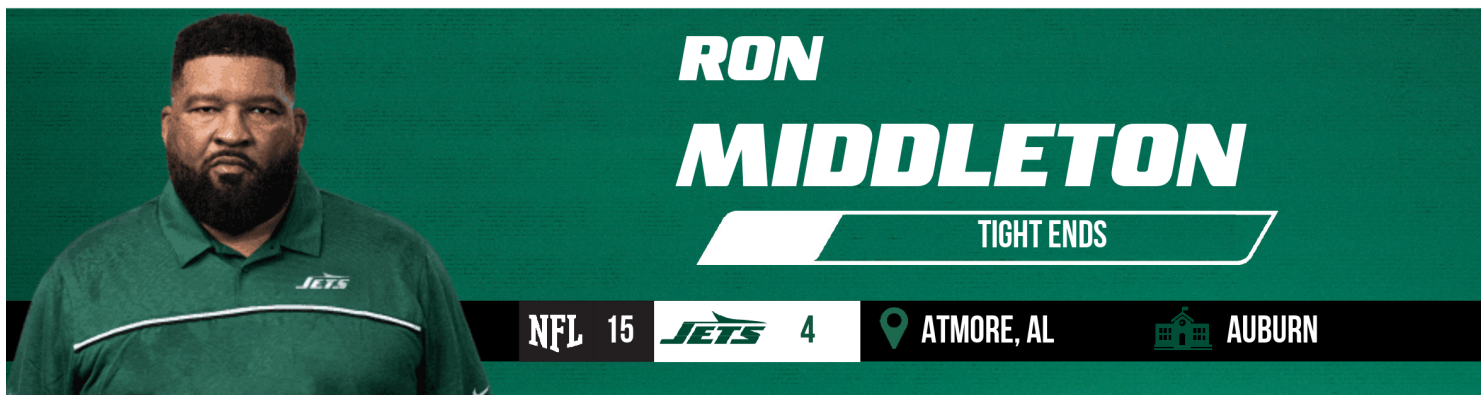
Prior to joining the Jets, Manuel served as the defensive backs coach with Philadelphia (2020), before four seasons in Atlanta, first as the secondary coach/senior defensive assistant (2015-16), Manuel was later promoted to defensive coordinator (2017-18). In his first season as coordinator (2017), the defense ranked in the top 10 in scoring defense (eighth), total defense (ninth), rushing defense (ninth), and red zone defense (fifth). Additionally, a pair of second year players, linebacker Deion Jones and safety Keanu Neal, each were selected for their first Pro Bowl.

Manuel’s first NFL position came in Seattle as a special team assistant (2012), before serving as defensive assistant (2013) and assistant secondary coach (2014). In his three seasons with the Seahawks, the team advanced to two Super Bowls, earning a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII, while the defense allowed the fewest passing yards per game in 2014.

An eight-year NFL veteran after initially entering the League as a sixth-round pick (2002), Manuel played with six teams – Cincinnati, Seattle, Green Bay, Carolina, Denver, and Detroit – and appeared in 116 games (57 starts). He started 35 of 46 games at Florida, finishing his college career with 308 tackles and six interceptions, before graduating with a degree in criminology and law.

Manuel has two children, daughter, Madison, and son, Marquand II.

**RON MIDDLETON** returns for his fourth season as the Jets tight ends coach, after initially joining the team as part of Robert Saleh’s first staff in 2021. An NFL tight end for 10 seasons, Middleton has been coaching since 1997, including 15 seasons at the NFL level.

This past season (2023), Middleton helped tight end Tyler Conklin set a new career high for receiving yards (621), tied his career high for receptions (61), and tied his career high for yards per catch (10.2), while finishing in the top 15 among all tight ends in receiving yards and receptions. Conklin finished the 2023 season ranking in the top five among all tight ends in receiving yards and receptions on third down.

Additionally, Middleton oversaw the growth of second-year tight end Jeremy Ruckert who finished the year ranking in the top 10 in receiving yards, receptions, and yards after catch among all second-year tight ends in the NFL.

During the 2022 season, Middleton led a group of tight ends who showcased versatility and reliability. Conklin produced first downs on 16 of his 33 third down targets in 2022, tied for the third-most in the NFL (among tight ends with a min. 130 third down routes). Additionally, among tight ends with a minimum of 85 targets last season, Middleton helped Conklin finish top 10 in the League in receptions (t-eighth, 58), receiving yards (10th – 552), yards after catch (seventh – 293), and receiving touchdowns (eight – 3).

With Middleton’s guidance, tight end C.J. Uzomah became one of 11 tight ends in the AFC to record two or more touchdowns in a game this season, after doing so vs. Detroit (12/18).

With the Jets coaching in the 2022 Senior Bowl, Middleton, the Alabama native served as the National Team’s head coach, leading the group to a 20-10 win.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Middleton’s group saw five different players record at least one explosive reception (16+ yards), tied for the most by any team in the League this season and the most on a Jets team since at least 2007. Veteran Ryan Griffin, who led the unit in receptions, yards, touchdown and explosive plays, caught at least one pass in each of his 14 games this season, the eighth-longest streak by a Jets TE since 2000.

During the 2021 season, Middleton served as the team’s head coach vs. the Jaguars (12/26) after being elevated as a COVID replacement for Robert Saleh. Against his former team, Middleton helped lead the Jets to the 26-21 win as the team tied the franchise single-game record with five fourth-down attempts.

Prior to joining the Jets, Middleton spent eight seasons with Jacksonville as the tight ends coach, also serving as a special teams assistant in his first three seasons (2013-15). Between

2013-17, a Jaguars tight end produced four touchdowns in a season four different times, as both Julius Thomas (2015-16) and Mercedes Lewis (2013, ’17) accomplished the feat multiple times. Middleton’s first NFL coaching position came with Tampa Bay as the tight ends/assistant special teams coach (2004-06), as he joined the team as a Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship intern in training camp the year before (2003). In each of his seasons as the tight ends coach, a Bucs tight end produced at least 35 receptions and multiple touchdowns.

Before the start of his NFL coaching career, Middleton spent 13 seasons as a college coach, after he began his career as a restricted earnings coach at Troy, where he worked as a tight ends coach and assisted with the offensive tackles (1997-98), five seasons at Mississippi, first as the tight ends coach (1999-2001) and then as the running backs/special teams coordinator (2002-03), a season at Alabama as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator (2007), and finally five seasons at Duke (2008-12), where he was the associate head coach/special teams coordinator/tight ends coach.

