

US SUPREME COURT PAVES WAY FOR EXTRADITION OF 26/11 ATTACKS N

n a major development, the US Supreme Court has paved the way for Pakistani-Canadian national and 26/11 attacks case accused Tahawwur Hussain Rana's extradition to India where he will face trial in the Mumbai terror strikes case. The US apex court early this week dismissed Rana's review petition (writ of 'certiorari') filed on November 13, 2024 challenging his extradition to India. With the rejection of his petition, Rana has exhausted all his legal options to evade his extradition to India. Now, Rana's extradition to India has become imminent.

In the past, Rana had lost similar pleas, both in US Court of Appeals in San Francisco and several federal courts, to be sent to India for prosecution of charges in the November 26-29, 2008 attacks case, in which 166 people were killed and 300 others injured.

During the hearing in his latest plea in December 2024, the US Solicitor General

Elizabeth B. Prelogar had made a strong case for rejection of Rana's review petition on the ground that the Lashkar-E-Taiba (LeT) operative was not entitled for relief from extradition to India.

A former medical officer in the Pakistani army, Rana had migrated to Canada in 1990 where he became a citizen before moving to Chicago. As per US law, if he is not extradited to India, he will be deported to his home country Canada after the completion of his prison term in 2027. Rana is currently lodged in a Los Angeles prison for his involvement in plotting a terror attack on the Danish newspaper

Jyllands-Posten. Rana had contended that he was tried and acquitted by a federal court in Illinois

(Chicago) on the charges pertaining to the 26/11 case, for which India sought his extradition. However, Prelogar had strongly opposed Rana's plea. Rana is accused of significant involvement in the 26/11 attacks case.

Ajmal Kasab was among the ten Pakistani terrorists who had carried out brazen

attacks on Mumbai. While nine of the ten terrorists were killed by the security forces during the attack, the remaining one-Mohammed Ajmal Kasab - was caught alive by the police at Girgaum Chowpatty on the intervening night of November 26-27, 2008. After his conviction in the case, Kasab was hanged to death in the 26/11 attacks case in Pune's Yerwada central prison on November 21, 2012.

Rana is one of the two masterminds who are yet to be brought to justice, while the other is Sayed Zabiuddin Ansari alias Abu Jundal, an Indian operative who worked for the Lashkar terror group. He was arrested in 2012 after being identified by Kasab and is currently behind the bars in Mumbai.

Welcoming the impending extradition to India, senior advocate Ujjwal Nikam, who was the Special Public Prosecutor in the 26/11 attacks case, said: "This is major success for India because the Supreme Court of America has dismissed the review petition of Tahawwur Rana. Tahawwur Rana and David Headley are the close links behind the terror attack of the 26/11 Mumbai attacks. By extraditing Tahawwur Rana, India will get more information and evidence of the involvement of some of the Pakistani people, including the Pakistan security apparatus. I am very optimistic that the extradition of Tahawwur Rana will give more evidence about the involvement of some of the security apparatus of Pakistan,"

Rana is a close aide of the Pakistani-American terrorist David Coleman Headley, who was also wanted by India for the 26/11 hit, carried out by 10 heavily armed Pakistan terrorists.

In an amended criminal complaint in the Illinois court against Headley and his accomplice Tahawwur Hussain Rana, on October 21, 2009, the FBI had given details about the reconnaissance done by Headley in India and his links with Rahul Bhatt, whom he (Headley) had befriended during his trips to India. Bhatt and his fitness instructor friend Vilas Pandurang Varak had subsequently confirmed having

met Headley during his visits to India It may be recalled that on September 26, 2023, the Mumbai crime branch sleuths had filed a 405-page supplementary charge-sheet against Canadian businessman of Pakistani origin Dr. Tahawwur Hussain Rana based on fresh evidence against him.

Among other things, the supplementary charge-sheet had alleged that Rana had stayed in India for 11 days - from November 11, 2008 to November 22, 2008. Of these days, he spent two days in Mumbai, where he stayed at Hotel Renaissance at Powai.

In its charge-sheet submitted before the trial court, the crime branch police had added Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) section 39A (offence relating to support given to a terrorist organisation) against Rana in the case."We have gathered some fresh evidence against Rana in the form of statements and documents," a senior crime branch officer said.

