SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In our 4th and 5th grade dance studios, our students are introduced to the fundamental principles of ballet. Exercises are designed to be fun while developing muscular control, body awareness, a rhythm and vocabulary. In ballet classes elementary students will:•Learn basic valet vocabulary•Learn basic from and proper placement and alignment•Understand the eight classical ballet positions•Understand the use of epaulement (the relationship of the head and shoulders to the feet) •Develop coordination of the entire body.In 6th – 8th grade, our students build upon the dance knowledge developed in the earlier grades as there classes increase to five days per week. In addition to classes in Ballet Technique, Middle School students take classes in Allegro, Audition Prep, Conditioning, Feld Repertory, Horton, Jazz, Partnering, Pilates, Pointe, Repertory / Improv, and Tap.In their ballet classes, Middle School students:•Retain form, proper placement and alignment while doing more challenging combinations•Continue to experience the flow of a ballet class, with more challenging barre and center work, and traveling combinations across the floor•Learn and retain intermediate ballet vocabulary•Continue to incorporate the use of épaulement (the relationship of the head and shoulders to the feet)•Learn how to reverse all combinations•Strengthen feet and legs for more advanced jumps and pointe work•Deepen their connections to the relationship between music and movement




SCHOOL PROGRESS IN MEETING NEW YORK STATE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS



NYSED Middle School Arts Guidelines and Requirements: This graph shows the percentage of 8th grade students in this school in June 2023 who have taken at least one half-unit in an arts discipline and a second half-unit in a different arts discipline over the course of 7th and 8th grade (one half-unit is the equivalent of approximately 55 hours of instruction by a licensed, certified arts teacher).
