Leuven is a green city, where parkland, medieval cloisters, and bicycles are the norm. The KU Leuven campus is interspersed throughout the city, with students making up about half of the city's 100,000 residents. You can see it in the evening on the Oude Markt, one of Leuven's main public squares, where an uninterrupted line of cafes host students at sidewalk tables. You can hear it in the chimes from the carillon in the tower at the University Library. You can feel it in the many bookstores and cinemas that mark this as the quintessential university city.

Other KU Leuven campuses offer the benefits of life in a larger city. This may be reflected in the dynamism of multilingual Brussels, the relaxed life along the picturesque canals of Ghent, or the eclectic charms of fashion and shipping capital Antwerp. So whether your tastes run to music and theatre, history and architecture, or perhaps the best waffles, fries, beer and chocolate in the world, Belgium has something for every taste.

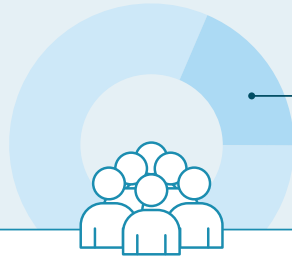

Tuition fees and scholarships

Whilst all of our programmes are very affordable compared to equivalent universities around the world, the fees for any individual student are contingent upon their academic programme and the nationality of the student.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All students who did not obtain their previous degree at an institution of the Flemish Community must submit an application via the Admissions Office. Every programme at KU Leuven has its own admission criteria. Be sure to check the specific admission requirements (diploma requirements, language requirements and possible additional requirements) for your desired programme on our webpage.

APPLICATION WINDOW

Our admissions process works on a rolling basis, which means that you may apply at any time. However, the sooner you apply the better. Some programmes have a fixed deadline. Late submission of applications for programmes with fixed deadlines will not be considered. You can find the complete list of programme-specific deadlines on our website. The application round for the 2025-2026 academic year starts on 10 October 2024.

HOUSING

Housing options for students at KU Leuven depend on the city where you will be studying and when you begin your search. In Leuven, the primary choice is between private housing and University residences. Most students choose to rent a student room (a 'kot' in Dutch) in a privately-owned house with shared common spaces and facilities.

The University owns and manages a number of student residences in Leuven, with a limited number of rooms reserved for international students.

Students in Brussel, Ghent and Antwerp need to find housing on the private market. Stuvo housing advisors can help students get a sense of the available housing stock in each of these cities.