An NFL tight end for 10 seasons, Middleton entered the League as an undrafted rookie and played for Atlanta, Washington, Cleveland, Los Angeles Rams, and San Diego. Prior to that, he spent four years at Auburn where he won three of four bowl games and earned co-offensive MVP recognition as a junior and senior.

After he graduated from Auburn with a degree in pre-law/history in 1988, Middleton later received a master’s degree in sports and fitness management from Troy in 1998. He and his wife, Kalita, have five children, Desman, Ron II, Zaria, Mariah, and Allen.

**TONY ODEN** returns for his fourth season as senior defensive assistant/cornerbacks after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh's first staff in 2021. A coach in the NFL since 2004, Oden has coached multiple Pro Bowl cornerbacks and safeties over his time in the League.

This past season (2023), Oden coached a trio in Sauce Gardner, D.J. Reed, and Michael Carter who ranked in the top 10 in completion percentage allowed (fifth – 56.8%), passer rating allowed (seventh – 81.0), yards allowed per coverage snap (third – 1.01), target (third – 6.08), reception (seventh – 10.71), and touchdowns allowed (seventh – five).

Additionally, Oden helped Gardner become the first cornerback since the merger to be named First Team All-Pro in each of his first two seasons, while also being selected as a Pro Bowl starter in each of his first two seasons.

During the 2022 season, Oden saw Reed and rookie Gardner rank top 10 in the NFL in yards per reception, reception percentage, yards after catch, passer rating allowed, and total yards allowed.

Oden helped Gardner earn Defensive Rookie of the Year honors, First Team All-Pro and a Pro Bowl selection, becoming just the third rookie cornerback to start in the Pro Bowl since the merger. Additionally, Gardner became the first rookie in franchise history to receive First Team All-Pro honors. With Oden's guidance, Gardner became the only rookie in the NFL to produce at least one pass defended in each of his first seven games and finished first in the League in passes defended (20).

Additionally, Oden saw both Reed and Michael Carter II set career-highs last season. Reed finished with a career-high 12 passes defended and 80 tackles, the seventh-best rank among all cornerbacks in the NFL, while Carter II set career-highs in tackles, interceptions, and passes defended.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Oden's unit consisted entirely of first and second-year players, all of which entered the League as fifth-round or later draft choices or undrafted free agents.

Bryce Hall, a second-year, fifth-round pick in 2020, became the first Jets player to start 17 games in a regular season and finished tied for sixth in the League with 16 passes defended, the most by a Jets since 2013. Brandin Echols, a sixth-round selection in 2021, finished tied for sixth among all rookies with nine passes defended and earned Rookie of the Week honors following his 20-yard interception touchdown return, one of only two Jets to record a defensive TD since 2000. His fellow rookie, Carter II, drafted in the fifth round, was one of only three 2021 rookies with four+ passes defended and four+ tackles for loss, joining Jamal Adams, Erik Coleman, and Jonathan Vilma as the only Jets to do so in their first season since 2000.

Prior to his start with the Jets, Oden spent a season as the defensive backs/cornerbacks coach in San Francisco (2020). Despite using seven different starters at corner, the 49ers finished fourth in passing defense while also ranking in the top 10 in both completion percentage and passer rating allowed.

In Miami (2018-19), Oden helped a pair of young players in Xavien Howard and Minkah Fitzpatrick. In 2018, as the defensive backs coach, Howard registered seven interceptions to tie for the League lead, earning his first Pro Bowl appearance. Additionally, Fitzpatrick finished in the top five among all rookie safeties in tackles, interceptions and passes defended.

Oden spent four seasons in Detroit (2014-17) as the defensive backs/cornerbacks coach and helped the Lions finished with 58 interceptions, the ninth-most of that span. Under Oden, cornerback Darius Slay earned his first Pro Bowl selection (2017) after finishing the season with eight interceptions, tied for the most in the League. Additionally, Slay posted 69 passes defended, the most in the League over that span while also finishing in the top five with 14 interceptions.

Before Detroit, Oden spent a season in Tampa Bay (2013) as the secondary/cornerbacks as the Buccaneers defense finished third in the League with 21 interceptions. Cornerback Darrelle Revis was selected to the Pro Bowl in his only season with the team after finishing with a team-high 11 passes defended, two interceptions, two forced fumbles, and a sack.

As the secondary coach in Jacksonville (2012), Oden helped cornerback Derek Cox tie a career high with four interceptions, while safety Dawan Landry finished with 100 tackles - one of just eight DBs with at least 100 tackles that season.

A member of the New Orleans staff for six seasons (2006-11), Oden was the assistant secondary coach for five years before becoming the secondary coach in 2011. In his time with the Saints, the team won Super Bowl XLIV, finishing 2010 with the fourth best passing defense in the League. In that span, safety Roman Harper earned the only two Pro Bowl selections of his 11-year career.

Beginning his NFL career in Houston, Oden served as a defensive assistant and assistant defensive backs coach (2004-05). His first season, the Texans registered 22 interceptions, fifth in the League and still the most in franchise history.

Before coaching in the NFL, Oden served as defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan University (2003), after spending three seasons at East Carolina University as the safeties coach (2002), secondary coach (2001), and outside linebackers coach (2000). Prior to joining East Carolina, Oden was the assistant defensive backs coach at West Point (1998-99). He began his coaching career as assistant defensive backs coach at Millersville (PA) University in 1996, followed by one season as a graduate assistant



working with the wide receivers at Boston College (1997).

A four-year linebacker at Baldwin-Wallace College, Oden earned First Team Ohio Athletic Conference honors twice and was a 1994 Division III All-American.

Oden and his wife, Amanda, have a son, Jaylen, and a daughter, Ryan.

**MIKE RUTENBERG** returns for his fourth season as the Jets linebackers coach, after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh’s first staff in 2021. For Rutenberg, 2024 marks his 15th season in the NFL and fourth as a position coach.

This past season (2023), Rutenberg helped linebacker Quincy Williams earn First Team All-Pro and Team MVP honors, becoming the only First Team All-Pro on defense who joined his team via waiver claim since 2000. Additionally, under Rutenberg’s lead, Williams became one of six players since 2015 to record at least 100 tackles (139), 10 tackles for loss (15), and 10 passes defended (10) on the season.

Team captain C.J. Mosley recorded his third consecutive season with at least 150 tackles (152) in 2023, finishing eighth in the League. Rutenberg has helped him become one of just 11 players since 2000 with 150 tackles in at least two consecutive seasons (2022-23) and one of just five with 150+ in three straight (2021-23).

During the 2022 season, Rutenberg coached a duo in Mosley and Williams who became one of eight linebacker pairs in the NFL to reach record 100+ tackles and the only duo with back-to-back 100+ tackle seasons, after doing so in 2021 as well.

