

## SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

At PS 889, we value the arts as an integral part of a well-rounded education. Experiences in visual arts, music and theater are often what students remember most when looking back at their time in school. Painting, singing, creating animations, playing an instrument, being in a play – these experiences develop cognitive abilities, build self-esteem, teach cooperation and ignite an excitement for learning that carries over to other areas of study. Because PS 889 is a small school, our certified visual arts, music and theater teachers are part-time. Our goal is for all of our students to participate in a variety of art forms each year so we supplement our program through partnerships with a wide range of NYC arts organizations. These include the Brooklyn Conservatory of Music, Puppetry in Practice, Franklin Furnace Sequential Arts and NYC Ballet.


