
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QUARTERLY SELECTED SERVICES ESTIMATES, SECOND QUARTER 2024 – ADVANCE REPORT

Release Number: CB24-137

August 21, 2024 — The U.S. Census Bureau announced the following selected services estimates for the second calendar quarter of 2024:





Selected Services Total

Advance U.S. selected services total revenue for the second quarter of 2024, adjusted for seasonal variation but not for price changes, was \$5,595.8 billion, an increase of 1.4 percent (± 0.2 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 6.4 percent (± 0.6 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of 2.3 percent (± 0.2 percent) to 2.1 percent (± 0.2 percent).

Utilities

Advance U.S. utilities total revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$173.1 billion, a decrease of 11.7 percent (± 1.1 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 6.2 percent (± 1.3 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was not revised from the preliminary estimate of 9.2 percent (± 1.1 percent).

Transportation and warehousing

Advance U.S. transportation and warehousing revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for

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seasonal variation or price changes, was \$356.2 billion, an increase of 8.5 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 2.8 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -4.9 percent (\pm 1.3 percent) to -5.1 percent (\pm 1.3 percent).

Information

Advance U.S. information sector revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$591.4 billion, an increase of 2.4 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 6.3 percent (\pm 0.8 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -3.2 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) to -3.3 percent (\pm 0.6 percent).

Finance and insurance

Advance U.S. finance and insurance revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$1,719.5 billion, an increase of 1.6 percent (\pm 0.4 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 8.1 percent (\pm 1.3 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of 4.4 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) to 4.0 percent (\pm 0.6 percent).

Real estate and rental and leasing

Advance U.S. real estate and rental and leasing revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$265.6 billion, an increase of 10.4 percent (\pm 1.1 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 6.2 percent (\pm 0.8 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -4.6 percent (\pm 0.9 percent) to -4.7 percent (\pm 0.9 percent).

Professional, scientific, and technical services

Advance U.S. professional, scientific, and technical services revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$728.5 billion, an increase of 3.6 percent (\pm 0.8 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 5.6 percent (\pm 1.1 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -1.8 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) to -2.0 percent (\pm 0.6 percent).

Administrative and support and waste management and remediation services

Advance U.S. administrative and support and waste management and remediation services revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$340.6 billion, an

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increase of 4.1 percent (\pm 1.7 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and down 0.2 percent (\pm 2.7 percent)* from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -2.3 percent (\pm 1.7 percent) to -2.0 percent (\pm 1.7 percent).

Educational services

Advance U.S. educational services revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$28.4 billion, an increase of 8.8 percent (± 3.8 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 9.5 percent (± 4.5 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of 1.5 percent (± 2.8 percent)* to 1.6 percent (± 3.0 percent)*.

Health care and social assistance

Advance U.S. health care and social assistance revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$983.8 billion, an increase of 2.1 percent (± 0.8 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 9.1 percent (± 0.8 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was not revised from the preliminary estimate of 0.3 percent (± 0.9 percent)*.

Arts, entertainment, and recreation

Advance U.S. arts, entertainment, and recreation revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$104.1 billion, an increase of 12.3 percent (± 2.3 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 8.9 percent (± 1.9 percent) from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -8.8 percent (± 1.1 percent) to -8.7 percent (± 1.1 percent).

Accommodation

Advance U.S. accommodation revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$87.5 billion, an increase of 10.8 percent (\pm 1.3 percent) from the first quarter of 2024 and up 0.5 percent (\pm 1.1 percent)* from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -3.1 percent (\pm 0.6 percent) to -3.3 percent (\pm 0.6 percent).

Other services (except public administration)

Advance U.S. other services (except public administration) revenue for the second quarter of 2024, not adjusted for seasonal variation or price changes, was \$222.6 billion, a decrease of 1.7 percent (± 3.6

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percent)* from the first quarter of 2024 and up 2.0 percent (± 3.2 percent)* from the second quarter of 2023. The fourth quarter of 2023 to first quarter of 2024 percentage change was revised from the preliminary estimate of -11.6 percent (± 1.5 percent) to -11.9 percent (± 1.7 percent).

GENERAL INFORMATION

Notes

The Advance Quarterly Services Report contains current quarter not seasonally adjusted estimates of revenue for a subset of industries found in the Full Quarterly Services Report. In addition, prior quarter not seasonally adjusted estimates for all items and industry levels have been revised and are available here www.census.gov/econ/currentdata/.

