SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In the 2022-23 school year, P.S. 16 kept the love of the arts alive and well in our school. All students in Pre-K- 5 were able to have an arts residency support our students, Students in PRE-K, K and grade 1 were fortunate enough to have Bobaloo again to play, listen, make and dance to music. They made their own instruments, created and sang songs, visited other classrooms to show off their hard work and had the best time connecting the brain, heart and soul with their music. Students in grade 2 received theater instuction from Illuminart during the day for 12 weeks. They wrote and created their own play as a culminating activity. They made their own props and performed for their classmates and other classes. Students in grade 3 participated in 3-D literacy with Sundog during the school day for 12 weeks and are learning vocabulary through song and performing arts. Students in grades 4 and 5 participated in a 11 week visual arts residency with ArtsConnection where they created visual artwork with a social emotional learning focus as a therapeutic way to discuss current events that students their age deal with. Students in grade 5 students also participated in an afterschool drumming program through Sundog where they partnered with a teaching artist to learn drumming on paint buckets. They also learned to incorporate dance moves along with drum beats.


