Do I really want to "bear all things?"



SELF-WILL



SELF-WILL

I must have my way no matter what!

Look back down to history. Go all the way back to the Garden of Eden and when you look at all of the calamities that befall people, and you're looking to families, which is the primary source of continued human brokenness — the family.

But "will" is a good thing. God gave it to us.

The Will — Our capacity to bring things about to initiate courses of actions and events that bring things about.

God created us as creators.

The will of individuals and groups to get what they want, regardless of what it does to others, is what continually destroys life.

SELF-WILL & Brokenness

We live in a world of disappointment, insufficiency, injury and hurt, mental, emotional, physical and social, with scarred and dysfunctional, painful souls and bodies.

One of the saddest things is what happens to children in this world, and it's universal. It takes different forms in different places, but children have to come to terms with the reality of the world they live in.




Jesus was very stern about this. He said,

"If you offend a little child, it'd be better for you to have a millstone tied around your neck and thrown into the ocean." Matt. 18:6

Thank God somebody in the universe takes this seriously.

Jesus said,

"Their angels do always behold the face of my Father who is in heaven." (v. 10)



Healing Children from Brokenness

Children can escape the brokenness if they are welcomed in the presence of parents who are not themselves at the mercy of their brokenness and are able to make a place of love and generosity for the child.

Jesus wasn't just whistling dixie when he said,

"You have to repent and become like a little child, or you can not enter the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 18:3)

We need to give a lot of thought to that when we're talking about this kind of transformation.



The Four D's of Brokenness

Our lives are characterized by thoughts and feelings of:

DEFICIENCY — I won't quite do.

DESERTION — No one really cares about me. So I have to do everything I can to manage them.

DREAD - Tomorrow morning, work, sickness, aging.

DEATH - The end.



The Sufficiency of God Over Brokenness

One of the great gifts of healing that comes from Jesus is His assurance that those (we) who know Him and love His Word will never experience **death**.

And they (we) will never experience desertion.

And they (we) are sufficient in God.

And that there's really nothing to **dread**.

Do you believe that?

"I'm with you always." Matthew 28:20
"I will never leave you nor forsake you." Hebrews 13:5
"A city made without hands." Hebrews 13:14
"A Kingdom than can not be shaken." Hebrews 12:28

"If you really dread nothing because of your knowledge of God, well, then you're moving out of brokenness."

Healing of Brokenness through Discipleship

We really do want to recognize that just profession of faith in Jesus doesn't bring that. Can we be honest about that? There's no reason why it should. It was never meant to.

The healing of brokenness, overcoming the brokenness, comes from a path of discipleship to Jesus, not just faith in Him.

We have to recognize that we have a form of Christianity* today that accepts that, and says, "You can have faith in Christ and not change. You can have faith in Christ and not be a disciple." If you don't accept that discipleship, you certainly will not change because the change comes as a process of disciple.

What is a Disciple?

An Apprentice!

Please try to think about your faith in Jesus as confidence in him.

...not just something He did or something He said, you have confidence in Him, then you believe He's right. You believe what He does is good and you want to be in on it.

So, everything He said, and everything He did, that says, "Wow, I want to learn how to do that."

Like an apprentice in the plumbing trade.

Who knows how not to envy — resentment of someone who has what you don't? Someone who has learned how. It's a deprived person who has trouble with envy.

Like the Pharisees who envied the love of people for Jesus.

The Problem of Taking Charge of Our Lives

We see ourselves forced to take charge of our life and world in whatever way we can resulting in further injuries and disappointments to ourselves and others.

Satan's Temptation to Eve...

"You better take charge because God is not going to look out for you. In fact, he's going to deprive you of something good."

Children go out into the world starting with young bullies at "recess" play time. It's the same story. We live in this broken world of people incapable of doing the good they

control

intend to do. The pattern we fall into...

- -> Moral failure
- -> Lack of peace, joy, contentment
- -> Little or no productivity of good

"For from within, out of the heart of men precede evil thoughts, fornication, theft, murder, adultery, deeds of coveting and wickedness, as well as deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride and foolishness." Mark 7:21-23

"For the flesh sets its desires against the Spirit and the Spirit against the flesh for these are in opposition to one another, so that you may not do the things you please."

Galatians 5:17

We Wind Up Hiding from People

Because of the brokenness, we develop a place to hide. Actually, it's in our bodies. One of the main things that our bodies allows us to do is to hide from others.



"God has given you one face and you make yourself another one." William Shakespeare, "Hamlet"

That's the picture of human brokenness. We want to recognize that God is always reaching out trying to find the human being in their brokenness. It's hard for us to believe somehow that He could actually love everyone, but He does.
