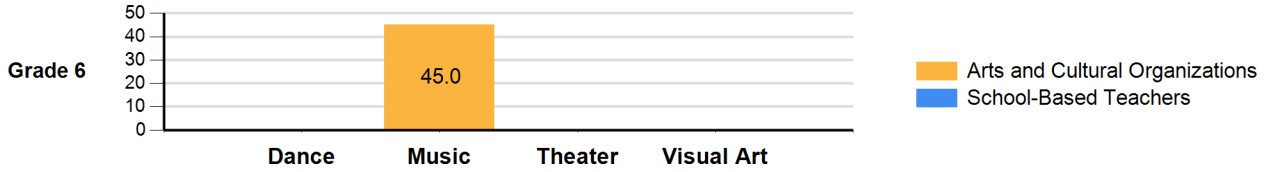

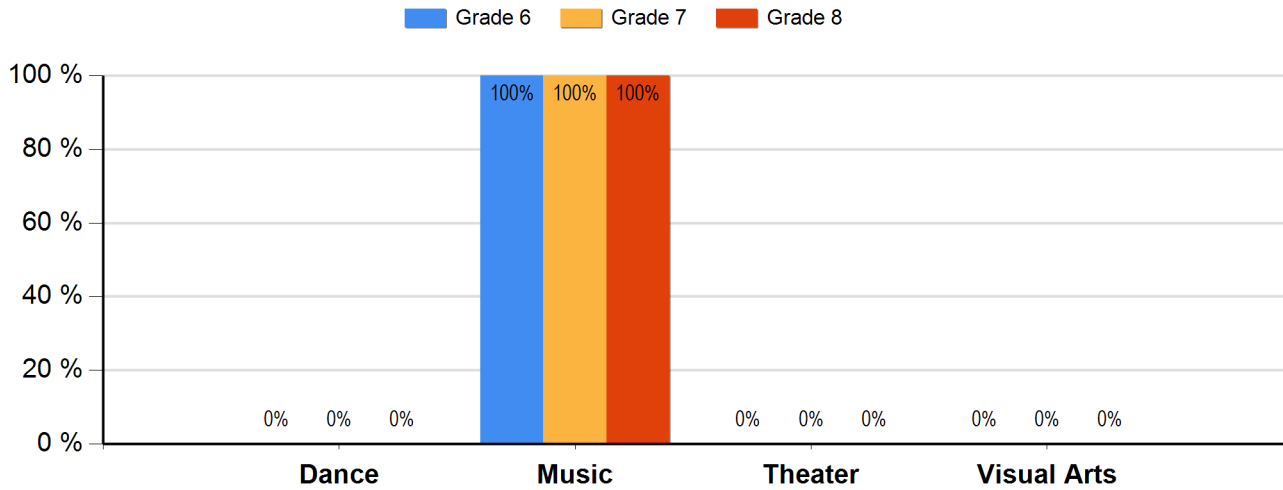
SCHOOL PROGRESS IN MEETING NEW YORK STATE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

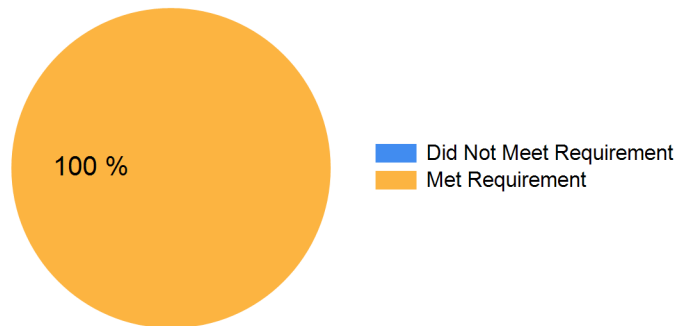
† "School-based teacher" may include: classroom teachers, certified specialists, or cluster teachers not certified in the arts who are assigned to provide arts instruction.



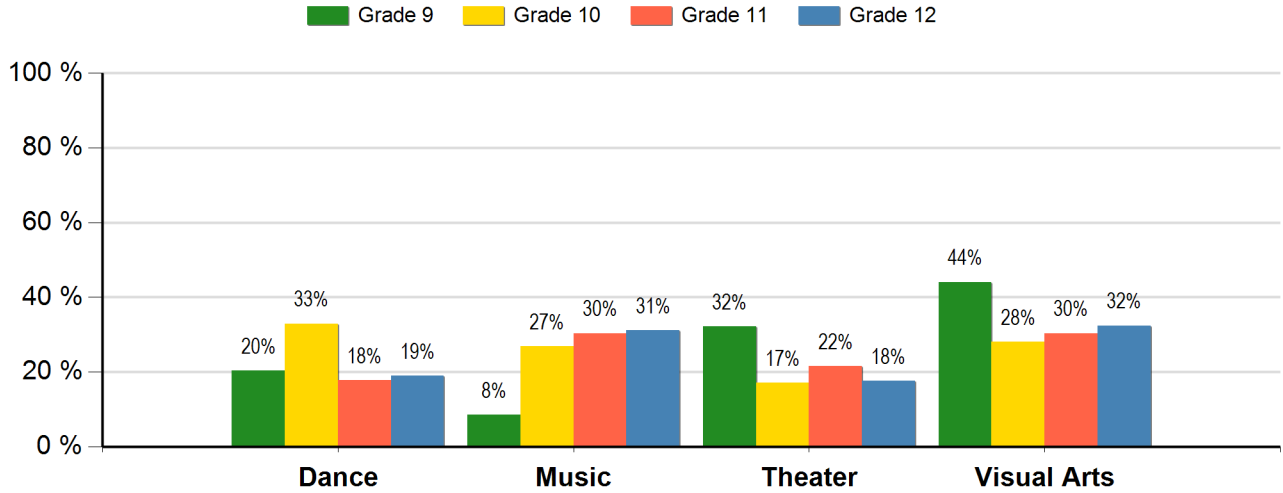
Middle School Arts Participation: *The figure below shows the percentage of students participating in arts classes by grade and by arts discipline during the 2022-23 school year.*



NYSED Middle School Arts Guidelines and Requirements: *This graph shows the percentage of 8th grade students in this school in June 2023 who have taken at least one half-unit in an arts discipline and a second half-unit in a different arts discipline over the course of 7th and 8th grade (one half-unit is the equivalent of approximately 55 hours of instruction by a licensed, certified arts teacher).*



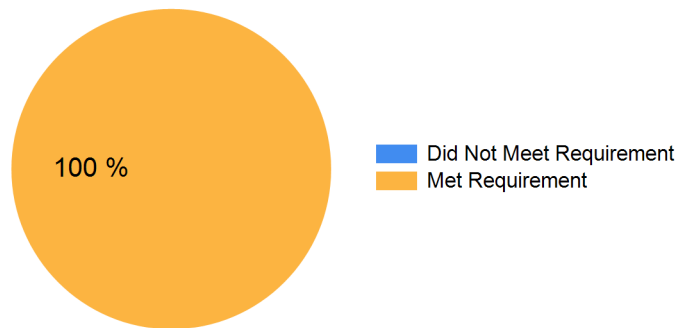
High School Arts Participation: The figure below shows the percentage of students participating in arts classes by grade and by arts discipline during the 2022-23 school year.
