SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

At Public School 115, our principal goal is to provide quality education in the arts for all students. Access to the arts is an integral part of their educational experience, helping them grow as learners and citizens. The arts have assisted in the healing process as our students re-enter their more traditional academic and social lives. In our efforts to provide meaningful and effective education, our educators have managed new instructional delivery systems utilizing more technology in the creative process. The students are encouraged to explore diverse media and materials. We use technology to reduce reliance on face-to-face interactions and provide students with enhanced artmaking and expressive experiences in the visual arts. Technology has also supported the creation of high-quality learning materials and artistic experiences. Furthermore, it promotes creative thinking during problem-solving when collaborating with peers. We have expanded our music program and extended it beyond regular school hours. Students can participate in our afterschool violin program. Our partnership with Ajna Dance provides our students with lessons and exposes them to the Indian culture. At P.S. 115, students have access to arts education during in-person, hybrid, and remote learning. We are designing lessons connecting students to the real world and enhancing individual student culture.