Rutenberg helped Mosley reach his fifth Pro Bowl selection and first as a Jet, in addition to receiving Second Team All-Pro honors. Mosley became one of only four players in the NFL last season to record 12 games with nine+ tackles. Additionally, his 158 tackles on the year marked his sixth season registering at least 100+ tackles, one of only five active players to do so.

With Rutenberg’s lead, Williams became one of four players in the NFL last season with 200+ tackles, 5.0+ sacks, five+ passes defended, and three+ forced fumbles.

With the Jets coaching in the 2022 Senior Bowl, Rutenberg served as the National Team’s defensive coordinator.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Rutenberg saw career years from Pro Bowl veteran Mosley and Williams, a third-year player claimed by the Jets prior to the start of the regular season. The pair became one of just eight linebacker tandems in 2021 with 100+ tackles each.

Mosley, who returned after opting out of the 2020 season and missing all but two games the year before was a Pro Bowl alternate and Team MVP after he finished fourth in the League with a single-season best 168 tackles. Williams, who entered 2021 with 18 games played (eight starts) in his first two seasons, posted single-season bests in tackles (107), sacks (2.0), passes defended (five) and tackles for loss (nine), becoming one of just five players in 2021 with 100+ tackles, nine+ TFLs and five+ PDs.

Prior to joining the Jets, Rutenberg was the passing game specialist (2020) with the 49ers. In his only season with San Francisco, he helped the defense finish fourth in passing defense while also ranking in the top 10 in both completion percentage and passer rating allowed.

Coaching college football for seven seasons, first with UCLA (2006-08) and then with New Mexico State (2009-12), Rutenberg was named the defensive coordinator at the University of San Diego (2013) before he returned to the NFL with the Jaguars initially as the assistant defensive backs coach (2013-15), then as a defensive assistant (2016-17), before serving as the assistant linebackers coach (2018-19).

Rutenberg entered the League with Washington, initially as a player personnel intern (2013), before working with Head Coach Joe Gibbs as football assistant to the head coach.

A graduate of Cornell who played Spring Football, Rutenberg and his wife, Stacey, have a daughter, Laney, and a son, Luke.

**DAN SHAMASH** returns to the New York Jets after joining Robert Saleh’s staff on February 1, 2022 as the situational football/game management coordinator and enters his first season as the special teams assistant/game management coordinator. Shamash first worked with the Jets in 2008, has been in the NFL for the last 15 seasons, coaching both sides of the ball.

Prior to joining the Jets, Shamash spent five seasons with the Chargers (2017-21) in a variety of roles on the offense. Over his time with Los Angeles, he helped coach an offense that ranked in the Top 10 in the League four times. Working with tight ends, Hunter Henry twice posted single-season best in receptions (2020 & 2019), while he assisted receivers, Keenan Allen set a then-franchise record with 102 receptions (2017), the fourth-most in the NFL.

Working on the defensive side of the ball in Jacksonville (2014-16), Shamash served as a defensive quality control coach on the same staff as Saleh (linebackers coach). In 2016, the Jaguars defense finished sixth in the League, allowing 321.7 yards per game and just 5.00 yards per play (ranked third).

In Tampa Bay (2012-13), Shamash worked closely with Head Coach Greg Schiano in football aspects ranging from situational football and game management to daily practice, squad meetings and research projects.

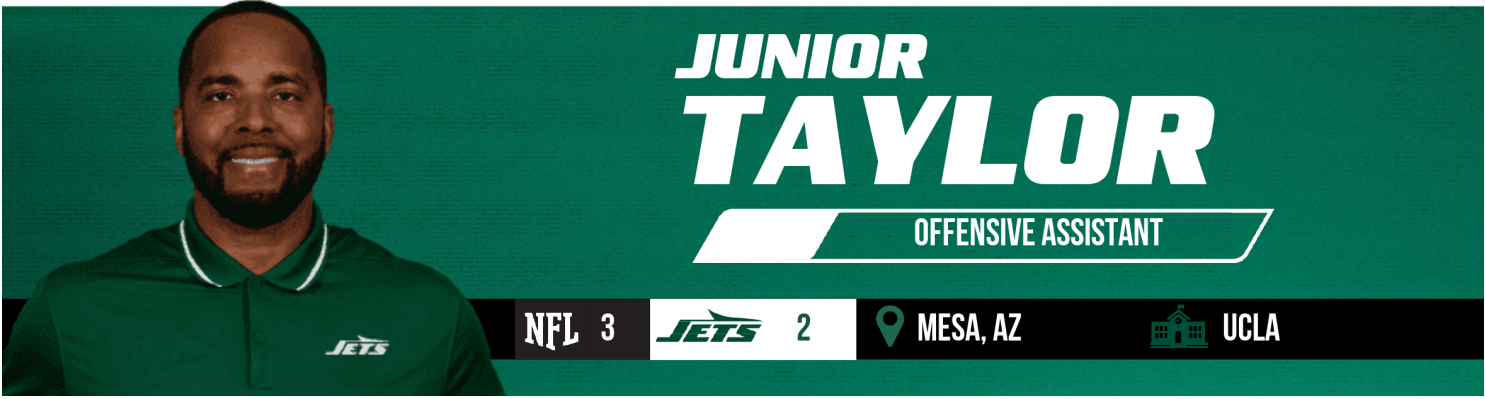
With the Browns (2009-11), he was an offensive assistant for two seasons, assisting with the offense line (2009) – as Alex Mack was named to the All-Rookie Team and Joe Thomas earned All-Pro

honors – and then working with the tight ends (2010) – as Ben Watson led all AFC TEs in receptions. In addition, he worked with offensive coordinator Brian Daboll in preparation for daily practice scripting, scheduling and game planning, while also assisting Head Coach Eric Mangini on studying situational football.

Starting his time in the League as an intern with the Jets (2008), Shamash also served as a defensive assistant with Columbia University.

A native of New York City, Shamash earned his undergraduate degree from Carnegie Mellon University in 2008. He played four years for the Tartans at inside linebacker, helping CMU to an 11-1 record in 2006 — the winningest season in school history.