The Selected Services Total is the only seasonally adjusted estimate that is updated in the Advance Report. Seasonally adjusted estimates for all other industry levels have not been revised with this release. Upcoming Benchmarking and NAICS Restatement

Effective with the February 2025 advance release for the fourth quarter of 2024, not seasonally adjusted quarterly services estimates will be revised to reflect historical corrections and will continue to reflect the results of the 2022 Service Annual Survey. The seasonally adjusted Selected Services Total will reflect historical corrections, results of the 2022 Service Annual Survey, and new seasonal factors. This release will also incorporate 2017 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) changes. For a detailed description of these changes, please see the summary table. Publication tables will be reformatted to incorporate the 2017 NAICS definitions.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Survey Description

The U.S. Census Bureau conducts the Quarterly Services Survey to provide national estimates of quarterly revenue and expenses for employer firms located in the United States and classified in select service industries. The current total sample size is approximately 19,500 employer firms.

Each quarter, questionnaires are mailed to a probability sample of employer firms selected from the larger Service Annual Survey (SAS) sample. The QSS sample includes firms of all sizes and is updated on a quarterly basis to account for new services businesses, deaths, and other changes to the survey universe. Data for nonresponding firms are imputed based on data for similar-sized firms classified in the same kind of business. The following table lists imputation rates of total quarterly revenue for the industries published in the QSS:

Quarterly revenue estimates are obtained by summing weighted data (either reported or imputed), where the weight for a particular unit is the reciprocal of its probability of being selected into the sample. Description of Seasonal Adjustment

To derive the seasonally adjusted estimates published in this report, we used all available quarterly estimates as input to the Census Bureau's X-13 ARIMA-SEATS program. With each non-advance quarterly release, we publish preliminary seasonally adjusted estimates for the current quarter and revised seasonally adjusted estimates for the previous five quarters. The seasonal adjustment models used to derive seasonal factors for each kind of business are evaluated annually and will not be revised until the next benchmarking operation. Reliability of the Estimates

The estimates in this report may differ from the actual, but unknown, population values. For a particular estimate, statisticians define this difference as the total error of the estimate. When describing the accuracy of survey results, it is convenient to discuss total error as the sum of sampling error and nonsampling error. Nonsampling error is the difference between the actual population parameter and the value that would be derived by surveying the entire set of units identified as the survey universe (the sampling frame). There are many potential contributors to nonsampling error – the inclusion of erroneous units in the survey (overcoverage), the exclusion of eligible units from the survey (undercoverage), nonresponse, misreporting, mistakes in recording and coding responses, misinterpretation of questions, and other errors of collection, response, coverage, or processing. Though nonsampling error is not measured directly, the Census Bureau employs quality control procedures throughout the process to minimize this type of error. Sampling error is the average difference between the estimate and the result that would be obtained from a complete enumeration of the sampling frame conducted under the same survey conditions. This error occurs because only a subset of the entire sampling frame is measured in a sample survey. Common measures of sampling error are the sampling variance, the standard error, and the coefficient of variation, which is also referred to as the relative standard error. The sampling variance is defined as the squared difference, averaged over all possible samples of the same size and design, between the estimator and its average value. The standard error is the square root of the sampling variance. The CV expresses the standard error as a percentage of the estimate to which it refers. For example, an estimate of 200 units that has an estimated standard error of 10 units has an estimated CV of

5 percent. The sampling variance, standard error, and CV of an estimate can be estimated from the selected sample because the sample was selected using probability sampling. Standard errors and coefficients of variation are given in Tables A2 and A5 of this report.

The first page of this release gives statements about the change in revenue from a prior period. Each change estimate is accompanied by a number in parentheses, called the "margin of error." The margin of error can be used to construct a 90-percent confidence interval, which is interpreted as follows. If, for each possible sample, an estimate and its approximate standard error are obtained, then for approximately 90 percent of the possible samples, the interval from 1.895 standard errors below to 1.895 standard errors above the estimate would include the average of the estimates derived from all possible samples. If, for example, a particular change estimate is +1.2 percent and its associated margin of error is ±1.5 percentage points, then the 90-percent confidence interval for the change estimate is -0.3 percent to +2.7 percent. If the interval contains 0, then one does not have sufficient evidence to conclude at the 90-percent confidence level that the actual change is different from zero. Each comparison stated in this report has undergone statistical testing and is significant at the 90-percent confidence level, unless otherwise noted. Data users should take into account the estimates of sampling error and the potential effects of nonsampling error when using the statistics in this publication.
