#### SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Brooklyn Green School arts programming this year was varied and robust due to some wonderful partnerships made possible by our magnet grant. All students grade 6 - 8 received visual arts instruction. The 6th graders received visual arts four times a week, 7th graders twice a week and 8th graders once a week. A select group of 8th graders participated in an afterschool art portfolio prep for specialized high school auditions twice a week for the the first semester of the school year. All students were exposed to various media including: drawing, painting, printmaking, clay and found object sculpture and collage. We have a wonderful guitar club which has grown to now include keyboard, drumming and singing. Students meet during their lunchtime and after school three times a week with Internal Creations. This year students also participated in bi-weekly African dance classes provided by Ifetayo Cultural Collective. This year we have a new partnership with Magic Box Productions in which all 6th graders have created stop motion films based on environmental concerns. They will be premiering their films at our arts festival. As our school continues to grow, we look forward to offering more arts classes in the regular school day.







#### SCHOOL PROGRESS IN MEETING NEW YORK STATE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS


