SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In the visual arts class, students participate in an arts curriculum that helps them understand how material, technique and process are used to create works of art. Students learn through object-based inquiry. Discussions in the classroom and during museum visits deepen critical-thinking skills and enhance classroom curriculum. Resources such as artmaking supplies, and electronic devices with museum apps, help students become familiar with a variety of different art forms and hone their ability to observe and discuss their own artwork and the works of others. The program is enhanced with regular museum visits and a year-round calendar of exhibitions displaying students' work. In theater, Pre-K and Kindergarten students activate and use their imagination through creative drama activities and storytelling. First graders explore ensemble acting and memorization techniques through participatory stories from diverse cultures. Second graders develop the actors' instruments: voice, body, and mind while participating in play productions. Third and fourth graders engage in complex acting settings such as full-length rehearsals or scene work to explore theatermaking processes through various roles: actor, director, designer, spectator, and critic. Dual language students in fourth grade are trained in Jacques Lecoq's Pantomime for Actors Technique, which prepares them for the experimental theater course in fifth grade. Other classes focus on acting and musical theater.