President Murmu bats **ONOE** PIONEER NEWS SERVICE NEW DELHI President Droupadi Murmu on Saturday advocated for the "One Nation One Election" initiative, asserting it has the potential to redefine "good

governance" in the country by promoting consistency in governance, preventing policy paralysis, mitigating resource diversion, and alleviating financial burdens on the state.

In her address to the nation ahead of the 76th Republic Day, she emphasised the government's ongoing efforts to "eliminate remnants of a colonial mindset that have lingered in the country for decades" and cited the replacement of the British-era criminal laws with three new modern laws.

"We have been witnessing concerted efforts to change that mindset... Reforms of such magnitude require an audacity of vision," she said.

Highlighting the significance of the proposed bill aimed at synchronising



election schedules across the country, Murmu noted, "The 'One Nation One Election' plan can offer numerous benefits, including enhanced governance and reduced financial strain."

In discussing legal reforms, she pointed out the need to replace the Indian Penal Code, the Code of Criminal Procedure, and the Indian Evidence Act with new

laws reflective of Indian traditions. She mentioned the introduction of the Bharativa Nvava Sanhita, the Bharativa Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, and the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, which prioritise the delivery of justice over mere punishment and place a strong emphasis on addressing crimes against women and children.

Reflecting on the significance of the Constitution, the President highlighted the progress achieved over the past 75 years.

"At the time of Independence, many parts of the country faced extreme poverty and hunger. However, we maintained a belief in ourselves and created conditions for growth," she said. Noting the contributions of farmers and labourers, she said India's economy now plays a pivotal role in global economic trends, asserting that this transformation is rooted in the framework established by the Constitution.

Modi, Rahul features in AAP list of corrupt leaders RAJESH KUMAR IN NEW DELHI

Days after former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said that he would not respond to Rahul Gandhi's attack on him, the Aam Aadmi Party on Saturday released a poster putting Congress MP Rahul Gandhi's name among a list of 11 "corrupt" people and claiming that the former Delhi Chief Minister will take on them. For the first time, Congress Leaders Rahul Gandhi, Ajay Maken and Sandeep Dikshit were featured prominently in the Arvind Kejriwal-led party's campaign poster.

Besides Rahul, the poster also has images of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, Uttar Pradesh Chief

Minister Yogi Adityanath, BJP leaders Virendra Sachdeva, Anurag Thakur, Parvesh Verma, Vijender Gupta and Ramesh Bidhuri and Congress Ajay Maken and Sandeep Dikshit. The poster Sandeep Dissum. with an image of security personnel making way for Kejriwal and his wife Sunita tagline, "Kejriwal's corrupt.



The poster referred to Kejriwal as being "honest". "Kejriwal ki imandari sare beyimano par padegi bhari [Kejriwal's honesty will prevail over all the dishonest people]," reads the poster.However, the inclusion of Rahul Gandhi signalled that the gloves are off for AAP. The AAP and Congress

are part of opposition bloc 'INDIA', however, are not fighting the Delhi election together.

While Congress leaders have attacked Keiriwal on the corruption front, Rahul has not referred to graft allegations against AAP though he had likened Kejriwal to Modi on "propaganda and false promises". Rahul had targeted Kejriwal on the issue of development over his governance track record, claiming that he cannot match the achievements of former Delhi Chief Minister and Congress leader Sheila Dikshit.

Meanwhile Mahila Congress president Alka Lamba, who is contesting against Atishi from Kalkaji assembly seat hit out at Keiriwal after AAP in its poster labelled Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi, Sandeep Dikshit and Ajay Maken as "dishonest" "You (Arvind Kejriwal) insulted Sheila Dikshit and Manmohan Singh. Now, he says in the interview that Manmohan Singh was the most honest Prime Minister. He should apologise to Dr Singh's wife. You were begging Congress for an alliance. We made a huge mistake by allying with you on seven seats and supporting you during the Lok Sabha elections," Lamba said.

knife attack Lucknow (PNS): A first-year

BTech student was allegedly attacked by unidentified accused with a knife in Vibhuti Khand, Gomti Nagar, on Saturday afternoon. The victim, Aman Dubey, has been admitted to RMI Hospital, where his condition is reportedly improving. Doctors said Aman sustained injuries to his hands, back, and stomach, and required stitching. DCP (East) Shashank Singh said that Aman and his friend were travelling towards Summit Building from Matiyari tri-section in

Chinhat when they had a dispute with the accused over allowing their vehicles to pass. The altercation escalated, and the assailants pulled out a knife, seriously injuring Aman. Police have formed three teams to track down the perpetrators. CCTV footage from the miscreants' escape route is being reviewed as part of the investigation. The incident has raised concerns over police vigilance, as authorities were only alerted after a video of the attack went viral on social media. Police have dismissed claims of any personal enmity between the victim

and the suspects.

