Mt. Hebron High School has earned a stellar reputation for excellence in academic achievement, athletics, the performing arts, and in various national rankings. Mt. Hebron maintains a respectful, safe, and inclusive environment while providing a high-quality education with a holistic approach. Graduates of Mt. Hebron are lifelong learners who will make a positive impact on society as responsible, inclusive, global citizens.

The school offers a rigorous academic program that includes over 30 Advanced Placement courses in core academic subjects and elective disciplines. Students participated in 1,422 AP exams in Spring 2022 and 123 students participated in the Dual Enrollment program to earn college credit. As a result of this high amount of college preparation, Mt. Hebron ranks 5th for total SAT scores of public high schools in greater Baltimore.

Mt. Hebron offers an array of programs to meet the needs of our culturally diverse student population, including 13 honor societies that support a wide range of academic strengths of the students. The Gifted and Talented Mentor Program allows students to pursue special interests through independent research and mentorships. Programs are in place to support students through special education services. Mt. Hebron has a thriving academic tutorial support program that spans multiple disciplines through the Beyond School Hours Program. The school has a dynamic program for Multilingual Learners. Students who have additional needs are supported in an alternative learning program, Pathways to Success.

Mt. Hebron's tradition in excellence continues in extracurricular and co-curricular activities. Students participate in over 100 clubs and a full range of extracurricular activities under the direction of an Athletics and Activities Manager. These include varsity, junior varsity, and allied sports in the fall, winter, and spring seasons, the award winning Marching Band, The Cavaliers (vocal ensemble), Dance Team (Lancers), National Economics Champions, First Robotics, mock trial, speech and debate, and the historic Girl's Lacrosse program – 7 National Championships, 15 State Championships, and a 103 game win streak.

Mt. Hebron strives to ignite a life-long desire to learn and to provide opportunities for students to experience a well-rounded education.
