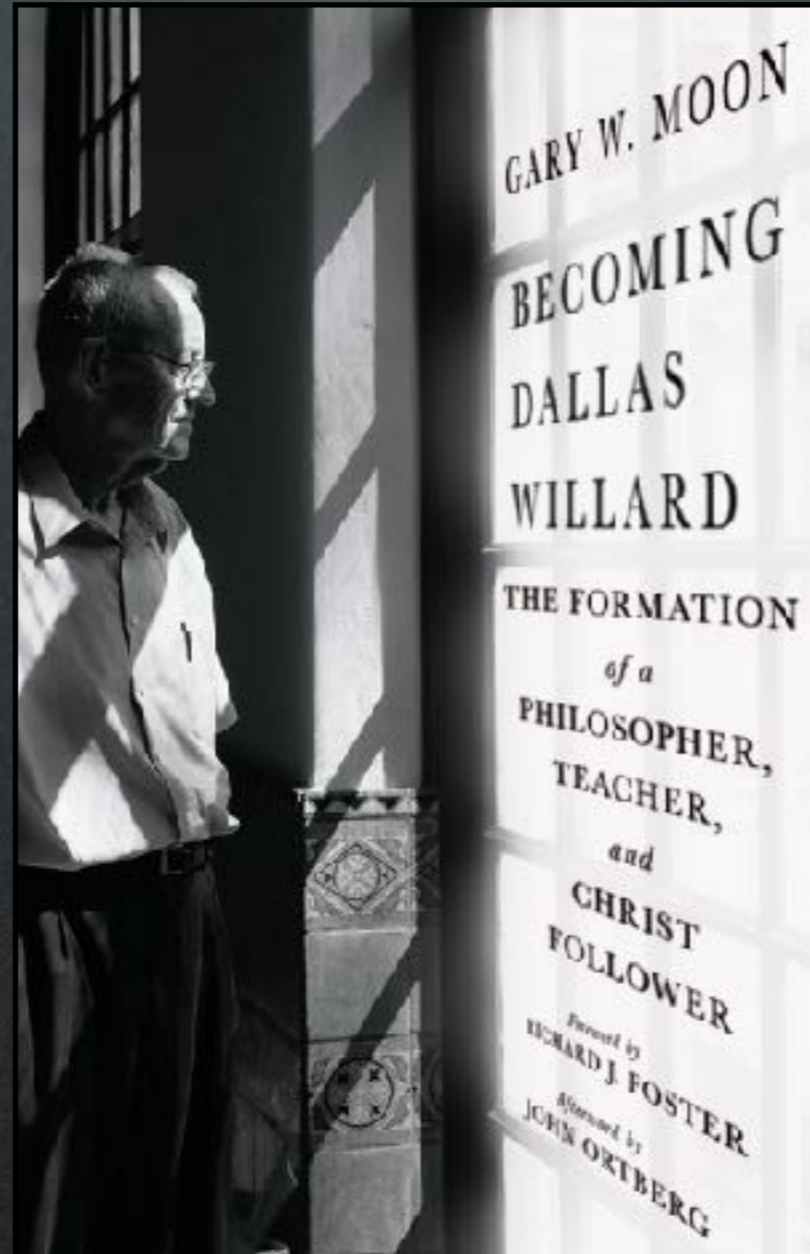

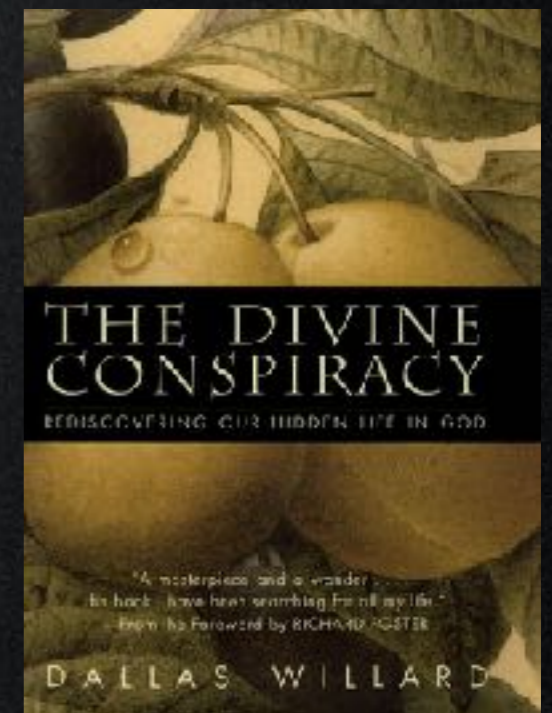
## SESSION 7 REVIEW - BECOMING DALLAS WILLARD

