Visual arts classes expose students to various forms of art and support students with creating their own art pieces aligned with the areas of study. There are a variety of projects that students complete throughout the school year.








**Middle School Arts Participation:** The figure below shows the percentage of students participating in arts classes by grade and by arts discipline during the 2022-23 school year.



NYSED Middle School Arts Guidelines and Requirements: This graph shows the percentage of 8th grade students in this school in June 2023 who have taken at least one half-unit in an arts discipline and a second half-unit in a different arts discipline over the course of 7th and 8th grade (one half-unit is the equivalent of approximately 55 hours of instruction by a licensed, certified arts teacher).
