There are no wait lists to participate in the before and after school care programs.

MEDICATION POLICY

Prescription medications cannot be given in school without written instructions and signatures from the student’s parent/guardian and doctor. Forms for prescription and non-prescription medication are available in the school office and on the District website by clicking on “Health Information” under the “Families” tab.

All medication must be delivered to the school in the original pharmacy container. No medication is to be kept by students without permission from the main office.

If your student has health concerns, has medication that must be administered during school hours, or if you have questions, please call your school’s main office and request to talk to the nurse.



HEALTH SERVICES

A registered nurse is assigned to each school building. Nurses identify and treat medical issues and injuries, conduct health screenings and support students as they self-monitor and manage their conditions.

When should I keep my child home from school?

Do not send a child to school with a fever or obvious illness. Here are some general guidelines to keep in mind.

- **Conjunctivitis** - Red, swollen eyes that itch and are draining pus or have a crusty appearance. Keep home until student has been on eye drops/antibiotics for 24 hours and cleared by a doctor.
- **Coughing** - Persistent, disruptive cough.
- **Diarrhea** - Until diarrhea has ceased for 24 hours without medication.
- **Fever 100 degrees or higher** - Until fever is below 100 degrees for 24 hours without medication.
- **Lice or Nits** - Treatment should begin as soon as possible once lice are verified. Students are not excluded from school for lice or nits.
- **Rash** - If rash is untreated or if student is too uncomfortable even if treated.
- **Strep Throat** - Until student has been on antibiotics for 24 hours.
- **Vomiting** - Until vomiting has ceased for 24 hours without medication.

Communicable/Contagious Conditions

If your student is diagnosed with a communicable disease, keep him/her home until the doctor clears your child to return to school. Report all cases of communicable diseases to the school office. This would include, but is not limited to, any physician-diagnosed case of COVID-19, meningitis, staph (MRSA, VRSA), pertussis, tuberculosis, mononucleosis and chicken pox.

What happens if my child gets sick at school?

Students who become ill at school are sent to the nurse’s office. If the student has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, vomits, or has persistent diarrhea, the nurse or principal will contact the parent/guardian to come to school to take the student home.



SCHOOL CLOSINGS AND DELAYS

Periodically, CH-UH schools will close or delay the start of a day due to inclement weather or other unforeseen events.

To receive school closing and delay notifications, it is important for families to have correct contact information in their Infinite Campus accounts. This will allow the District’s automated messaging system to quickly reach you, via phone, email and text, with school closing information.

Parents can check chuh.org or follow the District on X/Twitter (@CHUHSchools), Facebook ([facebook.com/CHUHSchools](https://www.facebook.com/CHUHSchools)), and Instagram (@CHUHSchools) to receive instant weather notifications. CH-UH will also notify local TV stations with school closing information.



FOOD SERVICES

All CH-UH students, in every district school building from pre-K through 12, regardless of family income level, receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at no charge each day.

CH-UH is striving to eliminate hunger as a barrier to academic success by providing this service to families, cost-free to the district through the federal Community Eligibility Provision.

A la carte items are available for purchase at the high school and middle schools. Students must pay for these items with cash, check, or the pre-paid balance on their Infinite Campus account. Students are not able to “charge” for a la carte items. Students may also bring their own lunch.



INFINITE CAMPUS

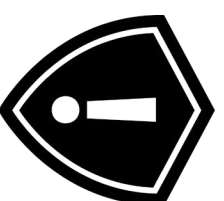
Infinite Campus is a secure online tool that CH-UH schools use to track and manage student information. It is the official grade book for the District for all grade levels. The

Infinite Campus Parent Portal is an easy-to-use online resource for parents. Through the Portal, parents can access their child’s attendance, grades, schedule, test scores, assignments and report cards.

It also serves as an excellent way to communicate with a student’s teachers. Families can receive important school and emergency-related information via phone call, text message and email by updating their contact information in Infinite Campus.

How do I create a user account?

Parents should contact their child’s school office and request an activation key code. This one-time code will allow them to log in to the Parent Portal site. Once logged in, the website will provide step-by-step instructions to guide parents through setting up an account. Parents who need assistance with their accounts should contact icportal@chuh.org for help.



SAFE SCHOOL HELPLINE

In support of the District’s efforts to ensure a safe, respectful and responsible school climate we have the Safe School Helpline available to assist you in reporting any wrongdoing that impacts our schools, our students, or our staff.