FSDA team raids two shops

Lucknow (PNS): Food Safety and Drug Administration (FSDA) team raided two shops and seized adulterated sauces and noodles, a senior official

said on Saturday. Assistant Commissioner of Food Safety, Vijay Pratap Singh, said that based on a complaint, a raid was carried out at M/s Sahu Foods operating in the village of Baravan Kalan, Dubagga. "The inspection was conducted by the team from the Food Safety and Drug Administration. During the inspection, the owner of the establishment, Sanjay Sahu, was found manufacturing, storing, and selling different types of sauces and noodles. These food

items were found to be adulterated," he said.

He added that, based on suspi-cion of adulteration, a total of six samples, including conti-nental sauce, green chilli sauce, continental sauce (Fresco brand), noodles, soya sauce, and refined flour, were collected. "Green chilli sauce, continental sauce, and soya sauce, with a total quantity of approximately 3,700 kg, were seized on the spot. The wholesale market value of these items was Rs 60,000. Tomato purée and vine-gar worth Rs 11,000, which were found to be expired, were destroyed on the spot," Singh said.

Upon receiving information that another trader was buying from this establishment, the FSDA inspected Gaurav Traders, a shop located in analysis.

Aliganj, where continental sauce, chilli sauce, and soya sauce were found stored for sale. "On suspicion of adulteration, three samples of the food items were collected. The remaining continental sauce, chilli sauce, and soya sauce, totalling about 300 kg and having a wholesale market value of Rs 10,000, were seized on the spot. Both of the food establishments were found to be operating without a food licence. Therefore, the owners of both establishments were instructed to cease food business operations immediately," he added. A total of nine samples had been collected from the establishments mentioned above and sent to the laboratory for

7-yr-old boy stabbed to death by drug addict

Baghpat (PTI): A seven-year-old boy was stabbed to death with scissors by an alleged drug addict in Uttar Pradesh's Baghpat district, police said on Saturday. The victim, Afzal had gone missing on Thursday morning. His body was recovered from a sugarcane field adjacent to a jungle in Adampur village, following the arrest of the accused neighbour, Shavez (19), officials said. Afzal was last seen with Shavez around 10 am on Thursday. When the victim did not return home, his mother started searching for him, and subsequently his family lodged a police

complaint on Friday, a police officer said. Station House Officer (SHO) Bachchu Singh said that the family alleged Shavez of abducting their child. The accused was taken into custody and during interrogation he confessed to killing the boy. The body was recovered from a sugarcane field and the scissors used in the crime were also recovered, the officer said.

According to the police, the accused is a drug addict. When asked about the motive for the murder, he reportedly said he killed the boy by stabbing him with scissors "just like that."

Maha Kumbh to contribute **10 pc to UP's GDP: CM**

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath stated that the ongoing Maha Kumbh is set to contribute 10 per cent to the state's gross domestic product (GDP).

In an interview to a TV channel, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said that the 45-day event was projected to draw a number of attendees equivalent to the world's third-biggest population. "Maha Kumbh has only one message

and you must be seeing it too. There is no difference of caste, creed, sect or gender. Everyone is able to take bath in the same confluence. No one knows who is taking bath next to them. The message of Maha Kumbh is the message of unity and integrity. If we take the message of unity and integrity. If we take the message of unity, then Sanatan dharma will be strong and if Sanatan is strong then the country will be strong," the chief minister stated.

