
# **PHILIPPINES**

Region: East Asia and Pacific

Income Category: Lower Middle Income



## **EARLY CHILDHOOD**

- Neonatal mortality rate. The neonatal mortality rate is 14 per 1,000 live births (2022). This remains unchanged since 2017. The indicator is higher than the regional average.
- Participation rate in organized learning. In 2021, 66% of children one year younger than the official primary school entry age participated in an organized learning program, compared to 79% in 2016. The indicator is below the regional average.
- **DTP vaccination rate, third dose.** In 2023, **89%** of infants received the third dose of the diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis vaccine, compared to 84% in 2018. The indicator is higher than the regional average.

#### **SCHOOL AGE**


- Learning poverty. In 2019, 91% of children could not read and understand a simple text, by age 10. The indicator is higher than the regional average.
- Children engaged in child labor. The share of children (ages 5-17) who are engaged in economic activities is 1% (2020). The indicator is below the regional average.
- Child mortality rate. The mortality rate for children ages 5-14 is 4 per 1,000 children aged 5 (2022). This remains unchanged since 2017. The indicator is similar to the regional average.

## YOUTH

- Youth not in employment, education or training. In 2022, 13% of youth (ages 15-24) were not in employment, education or training, compared to 22% in 2017. The indicator is lower than the regional average.
- Adolescent fertility rate. The number of births for every 1,000 women ages 15-19 is **48** (2022), compared to 50 in 2017. The indicator is above the regional average.
- Youth literacy rate. The share of youth (ages 15-24) who are literate
  is 99% (2020). This remains unchanged since 2015. The indicator is
  higher than the regional average.

### **ADULTS**

- **Life expectancy at birth.** Life expectancy at birth is **72** years (2022). This remains unchanged since 2017. The indicator is lower than the regional average.
- Female labor force participation rate. Female labor force participation as a percentage of the female working-age population (ages 25+) is **54%** (2023), compared to 52% in 2018. The indicator is below the regional average.
- Adult unemployment rate. Unemployed adults as a share of the adult labor force (ages 25+) is 1% (2023). This remains unchanged since 2018. The indicator is lower than the regional average.