To access the Safe School Helpline, call 1-800-4-1-VOICE extension 359 or (800-418-6423) to leave your information. You can also submit a report via [SafeSchoolHelpline.com](https://www.SafeSchoolHelpline.com). Safe School Helpline numbers are also posted in each of our school buildings.

Your message will not be traced and you will not be identified. The Safe School Helpline team will transcribe and send your message to school officials so appropriate action can be taken.



TRANSPORTATION

Students enrolled in the CH-UH City School District are eligible for bus transportation according to the following guidelines:

- **Elementary School:** Students must live one mile or more from their home school.
- **Middle School:** Students must live two miles or more from their home school.
- **High School:** Bus transportation is not provided for high school students.

How do I find out if my student is eligible for transportation?

Call the Transportation Department (216-371-7195) weekdays from 6:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. You can also search your home address on our online Busing Eligibility Search Tool. Visit chuh.org and click on “Transportation” under the “District” tab.

When will the bus begin picking up my child?

The bus will pick up your child on the first day of school if your child is:

- Returning from last year and eligible for transportation, or
- Enrolled at least one week before school starts.

If your child is newly enrolled in the District it usually takes 3-4 days before a bus stop can be established. Call the Transportation Department and they will give you this information:

- Date bus transportation will begin,
- Location of the bus stop and
- Time the bus will be there.

Until you receive this information from the Transportation Department, you are responsible for taking your child to and from school.

Will the bus take my child to a daycare facility?

Yes, but only if:

- Your child is in Kindergarten through fifth grade, AND
- Eligible for transportation to your home school, AND
- The facility is one mile or more from your home school.

My child attends a school through Intradistrict Open Enrollment. Is transportation provided?

Yes, but only if your child is eligible for transportation from both your home school and your school of attendance.

Kindergarten and Special Needs Drop Off

If your child is in Kindergarten or is a special needs student, the child’s parent/guardian is required to meet their child at the bus stop at the end of the school day. No Kindergarten or special needs child will be dropped off at the bus stop without a parent/guardian meeting the bus. If the child’s parent/guardian is not at the bus stop, the child will be transported back to his/her home school and the parent/guardian will be contacted for student pick up.

Public Bus Transportation

Many high school students take the public RTA bus to school. Students can purchase bus tickets (\$1.75/ride) at Heights High, which is on the Cedar Road #32 (east/west) route and the Lee Road #40 (north/south) route. Visit RideRTA.com to plan a trip from any address to Heights High.

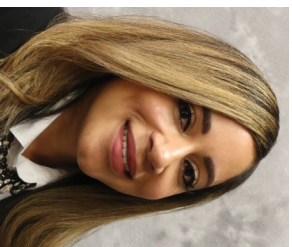

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Who makes up the CH-UH Board of Education?
A: Five elected members serve overlapping four-year terms.

Q: When are Board meetings?
A: The Board generally meets on the first and third Tuesday of each month at the Administrative Offices located at 2155 Miramar Boulevard in University Heights. Regular meetings are usually scheduled for the first Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m. unless there is a conflict with a major holiday or otherwise noticed ahead of time.

Special Board Meetings or Board Work Sessions may be called by the President, the Chief Financial Officer, or any two members of the Board. They send a written notice with a time, date, place and purpose for the meeting to each member of the Board at least two days prior to the meeting. Work sessions are usually scheduled for the third Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. unless there is a conflict with a major holiday or otherwise noticed ahead of time.

Q: Who is allowed to come to Board meetings?
A: The meetings are always open to the public.

Q: May citizens speak at Board meetings?
A: Citizens may address the Board at the beginning of each regular meeting during public participation and limit remarks to three minutes.

Q: Is there a way to make a formal presentation to the Board?
A: Citizens can write to the Superintendent up to four working days before a regular meeting to request a formal audience. Such requests are subject to the approval of the Superintendent and the Board President.

Q: When may the Board call an executive session?
A: The Board may call executive sessions:

- To consider the appointment, employment, dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, or compensation of a public official or employee, or to investigate charges or complaints against them;
- To purchase or sell property for public purposes;
- To prepare, conduct, or review negotiations with public employees;
- To review imminent or pending litigation;
- To review matters that are required to be kept confidential by federal law or rules or state statutes;
- To discuss specialized details of security arrangements.

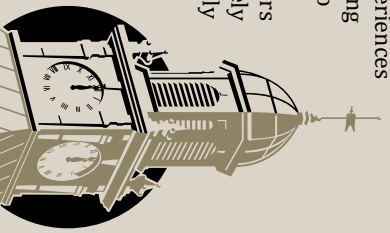
