SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

At PS/MS 7, our academic program is challenging, rigorous and enriched by integrating the arts. Our partnership with Hunter College supports our music teacher by providing violin instruction to our elementary school students. An afterschool program through the "I Have A Dream" Foundation helps children with homework, provides instructional support, implements art projects, and takes our students on trips. Edible School Yard is a creative garden project that involves our entire school, Pre-kindergarten through grade eight. We have a rooftop garden, where each student plants, maintains tools, creates signs and grows healthy fruits and vegetables. In addition, we have a classroom dedicated to serving as a kitchen for healthy food preparation. It's an exciting year! The National Dance Institute works with our fourth and fifth grade students once a week which culminates with a gala dance performance for the students and their parents in the school.







NYSED Middle School Arts Guidelines and Requirements: This graph shows the percentage of 8th grade students in this school in June 2019 who have taken at least one half-unit in an arts discipline and a second half-unit in a different arts discipline over the course of 7th and 8th grade (one half-unit is the equivalent of approximately 55 hours of instruction by a licensed, certified arts teacher).