Recently, the chief minister along with his cabinet took a dip in the Triveni Sangam during the ongoing Maha Kumbh. Highlighting the significance of the ritual, chief minister described the Sangam bath as a pro-

found symbol of Indian culture and the Sanatan dharma, embodying spiritual peace, religious devotion, and social welfare. "Bathing in the sacred confluence is not just a personal act of purification but a collective call for the welfare of all," he said, according to an official statement. The chief minister also spoke about the youths who are coming to the Maha Kumbh in large numbers. "The previous governments had made it an event for the elderly. They did not provide facilities for it. For the first time we are seeing that cleanliness, security have been added as part of the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. If there is a confluence of modernity and spirituality, the

youth will join," he said. By 2029, Uttar Pradesh was set to achieve the milestone of a one trilliondollar economy, the chief minister said. "Despite the impact of COVID-19, we have managed to double the state's economy over the last 7-8 years and are on track to meet this target," he said. Chief Minister Yogi categorically ruled out any division of the state, reasserting his earlier stand attributing the state's tremendous potential to its

unity in the current form.

"UP is UP in itself. That is its potential. We should try to achieve our goals while keeping the state united. This is its strength, identity and pride," he said. In 2011, during the Mayawati-led Bahujan Samaj Party rule, the Uttar Pradesh assembly had passed a resolution for a four-way split of the state. The proposal was to divide Uttar Pradesh into Bundelkhand, Purvanchal, Awadh Pradesh and Paschim Pradesh.

Chief Minister Yogi has principally been opposed to the idea and claimed that the people of Uttar Pradesh are proud of their history and the state has its own importance in the country. "We believe in uniting, not dividing," he said earlier. The chief minister further pointed to the government's focus on all-round development of the state and said special attention has been given to the development of the state's eastern parts and the Bundelkhand region. He also referred to the Purvanchal expressway and Bundelkhand expressway, claiming that the two projects will become the backbones of development in these areas.

Govt's claim on eco unrealistic, says Akhilesh

Lucknow (PNS): Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav on Saturday said the Uttar Pradesh government was only capable of "a trillion lies" and its claim of making the state's economy reach the USD 1 trillion target in the next four years was "impos-sible". In a post on X, Yadav alleged the Bharatiya Janata Party government was plagued with corruption, and said there were no tangible investments that have left the farmers, traders, businessmen and industrialists struggling.

"The deceased were identified as Rahul Kumar (25), Vinay Sharma (27), Akash (22) and Gopal (24). All of them were killed on the spot.

Police seized the truck but its driver remains at large and efforts are on to arrest him. In a separate incident, two women were killed and three people injured when a tractor collided with an autorickshaw in Agra, police said on Saturday.

The victims were returning from Bateshwar when the accident took place in the Pinhat police station area on Friday night.

on the next assembly elections," the SP chief said. He added that the public has understood why the BJP never speaks the truth. Lies and loot are its only mission and it has no vision for development.



e-rickshaw driver's body found in river

Lucknow (PNS): A day after the body of e-rickshaw driver Himanshu was recovered from the Gomti river, his family's anger erupted on Saturday, leading to a protest. The family blocked the 1090 Crossing Road near Balu Adda, placing the body there. Samajwadi Party MLA Ravidas Mehrotra joined the protest, express-ing solidarity with the grieving family.

The protesters demanded the arrest of Himanshu's wife, Payal, and her lover, Ayush, accusing them of murder. After a brief discussion with police, the family agreed to proceed with the last rites. Mehrotra, who arrived after hearing about the disturbance, promised to ensure justice for the family and criticised the police for not acting sooner. He expressed regret that the police had failed to take timely action while the family had been searching for Himanshu for several days. The police assured the family that the suspects would be arrested soon. According to sources, Payal and Ayush have been taken into custody for questioning. Himanshu's sister, Rita Sonkar, alleged that while the family was desperately searching for Himanshu, Payal had been in frequent contact with Ayush, raising suspicions.

Rita called for the police to check their mobile records to uncover the truth and suggested that other individuals may also be involved in the crime.Himanshu, 27, a resident of Balu Adda, was found dead in the Gomti river near Hanumant Dham Gomti river near Hanumant Dham on Friday evening. The Wazirganj police recovered his body with the help of divers and sent it for post-mortem. In her preliminary question-ing, Payal stated that Himanshu had left the house on January 21 after receiving a phone call. She claimed the last GPS location showed his e-rick-shaw near Hanumant Dham Payal shaw near Hanumant Dham. Payal has accused an LMC employee from Kaiserbagh and his friends of killing Himanshu and throwing his body in the river.Himanshu and Payal had a love marriage in 2018, and it was later revealed that Payal and the LMC employee had previously planned to murder Himanshu. However, the plan was exposed, and Himanshu persuaded Payal to abandon it.

