Priorities for 2022

Thematic focus on Road Transport

- Approaches other than penal sanctions, to seek compliance with road transport rules as well as other risk assessment solutions in the road transport sector;
- Practices enhancing cooperation between Member States and their national contact points;
- Initiatives relating to the implementation of the classification of serious infringements.

Thematic focus on Seasonal Work

- Good practices related to information provision on seasonal workers' rights and entitlements derived from EU level regulation on labour mobility (focus on agriculture and tourism), targeting workers and employers in both sending and receiving countries;
- Innovative digital solutions or comprehensive practices accompanying workers and employers from pre- to post-recruitment across borders;
- Measures that do not directly target workers and employers but aim to facilitate exchange among institutional actors related to information provision to the end-users in seasonal work.
