SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The goal for PS 160's art program is to expose our students to a wide variety of art mediums. We believe the influence of art on our students will increase prior knowledge, provide opportunities for successful experiences as well as learn to look at and discuss art with higher level questioning and vocabulary. PS 160 currently has a full-time visual arts teacher, a teaching artist from Artist Year as well as a dance teacher. We also participate in a number of arts based residencies including: LeAp, LINC, Ballet Tech, Bilingual Birdies, Arch for Kids, Salvadori, Benchmarks, Puppetry, Edu Music, Artist Year through Americorps and a Mime residency. We also had the teaching artist run an afterschool program called Draw and Debate and a general art club. To increase family participation ,we hosted an Arts Night and a Gingerbread Night.


