
Railways in India unfolded a page in history that started in 1853 and continued to add illustrious chapters in this history to build a glorious nation. The first passenger train ran between Bori Bunder (Bombay) and Thane, covering a small distance of 34 kms and this started the era of new & faster transportation in India. The Railways gradually entrenched in India and become accepted to the society at an unprecedented speed. The frequency and the number of trains were increasing as more and more people started to depend on its services and the wheels of rail reached to commercial, pilgrimage & hills of India and many princely states started operating their own rail network. Each Railway system was identified with unique logos. Some of the old logos used by various princely state railways before independence are as follows:

## Railway Logos used pre Independence by State Railways & Princely Railways







In1947, India got independence and started manifesting its own fortune, formation of Indian Railways by amalgamation of various princely railways. This process having started in 1947 ended in 1951 with the constitution of Indian Railways and by distributing it into 6 zones. With the expansion of network of Indian Railways, at present, Indian Railways has 17 zones. Till 2007, each Railway had its own logos which are as under:

In 2007, it was felt that Indian Railways should have standard logo for all its zones. The present logo and its features are as under:



- The present IR logo is in two colours, one in Blue colour & other in Red Colour.
- It has an image of face of a steam engine and coach behind it.
- The face of steam engine has State Emblem of India, as the national emblem of the Republic of India.
- Below the State Emblem words (सत्यमेव जयते)" Satyameva Jayate is written in Devanagari Script.
- There will be no back ground colour behind the Emblem words (सत्यमेव जयते)"
- The logo has 17 stars in a circle, which represent the 17 Railway zones over Indian Railways.
