Israeli airstrikes kill at least 19 Palestinians, including women and children

GAZA — At least 19 Palestinians, including several women and children, were killed on Saturday in Israeli attacks targeting both northern and southern areas of the Gaza Strip. Gaza's Civil Defense reported that five Palestinians died and others were wounded in an airstrike near the Dar Al-Arqam School in northwestern Gaza City. Another airstrike hit a family home in eastern Gaza City, killing a woman and injuring several others. Medical sources said that 11 Palestinians, including three women and four children, were killed, and many others were injured in Israeli shelling targeting a house in the Al-Tuffah neighborhood of eastern Gaza City. In northern Gaza, paramedics recovered the body of a Palestinian killed in an artillery strike in Beit Hanoun. In a separate incident, medical sources reported that one Palestinian was killed and six others injured in an Israeli bombing of a tent sheltering displaced people in the Al-Mawasi area, west of Khan Younis in the southern Gaza Strip. This area is classified as a "humanitarian safe zone" by the Israeli army.

Saudi GDP levels rise 35% in agricultural sector: Minister Alfadley

BRAZILIA — Minister of Environment, Water and Agriculture Eng. Abdulrahman Al-fadley said that Saudi Arabia's efforts to encourage and stimulate local and foreign investments in the agricultural sector led to an increase in the levels of the gross domestic product (GDP) in the sector by 35 percent.

Addressing the G20 Agriculture Ministers' Meeting in Brazilia, he emphasized the critical role of smallholder and indigenous communities in ensuring a sustainable food system.

Alfadley highlighted the need to provide farmers with needed resources and support, and emphasized the need to integrate fisheries and aquacul-

US confirms deaths of 14 Daesh/ISIS operatives in Western Iraq raid



WASHINGTON — US Central Command (CENTCOM) confirmed Friday that a raid conducted by its forces in collaboration with Iraq resulted in the deaths of 14 Daesh/ISIS operatives on August 29. The operation, which targeted Daesh/ISIS leaders, aimed to disrupt and degrade the terror group's capacity to plan, organize, and execute attacks against Iraqi civilians, as well as US citizens, allies, and partners throughout the region and beyond. CENTCOM released a statement detailing the operation's outcomes.