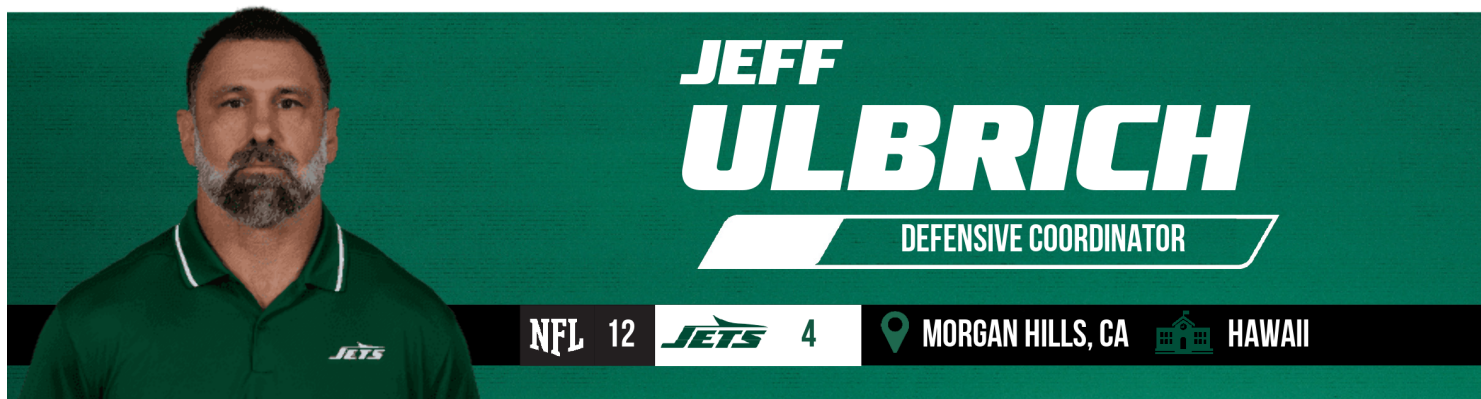
**JUNIOR TAYLOR** enters his second season with the Jets as an offensive assistant as part of the NFL’s Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship. Taylor previously participated in the program during the summer of 2020 with the Tennessee Titans.

Prior to joining the Jets, Taylor most recently served as Northern Arizona’s wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator, spending four seasons with the program. During his time, Taylor helped his players earn All-Big Sky Conference or All-American honors with four ranking among Northern Arizona’s Top 21 in all-time receiving yards.

Taylor began his coaching career in 2010 with Mesa High, serving in various roles before being named offensive coordinator in 2016. He was inducted into the Mesa High Hall of Fame in 2015.

An Arizona native, Taylor attended UCLA where he played wide receiver from 2002-06 and graduated with a bachelor’s degree in arts history and minor in education.

**JEFF ULBRICH** (*pronounced: ULL-brick*) returns for his fourth season as the defensive coordinator after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh's staff in 2021. Ulbrich, a 10-year NFL veteran linebacker, begins his 12th season as a coach and third directing the Jets defense.

Over the past two seasons (2022-23), Ulbrich has led a defensive unit to two top five total defense finishes with a third overall (292.3) finish in 2023 and a fourth overall finish in 2022, a significant improvement from their 32nd rank and 397.6 average in 2021. Since 2000, the Jets are one of just five teams to finish in the top five in total defense a season after ranking last in the League. Their 292.3 yards per game allowed in 2023 ranked eighth in franchise history, allowing under 300 yards for just the 13th time in franchise history and the first since 2010. In addition to their top three finish in total defense in 2023, the Jets allowed just 4.6 yards per play, the lowest average in the League.

Since becoming defensive coordinator in 2021, Ulbrich's unit has allowed an average of 301.7 yards per game, the second-lowest in the League.

This past season (2023), opposing drives failed to produce a first down 41.5% of the time against the Jets, the third-highest percentage in the League. Opposing drives punted after failing any first downs 27.8% of the time, second-best in the League and as a result, the average opposing drive lasted 5.13 plays and gained 23.5 yards, both the second-lowest in the League.

Additionally, Ulbrich led a unit in 2023 that finished top five in passing defense (second), yards per attempt allowed (fourth), completion percentage allowed (third), passer rating allowed (third) and passes defended (second), while their 17 interceptions ranked tied for the eight-most in the League.

Under Ulbrich's leadership this past season, cornerback Sauce Gardner become the first cornerback since the merger to be named First Team All-Pro in each of his first two seasons (2022-23), while also being selected as a Pro Bowl starter in each of his first two seasons. Additionally, Ulbrich saw linebacker Quincy Williams earn First Team All-Pro and Team MVP honors, second-year linebacker Jermaine Johnson earn Pro Bowl honors, and former first round draft selection Quinnen Williams earn Pro Bowl honors.

In 2022, Ulbrich's defense allowed an average of just 18.59 points per game, the fourth-best in the NFL and became the only team in the League to not allow a 300-yard passer. Additionally, the unit only allowed six players to hit 100 rushing or receiving yards in a game, tied for the best in the NFL. Ulbrich saw his team finish top five in the NFL in almost all defensive categories this past season.

Much of the unit's 2022 success was attributed to individual bests that were accomplished throughout the year. Ulbrich saw three key defensive players become selected to the Pro Bowl, two First Team

All-Pro honors, a Second Team All-Pro honor, and a Defensive Rookie of the Year recognition in 2022.

Defensive Lineman and 2022 Curtis Martin Team MVP Quinnen Williams recorded a career year, registering a single-season best 12.0 sacks in 2022, tied for the seventh-most in a season by a Jet in franchise history. Rookie Sauce Gardner finished first in the NFL in passes defended (20) this past season and became the only rookie in the League to produce at least one pass defended in each of his first seven games. Veteran linebacker and team captain C.J. Mosley became one of only four players in the NFL last season to record 12 games with nine+ tackles, while his 158 tackles on the year marked his sixth season registering at least 100+ tackles, one of only five active players to do so.

In his first season with the Jets (2021), Ulbrich oversaw one of the League's youngest defenses, as 63.9% of the snaps came from players 25-years old or less at the start of the year, the highest percentage in the League and the only team over 50%.

*"When you're raising a young defense like we are right now, we're getting these scars, these battle wounds. I'd like to think that as much as that hurt, that failure will lead to like the defense we're trying to create here, a Championship-level defense. And when we're playing for championships here, that's going to be one of the reasons that we win them."*

In "raising" his defense, the scars were visible early in the 2021 season, however over the final seven weeks, Ulbrich's group improved in points per game, yards per play, passing yards per attempt and yards per rush, all while getting valuable reps for a number of young players.

Perhaps no group epitomized the team's youth as much as the secondary as the top six snap counts among Jets defensive backs were all in their first two seasons. Throughout the League, no team had more snaps from rookie and second-year players in their secondary than the 4,468 by the Jets in 2021. Second-year cornerback Bryce Hall finished in the top 10 in passes defended, while fellow starter, rookie CB Brandin Echols finished in the top 10 among all rookies in PDs.

