

EARLY CHILDHOOD

- Neonatal mortality rate. The neonatal mortality rate is **29** per 1,000 live births (2022), compared to 31 in 2017. The indicator is higher than the regional average.
- Minimum meal frequency. The share of children ages 6-23 months who regularly consume an age-appropriate meal is 44% (2018). The indicator is similar to the regional average.
- Participation rate in organized learning. In 2018, 85% of children one year younger than the official primary school entry age participated in an organized learning program, compared to 88% in 2016. The indicator is higher than the regional average.

SCHOOL AGE


- Children engaged in child labor. The share of children (ages 5-17) who are engaged in economic activities is 17% (2018). The indicator is similar to the regional average.
- Child mortality rate. The mortality rate for children ages 5-14 is 18 per 1,000 children aged 5 (2022), compared to 21 in 2017. The indicator is above the regional average.
- Learning poverty. In 2019, 56% of children could not read and understand a simple text, by age 10. The indicator is lower than the regional average.

YOUTH

- Youth literacy rate. The share of youth (ages 15-24) who are literate is 66% (2022). The indicator is lower than the regional average.
- Adolescent fertility rate. The number of births for every 1,000 women ages 15-19 is **91** (2022), compared to 96 in 2017. The indicator is below the regional average.
- Youth not in employment, education or training. In 2022, 15% of youth (ages 15-24) were not in employment, education or training, compared to 16% in 2019. The indicator is lower than the regional average.

ADULTS

- Life expectancy at birth. Life expectancy at birth is 60 years (2022).
 This remains unchanged since 2017. The indicator is lower than the regional average.
- **Female labor force participation rate.** Female labor force participation as a percentage of the female working-age population (ages 25+) is **68%** (2023), compared to 67% in 2018. The indicator is above the regional average.
- Adult unemployment rate. Unemployed adults as a share of the adult labor force (ages 25+) is 1% (2023). This remains unchanged since 2018. The indicator is lower than the regional average.