76th Republic Day 2025: unveil military might and cultural richnes

India is set to showcase its mil-Litary prowess and rich cultural heritage and display a symbolic confluence of 'virasat' and 'vikas' on Kartavya Path here to mark the 76th Republic Day on January 26 when the nation will also commemorate the platinum jubilee of the enactment of the Constitution.

Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto will be the chief guest on the occasion. A 352-member on the occasion. A 552-member marching and band contingent from Indonesia will be partici-pating in the parade. Subianto will be the fourth Indonesian president to attend India's Republic Day celebra

India's Republic Day celebrations. Sukarno, the first president of Indonesia, was the chief guest at India's first Republic Day celebrations in 1950.

While 75 years of the Constitution is the focus of celebrations this year, the theme for the tableaux is 'Swarnim Bharat: Virasat aur Vikas'.

Sixteen tableaux from across states and Union Territories and 15 from central ministries, departments and organisations will roll down the ceremonial boulevard on Sunday.

The country will display its military prowess by showcasing

some of the cutting-edge defence platforms including BrahMos, Pinaka and Akash, with the Army's Battle Surveillance System 'Sanjay' and DRDO's surface-to-surface tactical missile 'Pralay' set to register their presence in the ceremonial parade for the first time.

T-90 'Bhishma' tanks Sarath (infantry carrying vehicle BMP-II), Short Span Bridging System 10m, Nag Missile System, multibarrel rocket launcher system 'Agnibaan' and 'Bajrang' (light specialist vehicle) will also be part of the parade, officials said on Thursday.

The parade will see many other firsts as well, such as the tri-services tableau that will depict the spirit of "iointness" among the armed forces.

The tableau would display a battlefield scenario demonstrating synchronised operation in land, water and air with the indigenous Arjun battle tank, Tejas fighter aircraft and advanced light helicopter, according to the Defence Ministry.

CCPA imposes ₹3 Lakh penalty on Vision IAS for misleading UPSC exam advertisements

The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has imposed a penalty of Rs 3 lakh on Vision IAS for deceptive advertising about its students' success in the civil services examination. The authority found that Vision IAS deliberately withheld specific course information, creating a misleading impression about its success rates in such exams, a statement by Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution said. The institute's advertisement claimed "10 in Top 10 selections in CSE 2020 from various programs of Vision IAS" and prominently displayed successful candidates and pictures. Vision IAS mentioned the course opted by AIR 1- UPSC CSE 2020 i.e. GS Foundation Batch Classroom Student but



deliberately concealed information regarding the courses chosen by the other nine successful candidates. This concealment created mis-

leading impression that the remaining nine candidates were profiles and fee receipts subalso enrolled in the 'GS mitted by Vision IAS and dis-Foundation Batch Classroom covered that the Foundation Student' course which was not course is the most expensive,

mock test costs only Rs 750. As per the available information, Rank 1 enrolled in the Foundation Course 2018 (Classroom/Offline), and Rank 8 enrolled in the Online Foundation Course 2015 of the Institute. Additionally, Rank 4 and Rank 9 of UPSC CSE 2020 enrolled in Abhyaas test, a mock test for the Prelims exam. Rank 6 enrolled in the GS Prelims Test Series. This implies that the abovementioned candidates cleared the Mains and Interview stages on their own, without any contribution of opposite party. By deliberately concealing about the specific course opted by each of the successful candidates, the Vision IAS made it look like all the courses offered by it had the same success rate for the consumers, which was not right. These facts are important for the potential students to decide on the courses that may be suitable for them and should not have been concealed in the adver-

tisement. CCPA has observed

that several coaching institutes use the same successful candidate's names and photographs in their advertisements while deliberately concealing important information about specific course opted by them to create a deception that the successful candidates were regular classroom students at coaching institute or were students of several courses offered in the advertisement.

The commission imposed a penalty to protect "young and impressionable aspirants" from potentially deceptive marketing practices, the statement said The CCPA has so far issued 46 notices to various coaching institutes for misleading advertisements and unfair trade practice. It has imposed a penalty of Rs 74.60 lakh on 23 coaching institutes and directed them to discontinue the misleading advertisements

In his petition to the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), Raman Sharma sought the statutory body's intervention to ensure "justice, relief and proactive measures to safeguard the rights and dignity of citizens in vulnerable areas".