Upfront, the Jets saw seven different defensive linemen register at least 15+ pressures, while Williams was one of just two players in the League in the top 10 in stop, stuff and sack percentage (according to Next Gen Stats). At linebacker, Mosley and roster reduction waiver claim Quincy Williams both recorded a single-season high in tackles as Mosley, the 2021 Curtis Martin Team MVP, finished fourth in the League.

Prior to the Jets, Ulbrich spent six seasons with the Falcons, the first five as the team's linebackers coach (2015-19), before he added the title of assistant head coach (2020). In 2020, following Raheem Morris' move to interim head coach in Week Six, he

became the interim defensive coordinator for the final 11 games. Under Ulbrich, the defense improved in every category: total defense, scoring defense, passing defense, rushing defense, third down defense and red zone defense, while also producing sacks and interceptions at a higher rate. In those final 11 games, the Falcons ranked in the top third of the League in opponents third-down percentage and opposing red zone touchdown percentage, while also allowing the sixth-fewest rushing yards per game.

In his six seasons with Atlanta, Ulbrich has had a linebacker register 90+ tackles nine times, including by four different players: Deion Jones (four times), De’Vondre Campbell (three), Foyesade Oluokun, and Paul Worrilow. Jones, a second-round pick in 2016, produced 100+ tackles in every season in which he played at least 15 games, posting 513 tackles, the eighth-most in the League since 2016. Additionally, Jones, a Pro Bowler, finished in the top two among all linebackers in passes defended (38), interceptions (11) and defensive touchdowns (five) since 2016. Oluokun, a former sixth-round pick out of Yale in 2018, finished second behind Jones in total tackles, while also recording six forced fumbles, the most on the team in his three seasons under Ulbrich.

Originally hired as the team’s linebackers and special teams coach, Ulbrich added the title of assistant head coach in the spring of his first year at UCLA (2012), spending two years in that role before becoming the defensive coordinator in 2014. In his time with the Bruins, he helped Anthony Barr convert from running back to linebacker before finishing second in the country with 13.5 sacks (2012), Myles Jack earn Pac-12 Defensive and Offensive Freshman of the Year honors (2013), and Eric Kendricks earn both the Butkus Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy after leading the nation in solo tackles per game (2014). All three players were selected in the first or second round of the NFL draft and both Barr and Kendrick have been selected as Pro Bowlers in the NFL. As a special teams coach, he joined just three other schools as the only FBS teams to finish the regular season among the top-20 nationally in both kickoffs and

kickoff returns during the 2013 season.

Following his 10-year playing career, Ulbrich started his coaching career with Seattle in 2010 as special teams assistant for two seasons. During the 2010 season, kicker Olindo Mare matched the sixth-longest field goal streak with 30-straight, while the kickoff return units ranked third in the NFL and the kickoff cover group ranked fifth in the League.

A former third-round selection by San Francisco in the 2000 NFL Draft, Ulbrich played linebacker in 120 games (75 starts) over 10 seasons with the 49ers and posted 653 tackles, 5.5 sacks, four forced fumbles, two interceptions and 13 passes defended, including 481 tackles between 2001-04, when he started 56 of 59 games. A starter for two seasons at Hawai’i, he was named All-WAC First Team and was a team co-captain as a senior, as he led the conference with a school single-season record 169 tackles. Prior to Hawai’i, he spent a year at Gavilan (CA) Junior College where he earned First Team All-Conference and team MVP honors after redshirting at San Jose State as a freshman.

Ulbrich and his wife, Cristina, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Jax and Jace.

**BILLY VANDEMERT** returns for a fourth season as an offensive assistant, after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh's first staff in 2021. A coach at the college level for seven seasons, 2024 marks VandeMerkt's fourth in the NFL.

This season, VandeMerkt will be working primarily with the quarterbacks, after working with the offensive line last year (2023). In his first two seasons with the Jets (2021-22), VandeMerkt worked primarily with the tight ends.

In the 2022 Senior Bowl, VandeMerkt was elevated to tight end coach working with the National Team's six TEs as part of a staff that won 20-10. In the game, tight ends comprised the National Team's top two receivers as well as catching two touchdowns.

In his first season with the Jets (2021) and working with the tight ends, VandeMerkt saw five different players record at least one explosive reception (16+ yards), tied for the most by any team in the League this season and the most on a Jets team since at least 2007.

Prior to joining the Jets, VandeMerkt coached quarterbacks at Lenoir-Rhyne (2020) after three seasons at Western Michigan (2017-19). He began his coaching career at his alma mater, St.

Joseph's College, before moving to Southwest Minnesota State. In 2015, he was a part of the group that establish the school's first ever football program at West Florida, as the Argonauts began play in 2016.

A former four-year starter at quarterback (2010-13), VandeMerkt was a three-time captain at St. Joseph's College, finishing his career with 6,432 yards and 56 touchdowns. He earned Freshman of the Year honors (2010) and was a Second Team all-conference pick as a senior before graduating from SJC with a degree in history.

**AARON WHITECOTTON** returns for his fourth season as the defensive line coach, after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh’s first staff in 2021. Whitecotton is now in his 12th season as an NFL coach and fourth as a position coach.

This past season (2023), Whitecotton helped coach a group who finished third overall in total defense, allowing 292.3 yards per game, following a fourth overall finish in 2022 (311.1 yards per game). Under his leadership, the Jets defensive line finished the season with 48.0 sacks, tied for the third-most in a single season in franchise history and tied for the seventh-most in the NFL in 2023. Additionally, Whitecotton oversaw a defensive line who ranked fifth in the League with a 9.2% sack rate per attempt.

Additionally, Whitecotton helped former first-round draft selection Quinnen Williams receive First Team All-Pro (2022) and Pro Bowl (2022-23) honors over the past two seasons. In 2023, Williams recorded new career highs in tackles, run tackles for loss, quarterback pressures, as well as his first interception. Williams was also top five among all interior defensive linemen in tackles, run tackles for loss and pressures. Additionally, Whitecotton helped former first-round draft selection Jermaine Johnson reach his first Pro Bowl in 2023 after improving in nearly every defensive category from his rookie season. Johnson also logged a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown, a forced fumble, and a fumble recovery on the season.

In 2022, Whitecotton oversaw a defensive line that recorded 45.0 sacks on the year, the seventh-most in the NFL and a significant improvement from their 33.0 total in 2021. The 45.0 sacks marked the most by a Jets team since 2014 and is tied for the fourth-most in a season in a franchise history. Whitecotton saw 14 different players record at least a 0.5 sack in 2022, tied for the ninth-most in the NFL, including 5.0 recorded by rookies, tied for the eighth-most in the League.

