The **Indian Alcohol and Substance Abuse Program (IASAP)** supports American Indian and Alaska Native communities to plan and implement system-wide strategies that will reduce and control crime associated with the distribution and abuse of alcohol and controlled substances.

Forty tribes representing seventeen states have received federal grant awards to:

- develop a project advisory team;
- identify, apprehend, and prosecute those who illegally transport, distribute, and use alcohol and controlled substances;
- prevent and reduce the number of alcohol and substance abuse-related crimes, traffic fatalities, and injuries;
- develop and enhance collaborations with federal, state, tribal, and local criminal justice agencies;
- integrate tribal and non-tribal services for offenders and their families; and
- make available culturally appropriate treatment and other services.

Grantees form partnerships among law enforcement, the courts, treatment providers, and community members to effectively accomplish these goals. The **IASAP Fact Sheet** contains further information on the program.