17 people, including 13 children, died under mysterious circumstances in Badhaal village

plained of fever, pain, intense sweating, nausea and loss of

consciousness before dying within days of their admission

to hospitals. Investigations and samples collected empirically indicated the incidents were not due to a communicable disease of bac-

terial or viral origin and that there was no public health angle, prompting police to set up a Special Investigation Team (SIT) after certain neurotoxins were found in the samples of the deceased. A central inter-ministerial team has also joined the multi-agency probe to unravel the mystery behind the deaths.

has been functioning makes a mockery of the Constitution and is an insult to the voters themselves.

'Today has been celebrated as National Voters Day since 2011 to mark the day on which the Election Commission came into being 75 years ago on Jan 25th, 1950," he noted. The Election Commission is a Constitutional body and its first Chairman was the legendary Sukumar Sen whose role in establishing the foundations of our electoral democracy was crucial, Ramesh said. "He was the sole Chief Election Commissioner for eight years. His 'Report on the First General Elections in India 1951-52' is a classic. But the preparations of the draft electoral roll for the first elections had been completed before Sen took over," he said.

four captive female Israeli soldiers to the Red Cross in Gaza City on Saturday after parading them in front of a crowd. Israel followed with the release of 200 Palestinian prisoners or detainees as part of the fragile ceasefire in the Gaza Strip. The four Israeli soldiers smiled

broadly as they waved and gave the thumbs-up from a stage in Gaza City's Palestine Square, militants on either side of them and a crowd of thousands watching before they were led off to waiting Red Cross vehicles.

They were likely acting under duress, with previously released hostages saying they were held in brutal conditions and forced to record propaganda videos. Israel's Prison Service later said it had completed the release of 200 Palestinians. They include 120 who had been serving life Palestinians to begin returning

sentences after being convicted of deadly attacks against Israelis. Around 70 were released into Egypt, according to Egypt's state-run Qahera TV. Egypt had served as a key mediator in the talks that led to the truce.

Later, buses carrying the remainder of the 200 Palestinian prisoners being released made their way from Ofer prison in the occupied West Bank toward Jerusalem and the city of Ramallah, where crowds of relatives and supporters awaited.

As the four Israeli soldiers were released, hundreds of people cheered in Tel Aviv's Hostages Square where they were watching the drama unfold on a big screen televi-sion. "I'm speechless," said Aviv Bercovich, one of the onlookers. "I had goosebumps watching them. I just want the war to end.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office later released a video showing the freed hostages being welcomed at an Israeli army base. One of them, Liri Albag, smiled, gave two thumbs up and made a heart shape with her hand before getting into a van.

Israel insists on the release of a civilian hostage: Netanyahu's office later said that Arbel Yehoud, a civilian hostage held by Hamas, was supposed to have been released on Saturday. It said Israel would not allow

to northern Gaza, which had been expected to begin by Sunday, until she is freed. A senior Hamas official said the group has informed mediators that Yehoud will be released next week.

Meantime, an Egyptian official involved in the negotiations called the matter a "minor issue" that mediators are working to resolve. Both officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorised to discuss the matter publicly.

The crowds in Tel Aviv and also in Gaza City began gathering early in the day in anticipation of the second such exchange between Israel and Hamas since a ceasefire began in the Gaza Strip last weekend. The excitement in Israel was palpable, with TV stations filled with live reports from smiling news anchors and reporters interviewing ecstatic friends and relatives of the hostages. The truce is aimed at winding

down the deadliest and most destructive war ever fought between Israel and the militant group. The fragile deal has so far held, quieting airstrikes and rockets and allowing for increased aid to flow into the

hen I first heard that Shailesh Lodha was making his debut on the theatre stage in Dad's Girlfriend, I was intrigued. Known for his wit and charming

presence on television, particularly for his role in Taarak Mehta Ka Ooltah Chashmah, Lodha's transition to theatre seemed like an exciting challenge. His comedic timing and subtle humour have made him a household name, but how would

have made him a household name, but how would that translate to the stage, where the dynamics are different and every performance is live? Lodha brings a grounded yet comedic presence to Animesh, capturing his complexity with both humour and a hint of vulnerability. what stands out is how the character develops, revealing deeper layers of insecurity and

Their interactions bring a mix of comedy and conflict, creating a dynamic that keeps the audience engaged. Under the direction of Atul Satya Koushik, Dad's

Girlfriend strikes a balance between humour and emotional depth. The play effectively captures the complexities of family relationships, the generational gaps that often create misunderstandings, and the awkward yet beautiful ways love can play out in the midst of it all. It's not a light-hearted farce; instead, it offers a deeper reflection on how we navigate family bonds, often balancing humour and pain.