Former first-round draft selection Quinnen Williams received First Team All-Pro and Team MVP honors, in addition to being selected to the 2022 Pro Bowl. Whitecotton helped Williams record a single-season best 12.0 sacks in 2022, tied for the seventh-most sacks in a season by a Jet in franchise history. Furthermore, his 98.5 sack yards on the season were tied for the most by a Jet since 2000.

In his first season with the Jets, Whitecotton oversaw a deep defensive line group as seven different linemen registered 15+ quarterback pressures, one of nine teams in the League to do so. Among those seven, four registered single-season highs in pressures, including John Franklin-Myers whose 43 pressures were the most by a Jet since 2015. Franklin-Myers, who earned a contract extension during the season, was also one of 11 players in 2021 with multiple games of seven+ QB pressures.

Against the run, all three of the Jets interior defenders with 500+ snaps – Folorunso Fatukasi, Sheldon Rankins, and Quinnen Williams – finished in the top 10 League-wide in stuff percentage (defined as tackles made on run plays resulting in no gain or loss). Williams was selected as a Pro Bowl alternate as one of just two players in the League in the top 10 in stop, stuff, and sack percentage.

Prior to joining the Jets, Whitecotton worked as the assistant defensive line coach in San Francisco (2020). Despite losing two opening day starters in Week Two, Nick Bosa, the reigning defensive rookie of the year, and Solomon Thomas, the 49ers defense finished fifth in total defense and seventh in rushing defense.

Before his season in San Francisco, Whitecotton spent three seasons with Buffalo, the last two as the assistant defensive line coach. The Bills defense finished second in the League in 2018 and third in 2019 in total defense, combining to allow just 296.2 yards per game, the lowest in the League over that span.

Entering the NFL with Jacksonville in 2013, Whitecotton spent three seasons (2013-15) as a defensive assistant working with the defensive line, before serving as an assistant defensive line coach with the Jaguars in 2016. That season, the defense ranked sixth in total defense while a League-high five different defensive linemen each registered six+ tackles for loss.

Beginning his coaching career at his alma mater, Myers Park (NC) HS, Whitecotton served as the defensive coordinator, linebackers and defensive line coach throughout his time at the school (2005-11), before coaching a season as a defensive assistant at New Mexico State (2012).

Whitecotton played center at South Carolina from 2000-01 before transferring to UNC Charlotte, where he earned his undergraduate degree. He and his wife, Heather, have four children, two daughters, Lila James and Lorelei Tyler, and two sons, Jax and Jet.

**BEN WILKERSON** enters his third season with the New York Jets after joining Robert Saleh’s staff as the Assistant Offensive Line Coach on February 16, 2022. For Wilkerson, this is his 10th season coaching in the League following a four-year playing career.

Prior to joining the Jets, Wilkerson spent four seasons with the Giants (2018-21) as the Assistant Offensive Line coach. In 2021, Andrew Thomas cut his sacks allowed from 10 as a rookie to two and his pressures allowed from 59 to 18 (according to Pro Football Focus). Thomas ranked in both the top 10 in sacks and pressures allowed among all tackles with 500+ snaps.

Serving as the Assistant Offensive Line Coach with Chicago (2015-17), Wilkerson helped oversee an offensive line that helped the Bears rank 10th in rushing, averaging 112.0 yards a game in that span. Additionally, rookie Jordan Howard’s 1,313 yards in 2016 were the second-highest total in the NFL that season, and the most by a rookie in franchise history.

Wilkerson began his coaching career at his alma mater, LSU, as an Offensive Graduate Assistant (2010), and then as an Offensive Administrative Intern (2011). He then spent training camp with the Steelers (2012) as part of the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship program, two seasons at Grambling State (2012-13) as the Offensive Line Coach, and a year as an Assistant Football and Track Coach for North Shore (TX) Senior HS (2014) before returning to the NFL.

Entering the NFL as an undrafted rookie in 2015, Wilkerson played in 32 games over four seasons with Cincinnati and Atlanta before finishing his playing career in 2009 with the UFL’s Florida Tuskers.

A co-recipient of the Rimington Trophy, awarded to the top center in college football, as a senior, Wilkerson started 41 total games at LSU, finishing as a Rimington finalist and winning a BCS National Championship as a junior.

Wilkerson and his wife, Angi, have four children: daughters, Brianna, Isabella and Jordan, and a son, Benjamin II.

**NATHANIEL WILLINGHAM** enters his third season with the New York Jets after joining Robert Saleh’s staff as the defensive assistant on February 1, 2022. Willingham was promoted to the defensive backs/nickelbacks coach prior to the start of the 2024 season. For Willingham, this is his sixth season coaching in the NFL, after five at the college level.

Since 2022, Willingham has been a part of a defense who has ranked second overall in total defense in the NFL, allowing 301.7 yards per game, a significant improvement from their 397.6 average in 2021.

Prior to joining the Jets, Willingham spent three seasons with Denver (2019-21) as the defensive quality control coach. During his time, the Broncos become the first team since 1995 to lead the League in red zone defense in consecutive seasons (2019-20).

Willingham spent five seasons at the college level, including four years at Stanford as a football quality control analyst (2018), defensive assistant (2016-17), and recruiting assistant (2015). In his time there, the Cardinal posted a 40-14 record and won the Rose Bowl (2015). He got his start in college coaching at Menlo College (2014) in California as the tight ends coach before the

school eliminated the football program.

A former prep center and defensive tackle at Skyline (Sammamish, WA), Willingham began his coaching career at the school in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the defensive line coach (2011-12). In his three seasons coaching the varsity, the school won a pair of state championships and posted a 37-5 record.

Willingham and his wife, Rachel, have two sons, Auggie and Emory. His father, Tyrone, a coach for over 30 years, was the head coach at Stanford (1995-2001), Notre Dame (2002-04), and the University of Washington (2005-08).

During the 2023 season, Wilson worked closely with the defensive line, helping them record 43.0 of the total 46.0 sacks, the most by a Jets front four since the 1981 Sack Exchange group.

A graduate of South Carolina, Wilson returned to his alma mater in 2021 as a Defensive Analyst after spending the prior three years (2018-20) at Tennessee working as an Assistant Director of Football Sports Performance.

Wilson had previously held off field roles for five seasons with the Gamecocks. Following his playing career, he worked as a graduate assistant for the defense in 2013 before moving into a full-time role as the quality control coordinator for the defense in 2014 and 2015. He later held the titles of Assistant Director of Recruiting (2016) and Assistant Director of Football Player Personnel (2017). During the 2016-17 seasons, the Gamecocks signed Top-25 recruiting classes.

In addition, Wilson served as a preseason scouting intern for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2017.

