FOSSI Scholars Reach New Heights

Thirteen Future of STEM Scholar Initiative (FOSSI) students experienced a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity in December, ringing the Closing Bell® at the New York Stock Exchange.

Following a tour of the trading floor, scholars attended the 2023 AIChE Gala, along with FOSSI sponsors AdvanSix, BASF, Dow, and Lubrizol.

In September, FOSSI expanded its presence, hosting a lunch and networking session at Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU). This event connected 37 FOSSI scholars with over 40 representatives

from 22 sponsor companies and distinguished faculty.

Collins Award Fuels Student Excellence, Expands MAC Scholarship Opportunities

Lance Collins, AIChE Foundation Trustee and Vice President and Executive Director of the Virginia Tech Innovation Campus, expanded his support of the Brown Endowment with a new multi-year gift. This generous contribution establishes the Collins Scholar designation, providing an additional Minority Affairs Community (MAC) Scholar with a \$1,000 annual award, attendance at the AIChE Annual Student Conference, a travel stipend of up to \$500, and enrollment in the Peak Leadership Program.

Bee a ChemE Fundraising Success Sparks STEM Excitement in Middle Schoolers

The Bee a ChemE campaign celebrated a major milestone in 2023, raising an impressive \$675,000 to unlock the wonders of chemical engineering for middle school students. This generous support demonstrates a shared commitment to inspiring the next generation.

Bee a ChemE showcases the diverse and impactful careers available in chemical engineering. One core initiative is the K-12 STEM Ambassador Program. Launched in 2021 at The Ohio State University, this program trains AIChE undergraduate leaders in classroom teaching methods, empowering them to share their knowledge and enthusiasm.

The recent fundraising success will allow the program to reach more middle schools, a critical time for sparking interest in STEM fields. Bee a ChemE also recently launched a new website at the AIChE Spring Meeting in New Orleans, offering valuable resources for students, teachers, parents, and educators.

Doing a World of Good Grant Drives Growth of LatinX in ChE

AIChE's LatinX Voices in Chemical Engineering initiative is fostering professional growth and celebrating the contributions of Latinx chemical engineers.

Launched in 2023 with the support of the Doing a World of Good Grants Program, LatinXinChE provides a vital forum within MAC.

The program hosted a series of impactful virtual and in-person events during the AIChE Spring and Annual Meetings. These events created valuable networking opportunities and supported student achievement

Mattheos Koffas Named First Recipient of the June Wispelwey Bio Leadership Fellowship

AICHE's Society for Biological Engineering (SBE) awarded its inaugural June Wispelwey Bio Leadership Fellowship to Dr. Mattheos Koffas of Rensselaer

Polytechnic Institute. Dr. Koffas's laboratory is known for pioneering work on the engineering of microbial platforms that can produce natural products typically derived from animal and plant sources.

“Recognizing June's immense impact on the creation of SBE and her commitment to mentoring

early career talent, it is a privilege to raise funds to endow the Bio Leadership award in perpetuity,” said Arindam Bose, AIChE Fellow and Foundation Trustee.

AICHE Awards 2023 Langer Prize to Albert J. Keung of North Carolina State University

Dr. Keung, who is pursuing the use of modified DNA as a substrate for data storage, was selected as the fifth Langer Fellow, and presented an associated lecture at the 2023 AIChE Annual Meeting.

Keung's research group at NC State University explores how biological systems store and access information, focusing on engineering DNA. This versatile molecule is already utilized in various applications such as molecular diagnostics, biofuel production, and cancer therapies. Keung's team envisions broader uses for DNA, including data storage, computation, programmable materials, and climate solutions.

Process Safety Workshops for Faculty Held in U.S., Germany, and Online

AICHE's Faculty Process Safety Workshops demonstrate the implementation of process safety in industrial settings to chemical engineering faculty members. Participants learn how to integrate process safety into their undergraduate and graduate curricula, allowing them to provide students with practical knowledge of process safety for their future.

In 2023, host locations included Texas (Dow), Germany (BASF), and online (Chevron). We are pleased to report that university participation increased nearly 25%, and faculty attendance grew almost 10% compared to 2022.

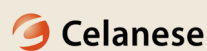
