SCHOOL'S ARTS PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

We offer dance and studio art to all middle school students, who cycle through electives every ten weeks. High school students have a selection of arts electives to choose from: dance, theater, studio art, needlework, and photography. All students in high school have access to arts electives from ninth through twelfth grade. In addition to arts courses, Comprehensive Model School Project 327 (CMSP) with its partners at New Settlement offer access to music, dance, and film. CMSP presents a fall and spring production with students training as cast and crew.




SCHOOL PROGRESS IN MEETING NEW YORK STATE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS




Middle School Arts Participation: The figure below shows the percentage of students participating in arts classes by grade and by arts discipline during the 2022-23 school year.



NYSED Middle School Arts Guidelines and Requirements: This graph shows the percentage of 8th grade students in this school in June 2023 who have taken at least one half-unit in an arts discipline and a second half-unit in a different arts discipline over the course of 7th and 8th grade (one half-unit is the equivalent of approximately 55 hours of instruction by a licensed, certified arts teacher).




High School Arts Participation: The figure below shows the percentage of students participating in arts classes by grade and by arts discipline during the 2022-23 school year.