Born May 22, 1990 in Lakeland, Fla., Wilson graduated from First Coast High School in Jacksonville, Fla. Wilson is a 2012 South Carolina graduate who earned a degree in African-American/Black Studies. He was a four-year letterwinner as a linebacker (2008-09, 2011-12) and served as a team captain as a senior. He was the squad's leading tackler in both 2009 and 2012. As a player, he was on the 2010 SEC Eastern Division championship team and was part of the 2011 Capital One Bowl and 2012 Outback Bowl wins. As a coach, he has been a part of the 2013 Capital One, 2014 Independence, 2017 Outback, 2020 Gator, and 2022 Duke's Mayo Bowl wins.

Wilson has two daughters, Christian and Payton, and a son, Dason.

You’re just reacting, especially when you’re going up to get a rebound and stuff like that, so I think that translates really well to football.”

His track career started late as he played baseball, basketball and mostly football growing up, joining the high school track team as a junior, only after his high school quarterback suggested it as a way to increase his speed for football • Despite his football and track success, he had no offers and attended the 2014 California High School State Track and Field Championships to try to find a school • He settled on Cal because of proximity and their willingness to let him try to continue his football career.

“My dad said, ‘Just keep doing (track) and use it as a platform for where you want to go for football,’” Davis recalled to the Cal student newspaper. “It was really hard to find a school that was going to let me pursue football as well. When I visited Cal, the track staff was totally fine with me doing that, so it was just the right fit.”

**DOUBLE WALK-ON:** A five-year defensive back, Davis initially joined Cal's football team as a walk-on a year after joining the track team as a walk-on • Appeared in 48 games (33 starts) over his football career, registering 171 tackles, seven interceptions (one returned for a touchdown), 12 passes defensed, three forced fumbles, and three fumble recoveries on defense, while adding 70 kickoff returns for 1,604 yards and a touchdown.

“My personal meaning is a level of confidence,” he said during the pre-draft process. “When I’m on and off the field, I make sure I’ve got the sauce. That just keeps me going. When I’m in my little calm mood, it’s just me being Ahmad. The Sauce is within me, so I’m always Sauce. I have to know when to flip the switch up and turn the switch off.”

### JETTS OF NOTE

**NO TOUCHDOWNS ALLOWED:** Three-year starter at Cincinnati who finished his career with 99 tackles, five tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, nine interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 18 passes defended, and a forced fumble, while also scoring another touchdown on a blocked field goal return • Over 1,000+ collegiate coverage snaps, did not allow a touchdown for a defense that ranked in the top three in pass efficiency allowed in each of his last two seasons • One of two players in FBS with at least three interceptions in each season from 2019-21.

In his final season with the Bearcats (2021), started all 14 games as Cincinnati advanced to the FBS Playoffs following a 13-0 regular season • Named a consensus First Team All-American and only the second unanimous AAC Defensive Player of the Year, the second-such honor in

league history as well as a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist • For the season, allowed only 13 receptions for 117 yards, and finished with 40 tackles, three sacks, three interceptions, four passes defended, and a forced fumble.

“(Craig) has always been there,” he told the New York Post after getting drafted. “He’s always there to cheer me on. He texts me after every game, he always tells me if I have a question or if I want to call, just to call or text away.”

**ACCOLADES GALORE:** Two-time First Team All-American and two-time Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year who finished his three-year career at Iowa State as the school’s second-leading rusher and first with 56 scrimmage touchdowns, one of 11 Cyclone records he finished with • Set FBS record with a touchdown in 24 straight games • In 36 games (30 starts), totaled 3,941 yards and 50 touchdowns on 718 carries (5.5 yards per), while he added 734 yards and six touchdowns on 82 receptions.

The Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, First Team All-American selection, Doak Walker Award finalist, he finished 10th in Heisman Trophy voting after he started all 12 games in his final season (2021) and finished with 1,472 yards and 20 touchdowns on 253 carries for a single-season best 5.8 yards per carry • Added single-season highs with 36 receptions for 302 yards and three touchdowns.

As a true sophomore (2020), earned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year honors and was a First Team All-American selection, Doak Walker Award finalist, sixth in Heisman Trophy voting • Led the nation in rushing (1,572 yards), the third-highest single-season total in school history • Scored 21 rushing touchdowns • Became the only player in FBS with 75+ yards and a rushing touchdown in all 12 games, and first since LaDainian Tomlinson (2000).





Overall, in the NGS era (since 2016), Johnson's +42 increase in pressure from year one to year two represents the second-largest increase, while his increase in press percentage from 7.48% (rookie year) to 13.18% (year two) represents the eight-largest increase among the 106 players with 400+ pass rush snaps over their first two seasons.





“It’s a great feeling,” he said in a statement. “There’s a lot of negativity in this world. To be one of the positive role models, and to come back and still have that same support -- people are not trying to take advantage of you and things like that -- I can come back here with open arms, so that’s a great feeling.”

**ROLL TIDE:** A two-time National Champion at Alabama, he helped the school capture consecutive BCS titles in 2011 and 2012 while also earning individual honors as a two-time All-American selection (2012-13), two-time First Team All-SEC (2012-13), the 2013 Dick Butkus Award winner, and the co-winner of the 2013 SEC Defensive Player of the Year.

**UNCONVENTIONAL PATH:** After not receiving any Division One scholarship offers, walked on at Fresno State for one season before transferring to a junior college, Cerritos • In his lone season at Cerritos, while taking 19 credit hours in his first semester, lived in a two-bedroom apartment with seven other teammates, taking turns sleeping on couches and the floor • Following a standout season, he received a scholarship offer from Kansas State.

Cerritos College Defensive Coordinator, Tom Gaines, described him as a, “Look-you-in-the-eye kind of guy. The guy showed up to work every day. For a young guy at a community college, that’s a learned behavior for the most part. They don’t show up with that mindset already.”



**FTK: FOR THE KIDS:** Putting an end to childhood cancer and blood disorders is a commitment he is extremely passionate about • Throughout his career, he has worked closely with the MACC fund and helped grant numerous children’s wishes through the Make-A-Wish Foundation • To help raise awareness and funding, he used his appearances on national stages to help the MACC Fund raise money and spread awareness • His appearance on ‘Celebrity Jeopardy!’ and on ‘Big Fan’, his involvement in the ‘My Cause My Cleats’ campaign, as well as being a finalist for the “Walter Payton Man of the Year” award allowed him to make charitable contributions to, as well as raise awareness for, the MACC Fund • In 2018, the Medical College of Wisconsin awarded him an honorary doctorate degree for helping children with cancer and for his involvement in the MACC Fund, contributing to over \$2 million for reason.

