SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

During the 2022-2023 school year, Aspirations Diploma Plus High School has worked closely with three educational partners to support our arts program in music and dance. In music, students were able to gain extensive skills in radio production, studio engineering, music editing, video production, and band through funding from the New York City Department of Youth and Community Development. Our students were afforded the opportunity to record their own musical lyrics and beats that expressed their emotions on topics close to them. As a transfer school, our students have encountered many obstacles, so music becomes a sense of release to get their voices heard. More importantly, these students worked with a producer who exposed them to the field of music production and gave them a sense of what it takes to make it in an industry where many have failed and succeeded. These students were provided the opportunity to visit other studios and record and edit their music. This exposure caused many of them to think seriously about pursuing a degree in music from college. In addition, we have a dance program which is funded by Victory Music and Dance Company that exposes our students to modern, jazz, contemporary, hip-hop, and African dances. The students who participate in this program are able to perform during schoolwide events on a monthly basis. Also, these students are able to take performing arts trips to other dance studios and participate in classes and work with people in the field. It is a great opportunity for our students to showcase their talents.




High School Arts Participation: The figure below shows the percentage of students participating in arts classes by grade and by arts discipline during the 2022-23 school year.
