Funding Opportunity Announcement for the Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program (HVRP): Reintegrating homeless veterans into meaningful employment and addressing the complex problems facing homeless veterans.

WHAT IT DOES

HVRP is an employment-focused competitive grant program designed to enable America's veterans who are experiencing homelessness, or at risk of becoming homeless, to reach their full employment potential and obtain high-quality career outcomes. Successful grant applicants must explain in their grant application the complex employment-related needs and support services necessary to assist eligible veterans in their service area in obtaining good jobs through direct services and/or a robust referral system, as well as explain the tools, resources, and partnerships in place to identify, recruit, support, and prepare these individuals to find meaningful and sustainable employment.

THE GOALS OF THE GRANT PROGRAM ARE TO:

- Provide career exploration, training, placement, and supportive services to veterans experiencing or at risk of homelessness, empowering them to secure good jobs in stable, high-demand occupations paying livable wages.
- Establish strong partnerships between public, private, and nonprofit organizations, especially those that employ and partner with veterans who have experienced homelessness, to deliver equitable services to marginalized veterans experiencing or at risk of homelessness to assist in overcoming barriers to employment.

WHO IT SERVES

- Veterans experiencing or at risk of homelessness
- Homeless women veterans and homeless veterans with children
- Justice-involved veterans

WHO CAN APPLY

- Nonprofit organizations with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS
- For profit organizations
- Faith-based organizations
- Small businesses
- Federally recognized Native American tribal governments
- Native American tribal organizations (other than Federally recognized tribal governments)
- State, county, city, township, or special district governments, including U.S. Territories or Possessions
- State and Local Workforce Development Boards (SWDB/LWDB) established under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)
- Public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities
- Other state and local government agencies
- Public, private and state-controlled institutions of higher education