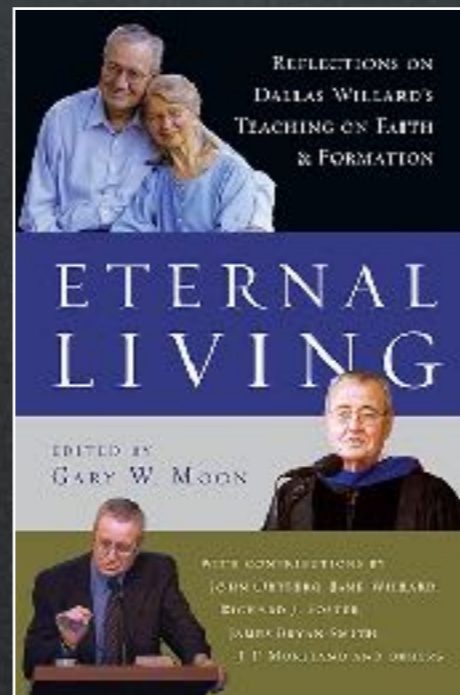

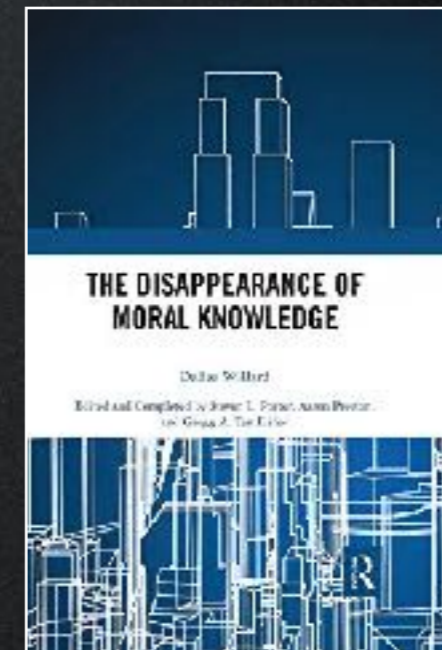


## **A Gathering in Washington, D.C.**

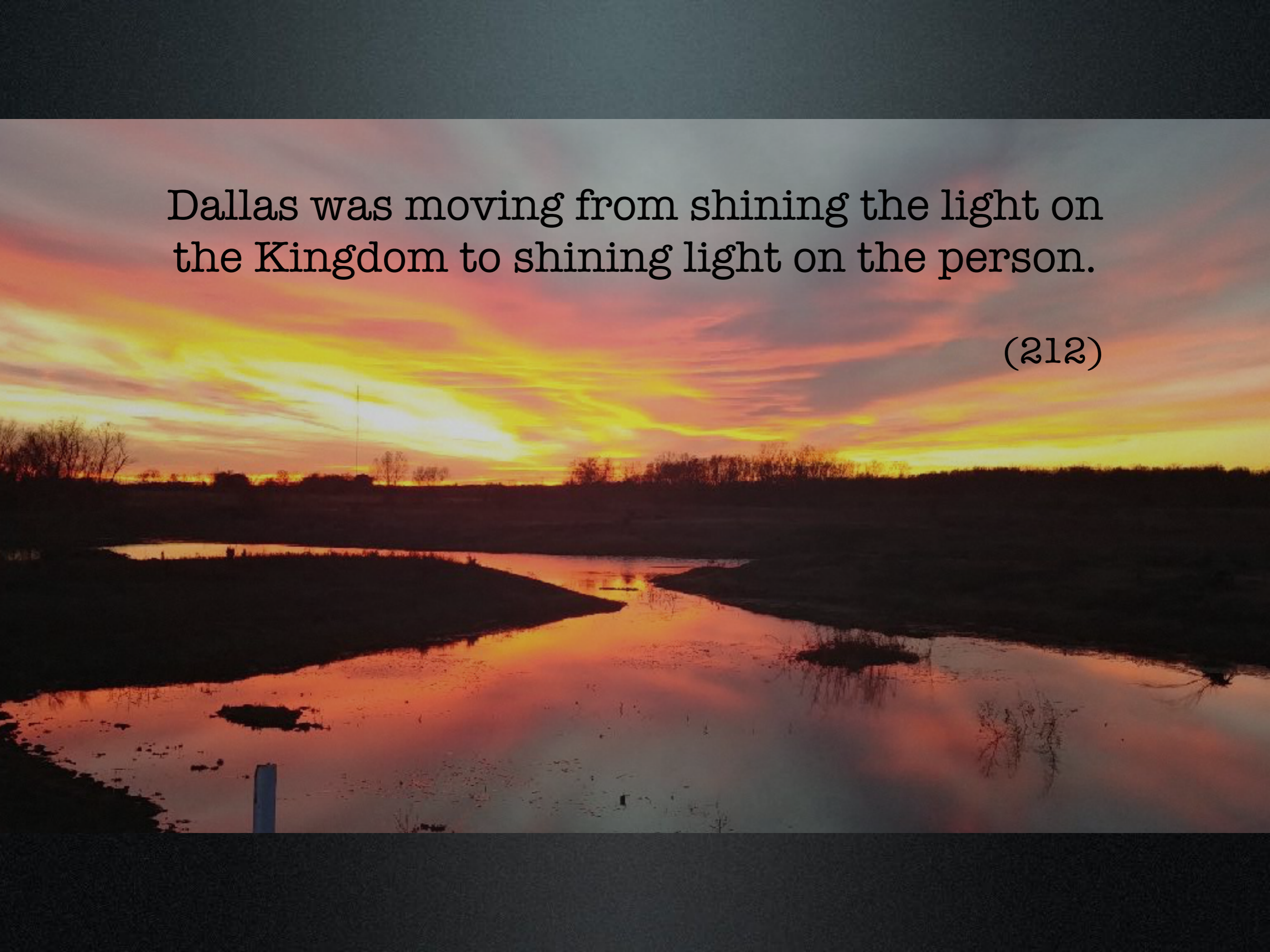

In 1998, with *The Divine Conspiracy* in the hands of the publisher, now life can get back to normal.