What I found most striking about the performance was how humour blended with



moments of genuine emotional depth. The comedy is sharp, but it's the emotional weight of the story that stays with you. It's a reminder that, despite the challenges and complexities of relationships, the desire to reconnect and understand each other remains at the heart of family dynamics. The actors, especially Lodha, deliver performances that are both engaging and thought-provoking, making *Dad's Girlfriend* a memorable experience for anyone who's ever tried to bridge the gap between love, laughter, and the misunderstandings that come with it. As the curtain fell and the audience slowly made

their way out, there was one thing on everyone's mind, *Dad's Girlfriend* is a reminder that life, like theatre, is full of unexpected twists, laughs and theatre, is full of unexpected twists, laughs and those cringe-worthy moments that we can't help but love. After all, if you can survive family drama, flirtations and a father-in-law with a slightly over-the-top personality, you can survive anything! It left me thinking, maybe we should all take a page from *Animesh's* book and learn to laugh at the absurdity of life.



QUIETER BUT IMPACTFUL SEASON

Jaideep Ahlawat returns to the world of *Paatal Lok* in a more sombre way, yet the season remains compelling, says **ABHI SINGHAL**



aking away all the popularity even in the pandemic era, Pataal Lok has shined with its first season making the audience giving a reaction of great, awesome and what not. The second season of Sudip Sharma's Paatal Lok, a multilayered crime drama that builds upon its predecessor is back. This season takes a more subdued and contemplative approach making its shape deeply into the human condition, the nature of violence, and the brittle links that bind individuals and communities together. All this is showcased in contrast to the first season's plot on caste, class, and corruption.

Jonathan Thom, a well-known Nagaland leader, was shockingly assassinated in Delhi at the start of the story. His ruthless murder starts a series of events that jeopardise peace negotiations in Nagaland. Inspector Hathi Ram Chaudhary, played expertly by Jaideep Ahlawat, is drawn into a web of political plots and personal grudges as a result of the


crime. In order to track down a strange woman named Rose Lizo (Merenla Imsong), whose existence connects several story threads, Hathi Ram and his former coworker Ansari (Ishwak Singh) work to catch her.

Paatal Lok Season 2 chooses a slowburning plot that puts character development and emotional resonance first, in contrast to the previous season's relentless pacing and incisive societal satire. In addition to examining issues of trauma, sorrow, and the cyclical nature of violence, *Sharma*'s writing digs deeply into the emotional lives of its protagonists.

Hathi Ram Chaudhary remains the emotional core of the series. Jaideep Ahlawat delivers a powerhouse performance, portraying the world-weary inspector with the same grit and vulnerability that made him a standout in the first season. This time, Hathi Ram is not just chasing criminals but grappling with his own insecurities as a father and a man. His interactions with Ansari, now

successful IPS officer, form one of the show's most poignant arcs with themes of fellowship, professional jealousy, and unspoken respect.

Additionally, *Sharma* defies the standard police procedural rules. The genre gives depth and dignity to side characters, who are sometimes reduced to mere story gadgets. Every



subplot enhances the overall story, from Rose's heartbreaking search for comfort to Meghna Barua's played by Tillotama Shome, battle to be accepted as an Assamese woman in a system that is controlled by men.

Director Avinash cinematography captures the duality of Paatal Lok: the grimy chaos of Delhi and the landscapes of Nagaland. The visuals serve as more than just backdrops; they echo the themes of division and alienation that permeate the story. The action sequences are tightly choreographed serving only justice to the story rather

than overshadowing it. The writing, too, deserves special mention for its ability to balance the personal and the political. While the first season was a hammer blow to societal structures, this season is more of a scalpel, dissecting issues like the or a scaipel, dissecting issues like the migrant crisis, unemployment, and the fragile peace in conflict-ridden regions. *Abhishek Banerjee*, who played *Hathoda Tyagi* in a killer Season 1, has also written two

