SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Our three arts teachers use their professional knowledge and experience in visual arts, music and dance, to introduce our students to the wide world of the arts. They support students to learn, appreciate and gain knowledge in visual arts, dance and music. Students receive individual attention from each teacher, participate in hands-on activities in each area, engage in small group discussions, and assess each other's work. Small class size has a beneficial impact on students' learning in the arts. Students have the opportunity to visit museums and art exhibitions, attend concerts and movies, participate in performances and have their work displayed in art exhibitions.







NYSED Middle School Arts Guidelines and Requirements: This graph shows the percentage of 8th grade students in this school in June 2023 who have taken at least one half-unit in an arts discipline and a second half-unit in a different arts discipline over the course of 7th and 8th grade (one half-unit is the equivalent of approximately 55 hours of instruction by a licensed, certified arts teacher).