Then Dallas taught...

*"In the university, there is no such thing as moral knowledge."*

Jane was moved to tears that a book had to be written on this information and Dallas was the one who had to write it. That would be his next book...considered by many to be his magnum opus project.

That was the plan. The problem was,  
Dallas found it hard to turn requests down.



*Renovation of the Heart* took two years to write.

It became Jane's favorite book with chapters 6 & 7 as her favorite chapters.

Two things for which Dallas wanted his listeners to have a compelling vision: the Kingdom of God and how persons are specifically designed to experience the abundant life of the Kingdom.

*Renovation of the Heart* would offer understanding concerning how to bring the various aspects of the human self (thinking, feeling, behaving, relating, and choosing) under God's reign, into the Kingdom to experience life in full.

Theology and Psychology came together in Dallas.

## *Renovation of the Heart* (continued)

Jesus, a member of the creative team (the Trinity) that designed human beings, might actually know a thing or two about optimal human functioning. Jesus is both present and really smart. And Jesus had excellent answers to the 4 questions human have wrestled with for 1000's of years.

What is (ultimate) reality?

*God and His Kingdom*

Who is well off?

*Anyone alive in the Kingdom interactively engaged with the Trinity*

Who is a really good person?

*Anyone pervaded with love*

How does one become a genuinely good person?

*Place your confidence in Jesus and become His apprentice*

Beloved Professor of Philosophy (1965-2012)

“You cannot ‘opt out’ of having a worldview.

You can only try to have one that most accords with reality,  
including the whole realm of facts concerning what is genuinely good.

The four questions any worldview must answer are:

What is reality?

Who is well-off?

Who is truly a good person?

How does one become a truly good person?

In modern psychology, those who continued to talk about invisible things became progressively marginalized. In the new world of psychology, if you can't see and measure it, it does not exist.

In *Renovation of the Heart*, Dallas offered a great gift to the discipline of psychology (literally soul-ology). Modern psychology was all but ignoring the invisible components of the person, spirit (heart and will) and soul.

Dallas' anthropological work was a most welcome addition to the field.

In 1995, the first conference was held under "Soul Care".

*Renovation of the Heart* was to provide a clearer and more precise understanding of the various dimensions of the human self (thought, emotion, behavior, relationship, volition and soul) and interpretation of the process for bringing each of these various aspects of the person under God's reign.

Real change of character is possible.

This requires a transformation of the heart from being radically evil to radically good.

There was a psychology before the birth of modern psychology, that the invisible parts of the person, (soul, spirit, mind) are vital to well being, and that Dr. Jesus was at hand and accepting new patients.

## Jesus Had the Best Answers

He hoped *The Disappearance of Moral Knowledge* would fire the same type of shot across the bow for the university that *The Divine Conspiracy* sounded for the church. (224)

The universities and other transmitters of culture no longer believed in the possibility of moral knowledge and hence no longer held moral passions to rational scrutiny. But he did believe in our need to recover a lost sense that moral progress, through the advancement of moral knowledge, is possible.

His spin-off work *Knowing Christ Today*, 2009, built a case for bringing Jesus in as a source of exquisite-knowledge, and for pastors to to earn the right to teach by virtue of their living in a knowing relationship with Jesus.

Dallas knew we cannot bring Jesus in as an authority as long as people don't believe it is possible for there to be an authority.

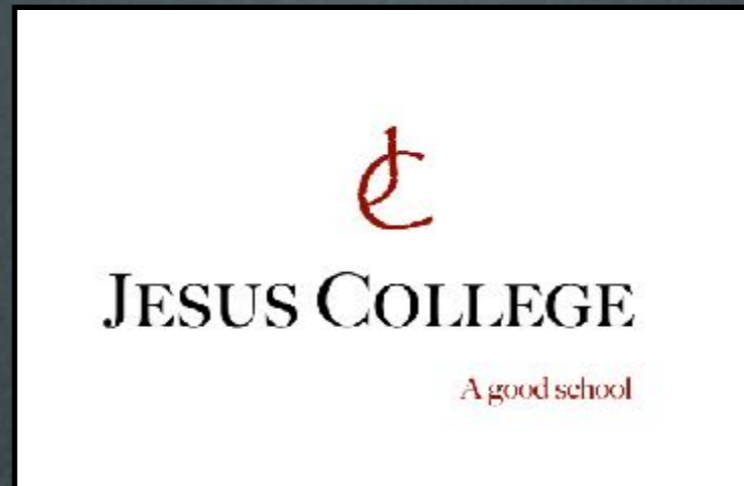