Ahlawat is, as expected, a tour de force, but it's the supporting cast that truly elevates this season. *Tillotama* Shome delivers a nuanced performance as Meghna, a character Arun's

who challenges both societal and viewer biases. Merenla Imsong's Rose is hauntingly tragic, while Nagesh Kukunoor's turn as a shadowy bureaucrat adds a layer of intrigue. *Paatal Lok Season 2* is a long-form narrative accomplishment. It may not have the same initial effect as the first season, but it makes up for it with a deeper, more complex examination of its subjects. Every character, no matter how small, feels real in *Sudip* Sharma's world, and every violent act has significance and repercussions. The series offers a moving reflection on the human cost of cruelty and the fading prospect of forgiveness, and it requires patient but rewards it abundantly.

Australian Open: Keys upsets Sabalenka in women's final for first Grand Slam title

adison Keys of the United States upset two-time defending champion Aryna Sabalenka of Belarus 6-3, 2-6, 7-5 in the Australian Open final on Saturday night to collect her first Grand Slam title at age 29. By adding this win over the No. 1ranked Sabalenka to an elimination of No. 2 Iga Swiatek in the semifinals on Thursday — saving a match point along the way — Keys is the first woman

since Serena Williams in 2005 to defeat both of the WTA's top two players at Melbourne Park. Keys, ranked 14th and seeded

19th, was playing in her second major final after being the runner-up at the 2017 U.S. Open. She prevented Sabalenka from

earning what would have been her third women's trophy in a row at the Australian Open — something last accomplished by Martina Hingis from 1997-99 — and her fourth major title overall.

When it ended, Keys covered her

face with her hands, then raised her arms. Soon, she was hugging her husband, Bjorn Fratangelo – who has been her coach since 2023 - and other members of her team, before sitting on her sideline

bench and laughing. Sabalenka chucked her racket afterward, then covered her head with a white towel. The men's final is Sunday, with

defending champion Jannik Sinner against Alexander Zverev. Sinner is seeded No. 1, Zverev No.

Sinner eliminated American Ben Shelton in the semifinals, while Zverev advanced when 24-time Grand Slam champion Novak Djokovic stopped playing because of an injury.

Keys is the oldest woman to become a first-time major champion since Flavia Pennetta was 33 at the 2015 U.S. Open. This was the 46th Slam appearance for Keys, which ranks as the thirdmost major tournaments before winning a trophy in the Open era, behind only Pennetta's 49 and Marion Bartoli's 47 when she won



Wimbledon in 2013. It was the more accomplished Sabalenka who was shakier at the outset. Keys broke three times in

Arshdeep's T20I record in 2024 further underscores his dominance – 36 wickets in 18 matches at an average of 15.31 and an economy rate of 7.49. His strike rate of 10.80 was a testament to his wicket-taking prowess, especially given his challenging role in the powerplay and at the death. Only four players in the world took more T20I wickets than

Hasaranga (38), UAE's Junaid Siddique (40) and Hong Kong's Ehsan Khan (46) – with all four playing more matches. Of those bowlers, only Hasaranga featured for a full-member nation.

His best figures of the year, 4/9, came against the USA during the World Cup group stage, a performance emblematic of his brilliance on varied surfaces.

With 97 scalps, Arshdeep is now the highest wicket-taker in the format for India. Since his international debut in 2022, Arshdeep has steadily

It's not often that a man is able to follow up his first Grand Slam title by repeating as the champion at the same tournament a year later, which is what Jannik Sinner will be trying to do Sunday when he faces Alexander Zverev in the Australian Open final.

The last time it happened was nearly 20 years ago: Rafael Nadal accomplished that sort of repeat at the 2005 and 2006 French Opens. He turned out OK.

For the No. 1-ranked Sinner, the past year also included the doping case that is still unresolved. He tested positive for a trace amount of an anabolic steroid twice in March, which didn't become public until his exoneration was announced shortly before the start of play at the U.S. Open — which he won. There is a hearing in the World Anti-Doping Agency's appeal scheduled in April.

'He finds playing tennis matches to be his safe place. That's where he can go and do his thing and feel like this is what he knows, this is what he understands, what is what he's good at. It become a home for him to step on to the court and play tennis," said one of Sinner's two coaches, Darren Cahill, who will leave the team after this season.

'There's been a lot of pressure around him for the last nine months now, since April last year. He deals with it as well as anybody that I've ever seen deal with pressure," Cahill said.