**GIVING BACK:** In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, he saw businesses all around the country struggling to remain open and knew something had to be done • He announced the creation of the Aaron Rodgers COVID-19 Small Business Fund, where he teamed up with the North Valley Community Foundation to help small businesses in Butte County, CA, receive grants to cover rent and/or operation costs • With two separate rounds of grant recipients, 159 businesses were given a second chance at success during the tough pandemic restrictions these businesses were facing • All of the money he raised while hosting ‘Jeopardy!’ went towards this fund • Aside from his own fund, he donated \$500K to The Barstool Fund, a fund created for donating money to qualifying small businesses that apply for financial relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

**HOMETOWN HELPER:** Following the Camp Fire tragedy in Northern California in 2018, he set out to raise money for the area’s immediate needs and long-term recovery efforts • The fire burned the city of Paradise to the ground, leaving many residents displaced in his hometown of Chico, CA, and the north state • He worked with friends and the mayor of Chico to brainstorm ways to efficiently help his community • Teaming up with the North Valley Community Foundation, he donated \$1M to help with recovery and eventual rebuilding of the communities.



His solo project involved working with a mass spectrometer, which transferred chemicals through a machine and ionized them to reveal their weight.

Credits his grandfather, James Schweitzer, a nuclear safety officer in the Army for 25 years, with his love of the science. “He started me down the path,” Schweitzer told ESPN in 2016 after being drafted. “But in high school, I was taking chemistry and I was like, ‘Man, I just really love this.’ It really explains everything. If you ever wonder how anything works, why you feel this way, or why this happens, it’s all about chemistry.”



"I just really want people to know, it's OK to not be OK, that all the feelings you're feeling throughout the day, you know, whether you're feeling sad, depressed, anxious, angry – these are feelings of the human experience," Thomas said in a CNN piece. "At the time I started speaking of it, I hadn't come to terms with it, I really hadn't accepted it at the time."

**WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR:** As the Co-Founder of the nonprofit The Defensive Line, Solomon Thomas has not only committed financially to the causes he believes in, but he also actively contributes his time, energy, and mind to the growth and success of his organization. His public speaking always centers around the hopefulness he carries and the belief he has that everyone has extraordinary value and deserves to live healthy lives. His message is positive and uplifting, and he shares it in public as much as he does privately with those around him. He doesn't push, but he offers insight and experience, sharing a kind of wisdom that people crave and thrive on. The work with The Defensive Line has included a partnership with The Super Football Conference in New Jersey to speak with high school students about mental health, the 988 campaign with Dak Prescott and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, and an educational panel for all of Paramount Global in October.

Solomon has consistently demonstrated a generous and quiet giving mentality, donating to many organizations over the years, including: The Golden Heart Foundation, Boys and Girls Club of Tracy Kipp Minnesota, Champion Charities Foundation, American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, Hui Aloha Kiholo, Mississippi Rapid Response Coalition, 22 And You Foundation, My Brother's Keeper, Blue Dragon, and many others. When a member of the 49ers staff lost everything in the Paradise Fires, Solomon supported them financially.

Additionally, he has hosted a Youth Football Camp for middle and high school footballers in his hometown to learn from elite coaches and players providing a once in a lifetime experience for these young people. This season, for the holidays, Solomon hosted a Turkey Giveaway in partnership with Interfaith Food Pantry Network in Morris Plains, NJ, and will host a Shop with a Jock Christmas shopping spree with Boys and Girls Club of Hoboken which will provide the kids with a gift card from Walmart.

**BROS TO PROS:** After Williams was selected by the Jets as the third-overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft, his older brother, Quincy Williams, didn't have to wait long to hear his name called, selected by JAX in the third round • The Williams are just the fifth brother combination selected in the same draft since 2006, joining Terrell/Tremaine Edmunds (2018), Chris/David Carter (2011), Kenny/David Irons (2007) and Pat/Paul McQuistan (2006) • Additionally, the brothers became teammates in 2021, and joined Larry and Robert Woods (1975-1976) as the only brothers to play together with the Jets in the regular season.

In the Week Four matchup vs. TEN (10/03/21), both Williams recorded sacks, the first set of brothers to both record sacks for the same team in the same game, a feat they later duplicated in Week 12 at HST (11/28/21).

**PRESSURE UPFRONT:** Williams finished the 2023 season with 70 quarterback pressures, tied for 15th in the League and the most by a Jet in the NGS era (since 2016).

Additionally, Williams' pressure rate (min. 300 interior pass rush snaps) of 16.4% in 2023 was the third-best in NGS history behind only Aaron Donald in the 2018 and 2019 seasons, one of which Donald was named Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2023, Williams tied for the seventh-most games with 5+ QB pressures (nine). Williams and Aaron Donald were the only interior defensive linemen on the list.

**AGAINST THE RUN:** In 2023, Williams was one of 20 players with at least 100 pass rush snaps and 100 run defense snaps to post a 10+ stop percentage against the run (13.41%) and a 15+ pressure percentage (16.09%) against the pass.

Additionally, among interior defensive linemen, his 17 stuffs against the run last season were tied for the second-most, while his stuff rate of 5.8% was the sixth-best among those with at least 100 run defense snaps. He is the only player that appears in the top 10 in both stuff rate and pressure rate among interior linemen.

"Garrett was one of the best basketball players I've ever seen, too," Baty told SNY.tv. "If he chose basketball, no doubt he'd be in the NBA right now."

"I'm confident he would've been in the NFL as a quarterback," Wilson said of Baty. "He was that good. He says he was just throwing it up to me, but the bombs he was throwing were 45, 50 yards and we were in sixth grade."

**1,000+ RECEIVING YARDS:** Wide receiver Garrett Wilson surpassed 1,000 receiving yards on the season in 2023, making him the first wide receiver in Jets history and the 16th player in NFL history to record at least 1,000 yards in each of his first two seasons.



In franchise history, Zuerlein's 92.1% is the best all time, surpassing Nick Folk (2013) and Jason Myers (2018). Additionally, his 35 field goals made also set a team record, breaking Jim Turner's 1968 mark of 34.

**COMING IN CLUTCH:** Last season, Zuerlein converted all five attempted field goals during the last 2:00 or overtime of a game, becoming one of just two kickers in the NFL to do so (Younghoe Koo).

**50+ YARD FIELD GOALS:** With five made field goals from 50+ yards in 2023, Zuerlein recorded the sixth season of his career with at least five 50+ field goals made, including each of his seasons with the Jets (2022-23). He is tied for second among all players since 1970 with those six seasons, while his 49 field goals of 50+ are fifth most in the League and his 11 made as a Jet are second most in franchise history.
